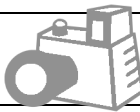

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Snapshots of Our Week



Reading:

We began the StoryTown reading curriculum this week. We discussed making predictions and learned new robust vocabulary words. I also began assessing students for reading comprehension and understanding.

Writing:

This week students began a writing activity called, "My Perfect Summer". They took one summer activity and wrote about it in three paragraphs. They did very well using detail in their stories.

Math:

We are well into Chapter 1 in math. We used the interactive whiteboard for several hands-on activities where students learned about place value. We learned the terms expanded, standard and written form. Ask your children the definitions!

Science/Social Studies:
