

Reading activities-

Use a witch finger, crazy glasses, special reading hat to read a book on their reading level to you, relatives over the phone, or even his stuffed animals. If your child has trouble with 5 or more words on a page then the book is considered frustrational and should be finished by you and another book chosen next time that he can read independently/instructionally.

*Read different media to help spark their interest in reading and to provide them a variety of media- comic books, magazine, recipes, cereal boxes, etc.

*Put on a play at home where you find a simple script online or write your own. Allow lots of time for practice. Make puppets. And put on a show. Record it and let them distribute it to friends and family.

*Make fun flashcards with sight words they are struggling with. Bring them in the car and work on them at stoplights.

*Pick a sight word and mark a tally every time you see it in the book. Read it again looking for another sight word. Compare to see which word was used more in the story.

*Books on tape/CD are great for him to follow along with. These can be checked out from the library as well. Great for fluency!
