

Intro your paper with a vague, unspecific (wide) statement that is related to your topic: it should include the title of the book and the author's name.
(1 sentence)

Get a little bit more specific about the book—what's it about? And/or What is its theme (what can you learn from it?)
(1-2 sentence)

Get even a little bit more specific—Introduce a few of the main characters in the book, leading up to your thesis. (1-2 sentence)

Be really specific. This is your THESIS. Character name + Character Trait 1 + Character Trait 2 + Character 3.
