

For each question, you need to find the answer and show your work. Each problem is worth 3 points: one for the correct answer and two for showing your work. For some problems, you may just need to write out how you know you have the correct answer.

1. A baseball team won 21 of its first 48 games. What percent of those games did the team win?

2. At Mitarnowski Memorial High School, about 73% of the students participate in extracurricular activities. If there are 1,240 students in school, how many participate?

3. A stamp that was sold at an auction in 1958 for \$32 is worth 830% of that today. What is its value today?

4. A book is on sale for 20% off the original price. It is selling for \$14. What was the original price?

5. Fuzzy Jeff came to 90% of the meetings of his club. If he attended 27 meetings, how many did he miss?

6. Maggie Brann saves 40% of her after-school earnings. Last month, she saved \$272. How much did she earn?

7. Some restaurants add an 18% tip to the bill for large parties. If a check is \$170, what is the total cost of dinner, including the 18% tip?

8. Last year, Shecky received a raise in his salary. He now earns 115% of what he earned last year. If his salary is \$520 per week, what was it before the raise?

Open-Ended Question: Answer the following question on a separate piece of paper. Make sure as you answer the open-ended question that you show your work AND explain how you know you are doing the correct work. YOU MUST EXPLAIN WHAT YOU ARE DOING!!!

Matt Mitarnowski compared stereos that were on sale at two competing stores. Stereo A was 30% off the original price of \$620. Stereo B was 20% off of the original price of \$159.

A. What proportions could help Matt determine the sale price of Stereo A? Stereo B?

B. What are the sale prices of Stereo A and Stereo B? Which costs less?
