What is Unitedstreaming?

Unitedstreaming is a collection of videos, video segments, photos, articles, sounds, and a host of other resources to enhance your teaching.

How do I get there?

Open your web browser (Firefox is recommended).

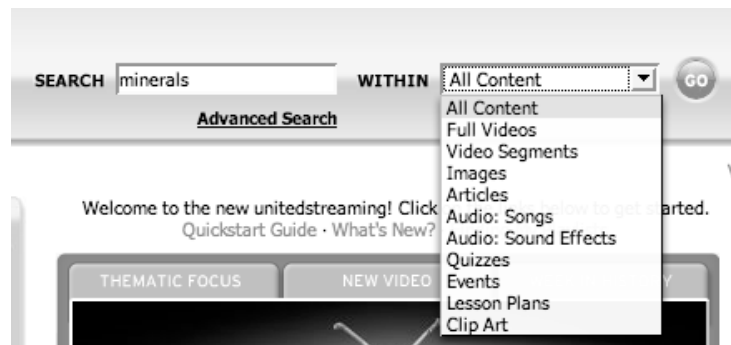
Go to www.unitedstreaming.com.

Enter your username and password.



What do I do once I'm there?

Type the topic you're looking for in the Search box. From the dropdown menu next to the Search box, choose the type of media you are looking for or search All Content. Click Go.



Once I find something I like, then what do I do?

Click on the name of the video (or segment or image) or on its picture. This will take you to a description of the content and will give you the opportunity to preview and download it.

To preview a video or video segment, click on the green button with the arrow (found in front of the title of the video).

To download a video or video segment, hold down the control key and click on the blue icon next to the green button. In the menu that appears, choose "Save Link As...". In the next window, name the video and tell your computer where to save it.

Using your iBook or MacBook, be sure that the Media Settings are as shown: QuickTime and Stand-Alone Application should be selected. (You might have to scroll to the bottom of the page to see this box.)

What else should I know?

- Use streaming to preview videos only. Do not count on streaming to show a video during class. If there is a connection problem, you might have to re-think your lesson on the spot! *Always download videos that you're going to use in class.*
- Once you've downloaded a video you can save it on your computer, burn it to a CD (or multiple CDs), or save it on a pen drive.
- You can "bookmark" content that you like (but don't have time to download immediately) by checking the box after the title and clicking the blue ADD button. For more information on this, see the Unitedstreaming Users Guide found under the Help menu in Unitedstreaming or call one of the Instructional Advisors for help.
- If your students are going to use Unitedstreaming media in projects, be sure they copy the citations. These are easy to find in the Citations tab in each content window.
- Unitedstreaming content (or projects containing Unitedstreaming content) may not be posted on your website or in a podcast. We have the rights to use them for educational purposes, but not to repost the material to the Internet.
