We may have an opportunity to meet with Kaiser.</p> <p>E-Prescribing: Breaking news ☺ -- NCPDP meeting update yesterday from Surescripts. Completed audit process for e-prescribing of controlled substances on 4 pharmacies through the Surescripts e-prescribing network (including an audit of physician and pharmacy processes). Planning on rolling out full access in January 2012 for ambulatory prescribing using NCPDP 10.6 standards. Drew Morgan from CMS drafted an exception for LTPAC, but it was not published. They are planning on publishing 1st quarter 2012. Audit processes cost about \$15,000 – the fee is for the pharmacy and the provider.</p> <p>CMS awarded a contract on e-measures to with contractors to Lantana and others related to quality measures for MU and physician of quality measures. The Lantana contract is looking at the standards to support the e-measures. There is an aggressive timeline (summer 2012). They are also looking at quality measures that may emerge through CARE. One of the measures that may emerge is pressure ulcer measures derived from CARE data elements that are the same as the MDS 3.0.</p> <p>Measure Applications Partnership (MAP) Post-Acute and Long-Term Care Coordination Strategy Draft Report Released for Public Comment: MAP is a public-private partnership created for the purpose of providing input to the Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) on selecting performance measures for public reporting and performance-based programs. The Performance Measurement Coordination Strategy for Post-Acute Care and Long-Term Care draft report is now available for public comment. The report aims to enhance alignment across public and private initiatives by defining priorities and core measure concepts to harmonize measures and promote common goals across initiatives, highlighting the need for common data sources and health IT, and determining a pathway for improving measure application.
