EVERY POLITICIAN'S PLAN TO RUN THE CITY IS REALLY A PLAN TO RUN YOU.

FRAN YOUNGSTEIN says City Hall's solutions have only produced more problems.

Every politician says that the City's problems will be solved if only the right person is elected, himself. But after years of rising corruption, crime and taxes, on top of declining public services, it is becoming obvious that City Hall itself is the problem.

Big government only creates bigger problems.

FRAN YOUNGSTEIN says the only way to solve City Problems is to decentralize City Hall.

Decentralization means letting each community or person act directly in their own interests. Each community can deal voluntarily with the interests of their own members in areas such as education, sanitation, and police without conforming to standards set by people with entirely different needs.

FRAN YOUNGSTEIN says community control brings us closer to individual control of our own lives.

FRAN YOUNGSTEIN says that a just, humane, liveable New York can not happen until New Yorkers look to themselves rather than to City Hall to solve the City's problems.

**CONTROL POLITICIANS.

FRAN YOUNGSTEIN says the way to reduce crime is to repeal victimless crime laws.

60 to 80% of the robberies and muggings in New York City are committed by addicts to pay for their habit. Addicts are now forced to pay \$50 a day and up to support a habit which could be maintained for pennies at a pharmacy, if it were legal. Repeal of heroin laws would mean a safer New York City. Drug addiction is a medical problem, not a legal one.

FRAN YOUNGSTEIN says that what you do with your body is your business.

Laws restricting prostitution, pornography, drug use, abortion, contraception and homosexuality have no place in a free society and should be repealed. Sex is a private affair whether the partners are straight, gay or pay.

FRAN YOUNGSTEIN says get the police out of the massage parlors and back on the beat.

The police should direct all their efforts towards stopping crimes with victims such as robberies, rapes and muggings. Not trying to stop consenting individuals from participating in voluntary acts.

FRAN YOUNGSTEIN says people have a right to run their own lives as long as they don't violate anyone else's right to run theirs.

**IF IT'S A STATE LAW, IGNORE IT.
IF IT'S A CITY LAW, REPEAL IT.**

CITY HALL IS TAKING NEW YORKERS FOR SERVICES THEY DON'T GET.

FRAN YOUNGSTEIN says that the way to provide New Yorkers with services is to fire City Hall and hire competitive enterprise.

In San Francisco competitive enterprise provides sanitation services. In Arizona competitive enterprise provides fire protection. And people receive good service at competitive prices.

FRAN YOUNGSTEIN says people can spend their money more efficiently than City Hall can spend it.

Taxpayers in Brooklyn's Park Slope pay for private garbage collection. Block associations in Manhattan hire private guards and install brighter street lights. These taxpayers are paying double. Once for the services they buy and get. And once for the services they pay for in taxes and don't get.

FRAN YOUNGSTEIN wants people to use their own money to buy the services they want. Instead of City Hall using their money to buy services they don't want...or get.

Why should the city improve services when they know they have a captive market? Restrictive monopolies don't have to be efficient. And with guaranteed money...your tax money...City Hall has no reason to care about what the customer wants.

FRAN YOUNGSTEIN says the way to stop City Hall's inefficiency is to shut off the guaranteed money.
