A salute to African-American scientists, technologists, engineers and mathematicians in celebration of African-American history month, you will discover some of the achievements of some African-American achievers in science, technology, engineering, and math.

In celebrating the many accomplishments of African Americans, you will be required to write a research report on 4 STEM (Science, Technology, Engineer, Math) pioneers.

The number you chose will guide you on who you will report on. Take your number and multiply it by 1, 2 and 3, for example if you chose 10, you would do #10, #20 and #30. The 4th pioneer you can choose any from the list.

To get you off on a good start for the quarter, you will receive a POU (30%), CW (35%), HW (15%) and Do Now (20%) grade for all reports you hand in each week in February. That would mean a total of 16 grades. Put your best effort in when doing the research and writing the report.

All reports must include a Bibliography (Citation of your source for your report)
