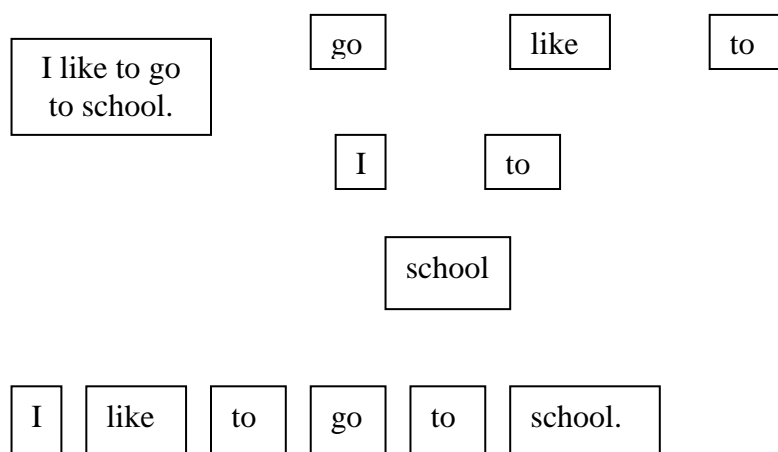


READING RECOVERY: PROVIDING THE BEST FOR YOUR CHILD

The observation portion of your child's Reading Recovery program has been completed and lessons have begun.

- A. Each day during a Reading Recovery lesson your child selects a few books to read at home. They will be books he has already read in school. You can help your child by letting him read the book to you.
- B. Your child also writes a sentence every day. The teacher copies it on a strip of paper and cuts it apart. Your child then works to put it back together again.



1. Listen to your child read the completed sentence that the teacher has printed on the envelope (if he has forgotten the sentence, tell your child and have your child repeat the sentence).
2. Watch your child put the cut-up pieces back into the correct order. He may do this with the envelope as a guide if necessary.
3. After the sentence is put back together ask the child to check it against the sentence on the envelope to make sure it is correct and have your child read it to you.

*Be careful not to use the words as flashcards or expect your child to read the words without the entire sentence being present.

Please return the book bag with the book(s) on the next school day. The cut-up sentence does not have to be returned.
