2. Calculate the angles for the following sines. Follow the sig-fig rules.

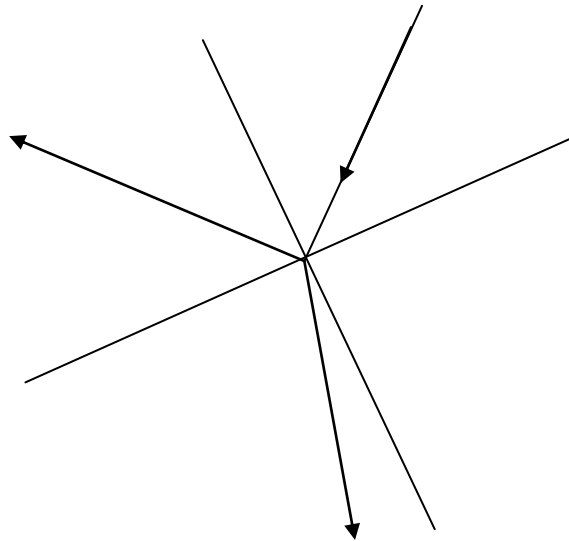
a) 0.2517
