You are here to learn and if you are not going to learn or you are prohibiting others from learning you will not be in the room. If you choose to break a rule you will either be sent to the hall or the office. If the disruption/problem is minor you will be sent to the hall. Attendance/Make-up work

Every day in class you are going to learn, so it is important that you are here. If you do happen to miss, you get two days to make up work for every one day you are absent. If you are absent it is your responsibility to get your assignments that were due while you were gone done and handed in. It is also your responsibility to get the information you missed while you were gone. You can do this by asking the teacher (NOT during class, but in free time/work time), asking a friend, etc. Handouts you missed while being gone will be located in the trays on the counter. Being juniors and seniors in a college prep class you should be responsible. Any work that is late is a deduction of a grade for everyday that it is late. If you know an assignment is due or a test is that day you **MUST** have the work done/take the test upon your return. Test example: if you know the test is Friday (written on the board days before) and you miss the review day Thursday, you still have to take the test. Homework example: if it is due on Thursday and you are absent Thursday it is due first thing Friday – NOT Monday or Tuesday.
