

## Mr. O'Brien's Blogging Rubric

Discussing and reflecting on mathematics is one of the best ways to really understand and remember mathematics. To that end, we will be using a class blog this year.

Each class, a scribe will take notes (you may opt to also take your own notes or just listen in class). By the end of class, the scribe must post a tagged entry (**first name, scribe post, unit title**). By the lab class the next day, the scribe must post all notes from the class- these may include scanned/typed notes, links, graphs, etc. (In order to have time to post good notes, the scribe will not need to have started the assignment problems by the lab class.) At the start of the lab class, we will all review the notes and make amends if necessary. To reach the top of the blog rubric, the scribe must make one update to their post before the end of the quarter (marked as **update**).

Your contributions to the blog each quarter will count as a quiz grade. Your contributions will be graded on the following rubric:
