

Matarau School Proposed Enrolment Scheme

Home Zone

All students who live within the home zone described below (and shown on the attached map) shall be entitled to enrol at the school.

Starting at the intersection of Pipiwai Rd (1306 – 362 / 1293 – 319 included) and Appian Way, travel north crossing Lovell Rd at 213 / 198 (excluded), continue north including Rowlands Rd and meet Otakairangi Rd (292 and below included). From this point travel east crossing Heaton Rd at number 461, then continuing north east to meet the intersection of Hukerenui Rd and Forsythe Rd (excluded). Travel south along Hukerenui Rd and Jordan Valley Rd 323 / 354 and below excluded. From this point travel south, excluding Apotu Rd to meet Crane Rd at numbers 397 and 380 (included). Continue south along Crane Rd then west along both sides of Pipiwai Rd, then along Three Mile Bush Rd to the intersection with Gumtown Rd (excluded). From this point travel west to meet Kokopu Rd at 175 / 138, travel north along Kokopu Rd (Crossett Rd and up to 144 / 145 Attwood Rd included). Travel west along Pipiwai Rd, west along Knight Rd (number 44 included only) then north along Appian Way back to the starting point.

All residential addresses on included sides of boundary roads and all no exits roads off included sides of boundary roads are included in the zone unless otherwise stated.

Out of Zone Enrolments

Each year the Board of Trustees will determine the number of places which are likely to be available in the following year for the enrolment of students who live outside the home zone. The Board will publish this information by notice in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the local area. The notice will indicate how applications are to be made and will specify a date by which all applications must be received.

Applications for enrolment will be processed in the following order of priority:

First Priority	This priority is not applicable as the school does not run a special programme approved by the Secretary for Education
Second Priority	will be given to applicants who are siblings of current students
Third Priority	will be given to applicants who are siblings of former students
Fourth Priority	will be given to applicants who are children of board employees
Fifth Priority	will be given to all other applicants

If there are more applicants in the second, third, fourth or fifth priority groups than there are places available, selection within the priority group will be by a ballot conducted in accordance with instructions by the Secretary under Section 11G(1) of the Education Act 1989. Parents will be informed of the date of any ballot by notice in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the area served by the school.

Applicants seeking second or third priority status will be required to give proof of a sibling relationship.
