hal•low (hāl'ō) ► *v.* 1. To make or set apart as holy. 2. To respect or honor greatly; revere. [*< OE hālgian.*]
Hal•low•een also **Hal•low•e'en** (hāl'ō-wēn', hōl'-) ► *n.* Oct. 31, celebrated by children wearing costumes and begging treats. [*< All Hal-low Even.*]
hal•lu•ci•na•tion (hə-lōō'sə-nā'shən) ► *n.* 1a. False or distorted perception of objects or events with a compelling sense of their reality. b. The objects or events so perceived. 2. A false or mistaken idea; delusion. [*< Lat. alūcinārī, to dream.*] — **hal•lu'ci•nate** *v.* — **hal•lu'ci•na'tion•al**, **hal•lu'ci•na'tive** *adj.* — **hal•lu'ci•na•to'ry** (hə-lōō'sə-nə-tōr'ē, -tōr'ē) *adj.*
