The first experience with trench warfare for Canadians. Also the first chlorine gas attack.	YAPOLSBTFERTE	
A military disaster fought largely by the Australians. Also known as the Dardanelles Campaign.	CIIPLGAPOIGNMAALL	
A British military honour for courage and bravery.	ASRVORTISCICO	
Over 20,000 Canadians were killed in this unsuccessful attempt to end trench warfare.	FEEMEMTSOTBOATHL	
The pilot who shot down 72 enemy planes – the most of any Canadian.	YLIBBPSHOIL	
A Canadian attack on a Belgian town where only 7 kilometres were gained at the cost of 16,000 lives.	AOLSENTBCDPEEEFSLAHTA	
A successful technique used to protect Allied supply ships by surrounding them with armed destroyers.	MNTCVEOYOSYS	
The first time Canadian troops fought together as a unit under a Canadian commander.	EBIYGDVATLEMTRIAT	

Aerial duels where planes dove on the enemy aircraft from the rear and then fired.	DGOIHTFG	
A British passenger ship sunk by a German submarine. 1198 people drowned, including many influential Americans.	LANISTUIA	
A battle of attrition that caused high psychological damage for French troops.	NDVBEETRATFLUO
