You Are What You Eat

All animals can be classified according to what they eat. Herbivores are plant-eating animals such as (1.) horses, (2.) sheep, and (3.) rabbits. Carnivores are meat-eating animals. They often eat herbivores. (4.) Foxes, (5.) wolves, and (6.) tigers are examples of carnivores. Then there are animals that eat both plants and animals. (7.) Pigs are one example of omnivores, and so are (8.) bears. (9–10.) Do you know other familiar animals that can be classified by what they eat?
