The sum of three consecutive numbers is 72. What are the smallest of theseThe sum of three consecutive even numbers is 48. What are the smallest of these numbers?

You bought a magazine for \$5 and four erasers. You spent a total of \$25. How much did each eraser cost?

Maria had some boxes. Then she bought seven more boxes. A week later her brother destroyed half of all her boxes. There are now only 22 boxes left. How many did she start with?

Terrie won 40 super bouncy balls playing horseshoes at her school's game night. Later, she gave two to each of her friends. She only has 8 remaining. How many friends does she have?

Imani spent half of her weekly allowance playing mini-golf. To earn more money her parents let her wash the car for \$4. What is her weekly allowance if she ended with \$12?

Aliyah had some candy to give to the four children she babysits. She first took ten pieces for herself and then evenly divided the rest among her children. Each child received two pieces. How many pieces did Aliyah start with?

Dreshon sold half of his comic books and then bought sixteen more. He now has 36. How many did he begin with?

For a field trip 4 students rode in cars and the rest filled nine buses. How many students were in each bus if 472 students were on the trip?

Ted has 27 nuts. He ate 11 of them. He shared the rest of them equally with his friend Sam. How many nuts did Sam get?

We needed 138 balloons to decorate the room for a class party. We had five bags of balloons. They all held the same number of balloons. We found we needed 18 more balloons to finish the job. how many balloons were in each bag?

Antwan and Erik are collecting baseball cards. Together they have 62 cards. Antwan has 8 more cards than Erik. How many cards does each have?
