

Work sample: ANZAC Day

Relevant part of the achievement standard

By the end of Year 3 students place some of the key events and people they have studied in chronological sequence using timelines.

Students pose questions about the past and locate relevant information from different historical sources. They identify traces of the past in the present and can explain their significance.

Students use historical sources to compare key aspects of the past with the present. They identify and explain important changes and continuities over time. Students explain the significance of people and events to the development of a community.

Students compose historical texts, including narratives, using appropriate historical terms. They present their information using a range of communication forms (written, spoken, visual).

Summary of task

Students visited the local RSL to find out about ANZAC Day in Port Augusta.

They were required to answer questions about ANZAC Day during their visit and to create a poster about ANZAC Day.

Student attainment of the achievement standard is determined at the end of a reporting period after reviewing relevant assessment evidence.

We celebrate ANZAC Day because of the people who died in the war.

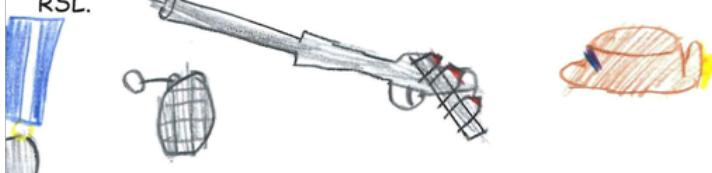
How do we celebrate ANZAC Day in Port Augusta?
