This nickel  
is bigger than  
a dime  
but  
only in size,  
because  
a nickel  
is worth only 5¢  
and  
a dime  
is worth  
10¢



The front of the nickel  
pictures a left-facing  
profile of Thomas  
Jefferson, the third  
President of the United  
States of America and the  
principal author of the  
Declaration of  
Independence.

The front reads, "IN GOD  
WE TRUST," "LIBERTY," and  
the year the coin was  
minted. The small initial  
after the date is the mint  
mark, denoting the location  
of the US mint that  
produced the coin (D  
means Denver, Colorado, S  
means San Francisco,  
California, and P means  
Philadelphia, Pennsylvania).

The back of the nickel  
pictures Monticello,  
Jefferson's house  
(which was designed by  
Jefferson himself),  
located in Virginia,  
USA.

The back reads, "E  
PLURIBUS UNUM"  
(which means, "Out of  
many, one"),  
"MONTICELLO," "FIVE  
CENTS," and "UNITED  
STATES OF AMERICA."
