

Safety Experts Say School Bus Passengers Should Be Belted

Bus Tumbles Down Vast Ravine

Safety Experts say that all school busses should be equipped with seat belts after a major crash occurred on the highway late Monday evening. The bus was on its way back from a field trip to the Grand Canyon when a rabid goat ran out onto the road.
