

## **EXHIBITION TASK**

You will choose a problem connected with *Sharing the Planet* that has local and global significance - an issue that you are genuinely interested in and concerned about.

A mentor will support you. That person will offer suggestions and provide feedback, but will not do the work for you. You will have to show a great deal of initiative.

You will work in groups but each member must contribute. No one will opt out.

**Process** (all documentation is put into your journal)

- Justify the reason you have chosen this issue, outlining your concerns, and what you already know about it
- Create a profile of each group member commenting on the specific skills/interest each person has that will be of value during this process
- Plan your investigation using the student planner supplied.
- Thoroughly investigate the issue in collaboration with your group by:
  - gathering as much evidence as possible to prove the Central Idea
  - drawing conclusions about your findings
  - developing possible solutions

## **Presenting your findings**

You must:

- Present your findings in the form of an exhibit
- Engage with your visitors demonstrating your knowledge, understandings and attitude toward the issue
- Share solid evidence proving your Central Idea
- Convince all visitors of the need to address the issue and take positive action to do something about it

## **How will you know you have been successful?**

Success Criteria

1. All group members will be fully informed about all aspects of the issue, the process, your recommended solutions
2. Your exhibit will attract many visitors because it is visually appealing
3. Visitors will be interested and fully engaged in what you have to share with them. They will question you because you are well informed and passionate so they will be eager to hear as much as possible about your issue.
4. Visitors will leave your exhibit well informed and intending to take positive action about the issue, because you have convinced them they need to be proactive and take responsibility
