MONTHLY OBJECTIVES

English Language arts (ELA): Students will begin practicing how to identify facts and opinions with expository texts. The students will also practice comparing and contrasting. High Frequency Words: into, get, gets, there that, they, all + some.

Math: The students will identify the coins' names, attributes and value. They will continue counting to 50 and identifying patterns in numbers while counting. We will also be composing and decomposing numbers to 10 using multiple models in flexible ways to build number sense. Students will begin acting out addition and subtraction situations.

Science: Students will explore various types of earth materials in comparison to others that are similar.

Social Studies: Students will learn how to use simple maps and globes to determine locations. Students will also examine the significance of selected individuals and events in history.
