

# Mid-Term Review Sheet

## 11<sup>th</sup> Grade World Literature

### Layout of the Mid-term

- There will be several passages on the exam that you will be asked to read. Following these passages will be multiple choice questions to which you will be asked to respond. These questions will be specific to content, theme, literary moves, etc. (\*See figurative language/literary elements list and “Defining Characteristics” below.) Some of these passages will be from texts that we have read, and others will be from new texts/excerpts/poems that are connected to what we have read.
- There will be at least one open-ended question that will direct you to make connections, compare and contrast, or simply analyze two different texts/passages.
- There will be one essay, so be sure to familiarize yourself with the parts of the essay (hook, thesis, topic sentences, elaboration/focus, clincher, restatement of the thesis in the conclusion, and essay clincher.)

**Grammar:** Be prepared to identify and correct mistakes!
