MAP Foundation Series

The MAP (Measures of Academic Progress®) Foundation Series provides educators with options for professional development to support strategic goals and learning objectives in order to advance understanding of assessment data. Each step in the training continuum provides strategies that can be effectively applied to make a difference for all students.

MAP Administration

The first step in the series shows new NWEA partners how to implement and administer MAP tests. Participants investigate how adaptive testing can be used to measure student progress and identify instructional needs.

Stepping Stones to Using Data

In the second step, participants dig into real student data from their own MAP reports. Educators analyze and interpret their data and engage with colleagues to develop informed decisions related to classroom improvement programs and student goal-setting.

Climbing the Data Ladder

In the third session, participants use their own test results to design classroom instructional plans. Topics include evidence-informed lesson planning, differentiated instruction, and other strategies to support the instructional needs of all students.

Growth and Goals

In the fourth session, participants analyze growth data for school improvement planning. In addition, they develop capacity to evaluate programs, curricular objectives, and practices in relation to data trends.
