MONTHLY Objectives

English Language arts (ELA): Students will learn how to draw conclusions using clues from the text. The students will review sight words introduced so far and practice asking questions to help them understand the text as well as story elements including setting, characters and reasons for their actions.

Math: The students will describe and compare the attributes of real-life objects such as balls, boxes, cans, and cones or models of 3D geometric figures and recognize shapes in real-life figures. The students will also describe, identify, and compare 2D shapes including circles, triangles, rectangles, and squares.

Science: Students will explore ways patterns of change including the seasons and months of the year.

Social Studies: This unit introduces students to different ways families and communities celebrate. The students will also be introduced to places on the earth including land and water.
