**Recognizing Sequence and Chronological Order**

**A. Directions:** Read the passage. Then answer the questions.

Paul Robeson was an actor, singer, writer, athlete, and civil rights leader. He was born in Princeton, New Jersey, in April 1898. His mother was burned to death in 1904 after a coal from a stove set her dress on fire. Robeson graduated from high school in 1915. He then became only the third African American accepted at Rutgers University. At Rutgers, he was an excellent student and participated in four sports.

Robeson gained fame as an actor and singer. In 1930, he starred in Shakespeare's *Othello* staged in England. At that time, no U.S. theater group would hire a person of color for the role.

Robeson often criticized the U.S. government for its treatment of minorities. From 1941–74, he was watched closely by FBI agents because of his political views. He died in January 1976.

To make a vanilla-almond soy shake, all you have to do is pour, chop, and blend. First, chop one mango and one-half a banana. Wrap them in foil and freeze over night. Next, measure 1 cup of soy milk, one cup of almond milk and a half cup oat milk into a blender. Then add in the frozen fruit. Pulse a few times, then blend until smooth. Finally, spoon honey, vanilla and a few drops almond extract into the blender, and puree one last time. When it is frothy, pour it into tall glasses and drink right away.
