The students will take a broadcast test and produce a promotional video while in Kansas City.

The AHS construction team also won the State competition and has qualified for Nationals. Alex Kenne, Christian Smith, Alex Larsen, and Dalton Kron took the gold in the team works category, outdistancing the second place team by almost 200 points. At State,
