5. Name and describe or draw two different organisms near you that

may be prey for other organisms.

6. Name and describe or draw two different organisms that have a distinguishing texture.

7. Write a brief description for how each texture may encourage or discourage other organisms to touch it.

8. Name and describe or draw one organism that appears to be living in isolation from all other organisms.
