

Lake Shore's Wall of Peace

Attention Homerooms:

In honor of Veteran's Day, the student council requests your participation in a short activity. We ask that you please complete this by the end of the day Friday, November 20th. How cool would it be to construct a "brick wall" honoring our veterans that the entire school helped to make?

The Activity:

The students are to write a short paragraph using any of the following prompts:

What do you feel is the foundation of our country?

In what ways can we honor our veterans?

How do we show respect for our country?

In what ways can we, as individuals, on a daily basis help keep the peace?

What is tolerance?

How does tolerance promote peace?

Veterans have shown their loyalty to our country. How can we show ours?

Why is it important to keep honoring our veterans?

1. Please have the students brainstorm ideas to answer these questions or have a class discussion about them.
2. When the students have generated some ideas, they need to TYPE a short paragraph answering one of the questions listed above.
3. Once their paragraph is typed, have them cut it out and paste/tape it onto the brown bricks provided.
4. Please turn in any finished bricks to Mrs. Bergholz's mailbox by Friday, November 20th.
5. All of the bricks that are completed will be posted on the wall in the cafeteria to build Lake Shore's Wall of Peace in honor of our veterans and will represent peace, honor, respect, tolerance, and loyalty.
