Asking about words such as the beginning sound and words that rhyme is also great practice of what we are learning at school.

MONTHLY Objectives

English Language arts (ELA): Students begin to learn key literacy strategies including story elements, sequencing, context clues and author's purpose. We will also be introducing the HFW: and, are, like, but, us, up, not, on, down, big, little, it, in, go, with, come, to, as, has, want.

Math: Students will compose and decompose numbers to 5. The students will compare the length of given objects. The students will collect and organize data to create graphs and interpret information. The students will count and represent quantities and collections fluently to 20.

Science: Students will begin to gather information about properties of matter by measuring objects. Students will conduct investigations using their sense of sight to explore light, heat and energy. Students will explore ways that objects change and interact with other objects due to movement.

Social Studies: Students will be introduced to the reasons for certain national patriotic holidays and the contributions of important people in history. They will also be introduced to ways in which families satisfy their basic human needs for food, clothing, and shelter, and to why people work.
