Anthropology Exercise - making an ethnography

Anthropology is the study of humankind. An ethnography is a specific study of the characteristics of a particular culture based on evidence. Sometimes this evidence is archaeological or “lef behind” (e.g. bones, arrow heads). Sometimes the evidence comes from living sources -- people who still practice the ways of their ancestors. “People of the Seal” provides evidence from the recently remaining traditional Inuit culture of Pelly Bay. Use these notes to record your observations about clothing, housing, hunting, eating, environment, relationships, tools, etc. Use note form and simple diagrams. The result of your work on the Inuit (using the video evidence) could be called an ethnography -- a particular kind of “write-up” on culture.
