<p>Putting IT in Transitions Meeting (by invitation) –Oct 14th and Post Meeting Collaborative leadership on advancing the issues through our roadmap and other activities</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • This was a meeting of a wide variety of stakeholders – payers, physicians, state HIEs, beacon communities and challenge grant recipients, LTPAC representatives and other sector representatives, vendors. • Prioritization document highlights many of the things that we have talked about -- the most important lever was identified as information flow and exchange and highlighting the care plan. The care planning piece really resonated and should be considered an action item where the collaborative could take leadership. • The meeting had participants declare their support for patient-centered transitions and care planning. It didn't appear that there were any LTPAC representatives declaring support for this approach publicly. However – there were behind the scenes discussions emerging around the S&I Framework LTPAC workgroup initiatives and CMS to align CARE.
