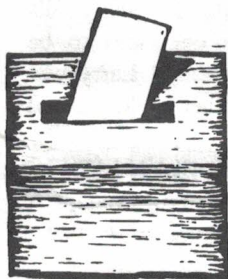

## California Primaries Report

*Results from state's new  
"Open Primary" — encour-  
aging news for Libertarians*

**C**alifornia voters went to the polls June 2nd in the state's first "open primary," in which candidates from all parties ran together on the same ballot. Libertarians, along

with leaders of the Democratic, Republican and Peace & Freedom parties, have challenged the "open primary" in court, since we believe each party has the right to select its own candidates. (For complete election returns, see page 6.)

There were two contested Libertarian primaries — in the 1st Congressional District (North Coast) and in San Diego's 77th Assembly District. In the Congressional race, Emil Rossi defeated James Oglesby 57% to 43%. However, 3,760 people voted in the race, far exceeding the 1,982 registered Libertarians in the district. In San Diego, Elizabeth Myers defeated Michael Metti 67% to 33%. Again, 3,159 people voted in the race, versus 1,166 registered Libertarians in the district. We will never know if the results would have been different had only registered Libertarians voted.

Three election results stand out and hopefully will be repeated (or, of course, exceeded) in November. In the 1st District Board of Equalization race, *Libertarian* (continued on page 3)

## Lightfoot First Among Third Party Candidates

*LPC candidate for Secretary  
of State is top third-party  
vote-getter in statewide races*

**J**une Primary election results showed Gail Lightfoot led all other third-party candidates for statewide office in California with 4% of the vote in the Secretary of State's race. She received more than 167,000 votes. There are 76,830 registered Libertarians in the state, as of May 30.

"I have a lot going for me just by getting my name on the ballot," Lightfoot said. "It's simple yet unusual. People associate it with Native Americans or singer Gordon (continued on page 3)

## Telemarketing Campaign is Big Success

*Members respond well to  
invitations to join the LPC  
pledge program*

**T**he LPC recently completed its first foray into telephone fundraising, and the results exceeded anyone's expectations.

"Our goal was to increase the LPC's monthly pledge program," said Executive Director Juan Ros, "and I'm pleased to report that we raised an additional \$800 in monthly pledges!"

But the good news didn't stop there: "The campaign didn't cost the LPC a penny," said Ros. "The entire cost was covered by one-time contributions from our members."

Along with Ros, the telemarketing campaign was supervised by Executive Committee members Sharon Ayres and Jack Dean. Ayres and Dean selected TMW Marketing, a telemarketing company based in Fullerton, to run the campaign. Before (continued on page 4)

### Open Primary

I was disappointed with "Do Californians Really Want an Open Primary?" [April '98] by Gail Lightfoot. Her point is that libertarian ideology will find favor faster if people vote on the basis of their political party affiliation, rather than on how close a given candidate supports libertarian principles. It is a plea to strengthen political party influence, rather than to replace it with serious contemplation by the people.

I envision an ideal election as one in which political party affiliation no longer counts: voters would no longer mindlessly cast their ballots on the basis of party endorsements. Instead, elections would be decided after citizens compare Libertarian office seekers' positions with those from big-government advocates.

Lightfoot finds that scenario objectionable. If libertarian-minded candidates "appeal to voters who have no party affiliation," or "to the greatest number of voters," the political process will be "homogenized," she maintains. As a result, the libertarian-oriented campaigner will be forced to present his/her message in "deceptive terms." If this candidate does not, he/she "will be vilified as an extremist."

This is an overly pessimistic impression of the willingness of people to ponder the libertarian point-of-view - if forced to do so by open voting. I believe people may be *more* likely to discover the appeal of libertarianism in this situation.

Open voting is not "injury done to the state's political health," as Lightfoot believes. That damage is inflicted when the major political parties transform voters into thoughtless puppets.

Here's the figures: 1.) Libertarian Party (9.4%); 2.) Nonpartisan (6.2%); 3.) Peace & Freedom (5.7%); 4.) Green (5.4%); 5.) American Independent (5.0%); 6.) Miscellaneous (2.6%); 7.) Democrat (1.7%); 8.) Republican (-0.8%); 9.) Natural Law (-3.1%); and 10.) Reform (-5.5%).

We feel that our voter registration growth reflects the activity of our partisan candidates seeking registrations for their nomination petitions, plus the level of our local party's activity.

Lightfoot."

The candidate's name has also appeared in the statewide voter pamphlet as signer of ballot arguments and descriptions of the LPC. Additionally, she testified in the lawsuit to overturn Prop. 198 (the "Open Primary Initiative"). Lightfoot's testimony was quoted in the judge's decision and in footnotes to the decision, prompting numerous media interviews.

"My name just keeps popping up," she said. "That helps build that extra bit of recognition. Voters may not even recall why the name seems familiar but that sense of 'I know her' may be all that is needed to add their vote to your total."

Lightfoot went on to explain that being a woman, a mother, grandmother and a Registered Nurse are other plusses for her campaign. "Voters are partial to women,

and nurses are those warm, fuzzy feeling people who make you feel better," she said. "Nurses inspire trust."

Lightfoot is hopeful that the vote totals in November will be even higher and asks that party members support her campaign fundraising efforts: "Getting elected means shaking lots of hands — and that is very hard to do in such a large and populous state as this."

One of the most efficient ways of doing this, Lightfoot believes, is by making personal appearances at city and county fairs. "Setting up LP booths at local fairs helps the Party to grow dramatically and boosts candidates' vote totals. Local libertarians can set up and staff the booths and candi-

dates can add their allure to the event."

"Our job now is to plan what we will do in September and October leading up to the general election," she stated. "The money available to

each candidate and the ability to send out regular news releases will be vital elements of our efforts."

Lightfoot encourages members to "give as much money as you can reasonably afford and, if you can, give time as well. That makes the candidate's job that much easier. It makes no difference if your contribution is small or large, every effort to preserve Liberty is one more increment towards our eventual success." ■

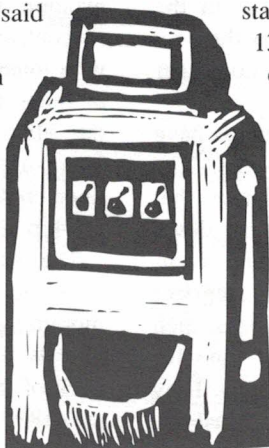
## LPC Supports Indian Gaming

*"Work-to-Welfare" on horizon for Native American tribes says California Libertarian Party*

California is threatening to send thousands of Indians back on welfare by depriving them of the right to earn a living through gaming, the Libertarian Party of California recently charged.

"Politicians have been touting 'welfare-to-work' programs, but this is an example of 'work-to-welfare,' said LPC chair Mark Hinkle.

Hinkle's statement comes in the midst of the ongoing feud between Governor Pete Wilson and California's 41 Indian gaming tribes. After signing a compact with the nongaming Pala band of Mission Indians in March, Wilson ordered all California gaming tribes to accept the Pala compact or risk shutdown of their gaming machines.



In response to the current crisis, the LPC passed a resolution in support of Indian gaming.

At issue are "Class III" Las Vegas-style games, which under the federal Indian Gaming Regulatory Act require a negotiated compact between tribe and state government. An estimated 13,000 Class III machines are operating in California without a compact. Tribes argue that the Pala compact is too restrictive and would hurt gaming.

Recently, the Secretary of State announced that a ballot measure which would preserve Las Vegas-style Indian gaming had qualified for the November ballot. But the State Senate also voted to

ratify the Pala compact.

California's four U.S. Attorneys have filed civil forfeiture suits to seize or shut down tribal slot machines.

Is California afraid of a little competition for its state-run lottery? "It certainly seems that way," observed Hinkle.

Indian gaming is a \$5 billion dollar industry nationwide, according to Gaming & Wagering Magazine. "Prior to gaming, federal handouts were the primary source of income for most tribes," noted Hinkle.

Should federal or state governments have any say in what Indians do on reservations?

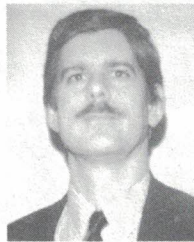
"No," said Hinkle. "Indian tribes are sovereign nations and have the right to use their property for whatever they choose, including gaming — free of government interference and regulation." ■

## Four Steps to Success

Last month I deviated from my routine of beginning this column with a reminder of our year end goals. Well, this month, it's back to basics! Our 1998 goals are:

- 1) Raise \$350,000 in revenue;
- 2) Build our ranks to 7,000 members;
- 3) Build our pledge program to generate \$6,000 per month;
- 4) Maintain ballot status.

Goal #1... As you know, last year we exceeded our \$150,000 revenue goal by over \$40,000. This year our goal is over double that figure. If we succeed, it'll be a record-breaking year. The only time the LPC raised and spent that kind of money was in 1979, and the vast majority of those funds were donated by one individual — a billionaire.

While it sure would be nice to receive another such windfall, we can't count on it. The long-term health of the LPC will be determined by hundreds, and eventually thousands, of individuals willing to trade their money for more Liberty.

Goal #2... We have just purchased an updated list of registered Libertarians from the Secretary of State — our main source to solicit new members.

Over the years, the LPC has mailed membership recruitment letters to portions of this list, always with great success. Unfortunately, we've never had the means to mail to the entire list at one time. Well, the national LP is about to do just that. Every registered Libertarian in California who is not already a dues-paying LP member will soon receive an invitation to join us.

Goal #3... Building our pledge program is crucial for three reasons: it gives us a steady source of income; it's our most efficient form of fundraising; and it

will enable us to keep Juan Ros working for us as our Executive Director.

Recently, we concluded our first telemarketing campaign; its goal was to expand our pledge base, and the results were very encouraging. (See related story on page 1.) It'll be a challenge to make it to the finish line by the end of the year. On the other hand, many doubted our ability to achieve last year's goals, and — thanks to you — we did. With your continued support, we'll do it again this year!

This goal is *not* beyond our grasp: all we need is 85 more people willing to pledge \$1 per day. We know that most of our members can easily afford to pledge \$1 per day; our task is to demonstrate that the LPC is donor-worthy. I believe that our track record proves just that. So if you have not signed up as a pledger yet, please do so today. It's easy: just use the form on the back of this newsletter.

Goal #4... We can maintain California ballot status in one of two ways: at least one of our statewide candidates must receive 2% of the vote this November; or our percentage of registered voters must total 1%.

Election returns from the June primary indicate that we are well on our way to achieving the vote totals we need to retain ballot status.

As for building our base of registered Libertarians... In the past, it was difficult to persuade some people to register Libertarian because they were reluctant to give up their ability to vote in the major parties' primaries. Under the new blanket primary system, that's no longer the case.

The Republicans and Democrats have been losing registrants for years. The blanket primary could accelerate that decline. You can help push them down the hill! Ask your family, friends, neighbors and coworkers to reregister Libertarian. If they share our ideas, then there has never been a better time for them to hop aboard our bandwagon. They have nothing to lose but their chains! ■

making a single phone call, TMW trained their callers in the unique aspects of political fundraising, and educated them about the Libertarian Party and its philosophy.

"We knew we'd chosen the right company when we discovered that one of their callers was an LPC member — Mark Muskrath! Mark was very excited by the campaign and told everyone at TMW about the LP," said Ros.

The campaign ran from May 28 to June 17. Ros and LPC Chair Mark Hinkle monitored the phone calls at various times "to make sure the callers were saying the right things and that our members were responding positively," said Ros.

The LPC patterned its telemarketing campaign after a similar national LP program. "National's telemarketing efforts have produced spectacular results. We just followed the trail they blazed — and had similar success," said Ros.

What about those members who don't like getting phone calls soliciting contributions? "Some members noted on their membership forms that they didn't wish to ever be called, and they weren't," said Ros. "And anyone else who doesn't want to contribute money is free to say 'no.' But different people respond favorably to different approaches: some prefer to contribute at special events; others prefer contributing via mail; and *some* prefer telephone solicitations."

"When you have a donor-worthy organization such as the LPC, members *want* to contribute," said Ros. "To everyone who joined the monthly pledge program or made a one-time contribution during the telemarketing campaign: thank you! Your support will enable the LPC to continue on the road towards increased membership and greater professionalism!"

## California Primaries Report

Kennita Watson won over 250,000 votes (22.5%) in a 1-1 race with incumbent Johan Klehs (D). In San Bernardino's 63rd Assembly District, Maureen Lindberg won 23.9% against GOP leader Bill Leonard. In the San Fernando/ Antelope Valley's 25th Congressional District, Bruce Acker won 21.25% against incumbent Howard McKeon (R). No Democrats filed in either of those races.

In other races without one major party candidate, Jonathan Richter won 17.6% (19th CD), Lynn Badler won 12.2% (52nd CD), Kit Maira won 11.8% (39th AD) and Ken Aaroe won 11% (18th CD). Sadly, Ken Aaroe died just before the election; he will be replaced on the November ballot by Linda DeGroat.

In races with both major parties, out-

standing results included Kelley Ross, with 6.9% in the 40th Assembly District. Kelley was also our best Assembly vote-getter in 1996. San Mateo County shone with Mike Moloney's 6.8% in the 12th Congressional District and Steve Marsland's 5.3% in the 19th Assembly District. Others who exceeded 4% were Susan Weber (80th AD), Dirk Deardorff (27th AD), Paul Rako (24th AD), John McCready (30th SD), Jeff Laing (34th AD), Dan Winterrowd (4th CD), Kate Woods (28th AD), Bob New (27th CD), John Ballard (32nd SD), Loren Meierding (72nd AD), Neal Donner (28th SD), Mary Lee Gowland (12th SD) and Greg Bashem (36th AD).

Statewide races are very important for November, as we must win 2% in at least one race to maintain our ballot status. June 2 results show we are well on our way. The 2% figure was easily exceeded by four of our eight candidates: Gail Lightfoot (3.5% for Secretary of State), Jon Petersen (2.4% for Treasurer), Dale

Ogden (2.4% for Insurance Commissioner) and Pam Pescosolido (2.1% for Controller). Other totals were Tom Tryon (1.9% for Lt. Governor), Joe Farina (1.6% for Attorney General), Ted Brown (1.2% for U.S. Senator) and Steve Kubby (0.8% for Governor). The last three were lower than normal, probably due to the hotly contested primaries in other parties in these races.

Voters agreed with the LPC on three of the four ballot propositions where we took a position. They properly approved Propositions 219 and 227 and handily rejected Proposition 224. Sadly but not unexpectedly, they approved Prop. 222, which the LPC opposed. ■

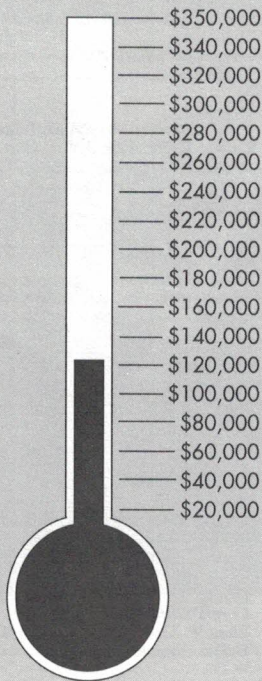

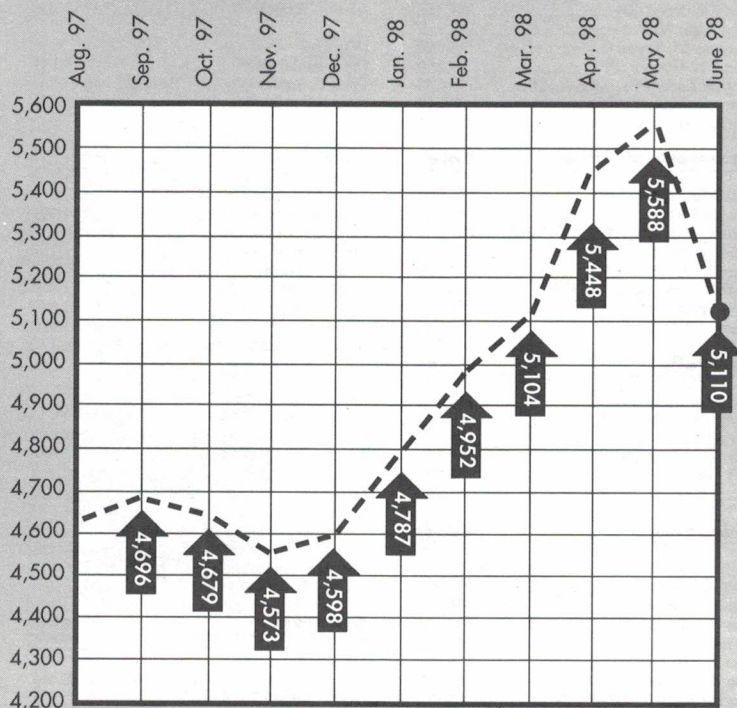
