Procedures

Cancellations: Each class has a minimum and maximum number of students. If the minimum is not met, the class will be canceled. Classes which do not meet the minimum enrollment will be canceled as of April 1. Parents will be notified promptly and refunds will be sent at this time.

Fees: Vary by the class. The estimated cost for each student will be approximately \$10 per hour of class time.

Grades: All grade levels indicate the child's grade as of fall 2009.

Locations: All courses will occur in Winchester school buildings. Locations of courses are listed, but are subject to change. Based upon which courses run, optimal building usage and course needs will determine where courses occur.

Refunds: Refunds will be made if the class does not enroll its minimum number by April 1, or if a teacher is unable to offer the course.

Food: For half day programs, bring a snack. For full day, bring snack and lunch.

The purpose of this program is to address students' needs in a small group setting. Students who will benefit most from this program are those who find success through the individual instruction a small group setting can provide. Students will receive additional practice and support in order to achieve and maintain grade level reading and writing skills through the summer months. Their confidence will improve as their skills develop. During the first two days, informal assessments are used to assess the reading and writing skills of the students. Texts are chosen and activities are planned accordingly to address the needs of the children. Due to popular demand, Lego Robotics is back again this summer with a new twist. – Sports and More! We know this combination of hands-on learning and problem solving, paired with cooperative movement games will provide young learners with the opportunity to exercise both mind and body.

Lego Robotics: The students will explore the wonderful world of Legos through robotics. Through hands on learning activities with Legos, children will begin to be exposed to the Engineering Process. Over the course of the week, students will problem solve and create to build solutions to a necessary task or given problems. As students progress, they will work with motors and sensors to power their Lego structure. Students will even write their own computer programs to command their creations!

<p>Very accelerated students entering 3rd grade may be accepted into the program.</p> <p>It was Stanley Gudder who once said, “The essence of mathematics is not to make simple things complicated, but to make complicated things simple.” Students will have an opportunity to develop the reasoning and critical thinking skills that are essential for intellectual inquiry, and at the heart of Stanley Gudder’s ideas. This course will focus on building these mathematical skills through problem solving, puzzles, and experiences with a wide range of “cool” mathematics topics.</p> <p>This course will provide students with the chance to complete challenging academic work in the company of peers who share their exceptional abilities and love of mathematics. <p>This course is for all students who wonder about the causes of observable celestial phenomena (day length and the Sun’s position in the sky; lunar phases; eclipses; shooting stars; constellations; the Evening Star; etc). We will explore questions such as: the nature of light, and how we can use the properties of light to learn about planets, stars, galaxies, etc; How to get started as astronomers, even if they don’t own a telescope. And what the best print and online resources are for finding out more about the night sky and the wonders of the cosmos.</p> <p><i>Students must be able to 1) read ten to twenty pages of assigned reading daily 2) keep a daily (and nightly!) sky log with written impressions and sketches of specific phenomena 3) perform independent research using at-home resources and/or public library and 4) work collaboratively with other students who may span a wide range of academic ability.</i></p>
