### SIX LIBERTARIANS ELECTED TO OFFICE

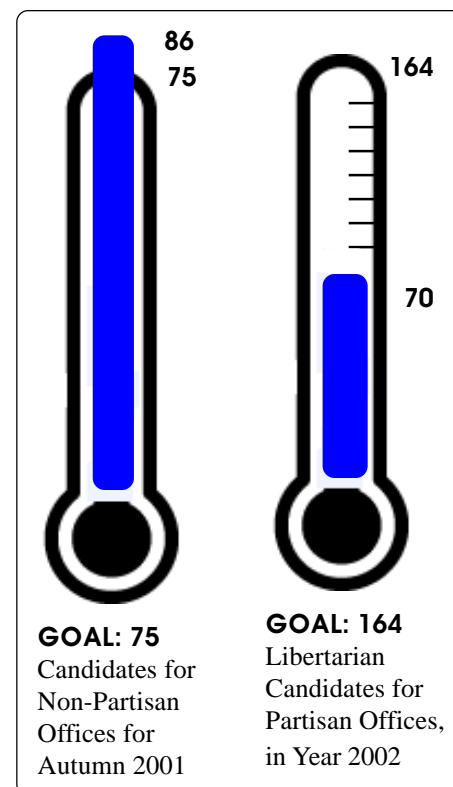
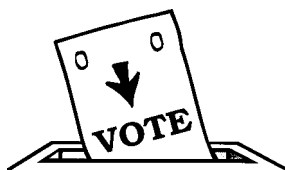
**O**ur goal of 75 candidates for non-partisan office in autumn of 2001 has been surpassed. We have 86 candidates. Six have been declared winners in uncontested elections: Tod Foerch, Daniel Garisek, Marguerite Kaufman, Gordon Martindale, Verne Skjonsby, and Jonathan Tatomer. See pages 6 and 7.

### CANDIDATES ANNOUNCE FOR 2002 ELECTION

**L**ibertarians throughout California are announcing their candidacies for statewide offices, Board of Equalization, Congress and the State Legislature, for the 2002 election. Candidates will be gathering petition signatures from registered Libertarians in October and November of this year in order to qualify for the ballot.

Currently we have candidates for 70 offices statewide. Among these: Michele Kubby and Pat Wright will run for Lt. Governor; Michelle Kurtz, a CPA, will run for Controller; West Covina City Treasurer Marian Smithson will run for State Treasurer; Ed Kuwatch, a criminal defense attorney, will seek the Attorney General slot; and Dale Ogden, 1998 candidate for Insurance Commissioner, will run again. ## LIBERTARIAN PARTY UPDATE

### FROM THE CHAIR:



*The last sixty days has been a whirlwind of activity.*

#### OPERATION BREAKTHROUGH

**Y**ou may have read last year about California's successful Operation Breakthrough. By implementing this innovative candidate recruitment strategy one year ago, we were able to recruit 162 non-partisan Libertarian candidates last year – resulting in a record-high slate of 305 Libertarian candidates for office in California, the highest ever for any LP state affiliate. Fourteen of those 162 candidates were elected to office and are serving today!

Until recently our intention was to wait until the 2002 election cycle before launching Operation Breakthrough "Version 2.0." But our research in July showed that over 300 Special Districts in 20 counties are having elections in 2001. And with the ultra-low turnout this year we may actually see an **increase** in the number of winning Libertarians due to fewer candidates filing for the available positions. We set a goal for ourselves of 75 candidates and 6 victories in 2001.

Well, after quickly raising \$7,000 by phone and e-mail, combined with the volunteer efforts of almost 50 volunteers, we now have 86 candidates running for office in November 2001, normally an off-election year.

And we already have SIX guaranteed victories because the number of candidates is equal or less than the positions available in those races. Plus we are bound to have a few additional winners in November.

#### NEW EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

Our Executive Director, Juan Ros, found a great job opportunity with a health related non-profit organization. Juan did great work for the last 3+ years and I'm going to miss him. I'm sure the enticement of a job willing to pay him considerably more money was just too much to turn down, being that he's responsible for supporting a young family.

After a nationwide search for an Executive Director, we found gold in our own backyard. David Molony, Chairman of the LP of San Francisco, is now our new Executive Director. We all have high expectations of him.

#### OPERATION ENERGY TAX REVOLT

Now that our 2001 non-partisan candidate recruitment is accomplished, we turn our sights on succeeding with another project: Operation Energy Tax Revolt!

In the last fundraising letter we sent out — you have been reading them, right? — we told you that we uncovered a little used part of the California Constitution that makes it very easy to qualify local initiatives that reduce or abolish taxes. Around 168 cities in California impose a utility users tax. Most all of those cities are raking in record amounts of utility taxes on escalating household energy bills. Ninety-three of the cities with these taxes can be required to put an initiative on the ballot with less than 500 valid signatures. That should be relatively easy.

As you've probably already realized, this bottom-line accountant believes in projects where there is no question that we have enough resources to succeed. I believe in achievable projects based on reality, not just hope.

With your support, I sincerely believe we can roll back taxes in many of these cities. Let me know and we'll move forward.

### POLITICS AS USUAL

#### THE ENEMY WITHIN

With jurisdictions from Tampa to San Diego debating face-scanning cameras or remote-controlled photo radar, police in Michigan provide a useful reminder of what can happen when tools of surveillance are delivered to the state.

It turns out that over the past five years, more than 90 Michigan police officers, dispatchers, federal agents, and security guards used the state's Law Enforcement Information Network (LEIN) to do things that would land a private citizen in serious trouble. Stuff like running a license plate on a cute woman they spot — or using the system to track former spouses or lovers. Stalking, in other words. In one case, sheriff's deputies ran the plates of cars sporting bumper stickers of the candidate running against their boss in a Democratic primary.

The software could enable a pirate to copy an electronic book otherwise readable only with Adobe's reader technology - and then sell that copy to others without the publisher's permission. He was accused of being in violation of the Millennium Copyright Act which outlaws technologies designed to circumvent other technologies that protect copyrighted material.
