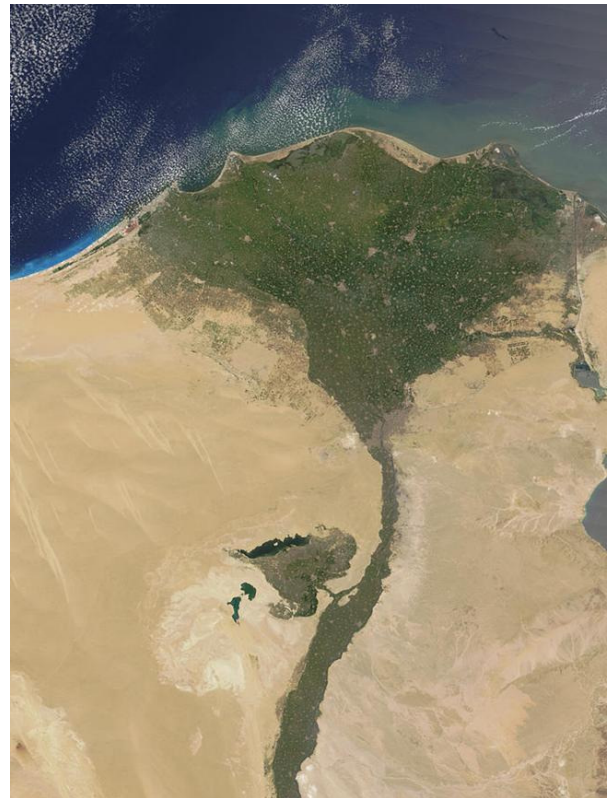


Egypt for Dummies
