

## **One Winchester, Many Traditions: International Film presentation**

One Winchester, Many Traditions is presenting a series of international films on the second Monday of the month at 6:30 p.m. in the Library Meeting Room. The third film, Hero (Ying xiong) (99 min.), will be shown on March 9.

Hero is the story of the First Emperor of China, who is on the brink of uniting a war-torn land during the dawn of the Qin dynasty over 2000 years ago. Three opponents are determined to kill the King, and one loyal subject (Jet Li) stands in their way. Roger Ebert of the Chicago Sun-Times called this film "...a visual poem of extraordinary beauty." And Charles Taylor of Salon.com wrote, "Hero is one of the most ravishing spectacles the movies have given us."
