DELEGATES APPROVE L. P. RESOLUTIONS at N. R. A. CONVENTION

Anahiem June 8, 1990 Part II
In the first part of this article we highlighted the efforts of libertarian activists that successfully brought about resolutions for FIJA and an admonishment to break the two party habit and endorse 3rd party candidates particularly Libertarians. Scrappy activists helped spark plenty of controversy. the following concludes Bob Weber's article.

Backers of FIJA were denied an opportunity to purchase a non-profit display booth in the vendor's area of the convention. But, thanks to T.J. Johnson of the Orange County Gun Owners React Committee, they were able to hand out literature at the Operation Golden Bear table belonging to NRA, as long as they helped staff the booth. So, FIJA literature did get into the hands of those who attended the Convention hall used for the display by vendors.

L.P. co-founder David Nolan speculates that NRA may ultimately split up as YAF once did, breaking into a conservative group and a libertarian group. Hopefully, as the "old guard" gets older and finally dies off, they will be replaced by a more libertarian group coming up from the ranks. see NRA PAGE 5

PROJECT LONGER ACTIVE

About 60 Los Angeles area activists are now participating in a long-term voter registration and outreach effort at Venice Beach (actually Ocean Front Walk, two short blocks north of Windward Avenue and the Venice Pavilion) every Sunday from noon until 6 pm. While many of us are familiar with the Libertarian booth at annual county fairs, the LP has seldom been able to sustain a continuing outreach effort, week after week, month after month, at any one location. this is a new experience for many of us: Libertarians actually getting organized! It is also a new experience for many of the public, who are beginning to notice that we are not going away. The message keeps hitting them between the eyes. And who in L.A. doesn't go to Venice Beach?

There is another way to look at the results: in terms of its effect on the organization itself. This outreach effort trains Libertarians volunteers to work with and be comfortable with other members of the organization. Membership in the state central committee is \$15.00 a year. \$9.00 goes to the county central committee of the members choice and \$6.00 goes to the state organization. That \$6.00 doesn't EVEN begin to cover the basic functions of database, accounting and newsletter, much less voter registration, membership drives, outreach literature, etc. The low number is based on the old bait and switch or "cheap model" car sales approach of pulling people in with a low cost and hitting them up for more later. Only no one has. Outside of being a repugnant technique, it hasn't worked so well. It presupposes that each appeal for money will bring in enough to send out the next appeal and so on and so on. A libertarian form of panhandling so to speak. At a time when proliferation of political outrage should be swelling our ranks and coffers the attrition of existing members raises doubt as to whether we will be able to maintain ballot status. Of course, the real question is - do we serve our members well, or not at all. Economists and marketing people recognise the elastic-inelastic factor in demands curves. Basically stated the factor illustrates that products in the market (say hamburgers) with lots of competition from other products (hot dogs, steaks, fish, chicken) will increase in demand and total revenues as the price is lowered.

That's elasticity. A product such as salt with few or no substitutes will not suffer much of a demand drop when the price is raised within a reasonable range but the revenue can be increased dramatically. That's inelasticity. What I am suggesting is, does anyone

imagine that libertarians will switch to the Republicrats if the dues are quadrupled or doubled ? Hardly. If some should drop out at least those that remain will be part of a viably functioning, self supporting organization. The Republicrats are not competition in the political market. They may be cayenne pepper but Libertarianism is the salt of the political spectrum. There is no substitute. A few insipid issue imitators perhaps but none with the savor and power stated as "I hereby certify that I do not believe in nor advocate the initiation of force as a means of achieving social or political goals." This is not meant to imply that nothing of any consequence takes place within the party. Some dramatic things have happened, others are in the works and the effects can only snowball if the party remains in existence.

If the foregoing sounds like a pitch, it is. Get your cash out. Let your conscience be your guide. If you are dissatisfied with the situation as it exists or if you envision an enhanced organization - reach in your pocket first, then speak up and say your piece. The party and you as well will benefit. It matters not if others pay. Only you will know if you have done your part. If you can't afford anything, nothing should encumber your conscience. The options are doing your thing on a scale much the same as the anonymous "guerilla capitalists" or participating within the framework of political reference known as the Libertarian Party.

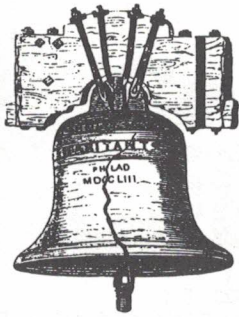

We have the Platform as well as other literature for sale and newsletters and voter registration forms available.

Following the convention, on Monday the Board of Directors of NRA met. The Board is the group within NRA that actually has the power to run the organization. At the election of Officers no candidate stepped up to challenge Cassidy. Cassidy was reelected Executive Vice President. Joe Foss stepped down as President and Richard Riley was elected as his successor. Riley seems to be more vigorous intellectually than was Foss and may help to revive NRA. To sum up, the passage of the Libertarian resolution and the FIJA resolution represent a major step forward for Libertarian influence within NRA. While no changes were made in the leadership of NRA, it will be increasingly difficult for them to ignore the L.P. And I intend to help create a strong presence at the NRA conventions in 1991 and 1992. *Bob Weber*

Yet neither experience nor special knowledge is necessary: any and every Libertarian is eligible to try. And still, the continuing effort guarantees that we get better and better at what we are doing, in terms of equipment, literature, methodology.

What have we seen at the beach ? There is a deep thirst among the public for people with integrity who are willing to try to affect the political game. After events in Eastern Europe, political cynicism is not "smart" anymore. Everyone knows that it is possible to change things. Support for jury nullification and limitation of terms approaches 100 % among those who stop at our table. Contempt for sitting Republicrat politicians is nearly as high. Whoever dosen't hate the drug war hates their S & L diaster.

Our 8-foot sign ("National Opinion Poll") and Nolan chart are attractive enough that passersby do not have to be solicited, but stop and ask to take the quiz. Sometimes we have six or seven clipboards in use simultaneously. No matter how they score, quiztakers are always eager to take a blank quiz home to try on a friend or relative -- effectively doubling the reach of our literature.

Anyone who has ever doubted the potential of Libertarianism to catch the imagination of America should start one elsewhere in the state. Call Neal Donner at 213-477-6462 and commit two to four hours per month. If you are reading this sentence, you are qualified to take the first step !
