2010 MWSD Summer Institute Topics

CLASSROOM MANAGEMENT - Acquire basic classroom management skills to make your classroom more effective and pleasurable.

COLLABORATION ACTIVITIES FOR STUDENTS - This workshop will focus on ways to involve all students in the classroom to make learning effective. This will be mostly "hands-on" practice. Learners will also explore a few uses of technology such as Skype, for the purpose of communicating with other schools.

CPR/FIRST AID - Participants will receive American Red Cross certification in CPR and First Aid.

DIFFERENTIATED INSTRUCTION - Looking for ways to reach *all* students in your class? Acquire simple ways to differentiate your instruction so that all students are growing academically.

FLORIDA CENTER FOR READING RESEARCH - Benefit from guided instruction and practice creating K-5 student centered, literacy activities for the classroom. Please bring a binder for organizing FCRR materials.

GEOTGEBRA - A free tool that is perfect for teaching geometry, algebra and calculus concepts to students in elementary, middle and high school. Leave this session with experience interacting with geogebra and lesson ideas.

GUIDED READING - View and discuss videos of guided reading lessons after reviewing the structure of a guided reading lesson. Come and share/listen to the successes and concerns with guided reading.

HISTORY TOURS - Learn how to use/create History Tours, premade Google Earth tours, in your classroom. These tours are excellent for visual learners as they highlight important people and places in history.

READ NATURALLY - Read Naturally is a structured intervention program that combines teacher modeling, repeated reading, and progress monitoring to improve students' reading proficiency.

READING APPRENTICESHIP STRATEGIES - Reading Apprenticeship is designed to increase teacher effectiveness and improve students' reading and writing skills in content area classes.

SMARTBOARDS - You might have noticed the new electronic boards that have arrived in your building. Come interact with the new electronic whiteboards placed in every building throughout our district. Learners will acquire the basics for using these boards with students.

TEACHER WEBPAGES - Frustrated with your teacher webpage? Jump on board with this new program that will allow you to update your webpage with only a few clicks! More importantly, this tool will allow you to update your webpage at home. Get a jump start with your new page by attending this session.

THINKFINITY - Learn how to find appropriate and useful Internet resources for your daily lessons using this online portal. Formerly MarcoPolo, Thinkfinity offers free resources including lesson plans that provide differentiation and extension activities from different content partner sites such as Arts Alive and Illustrations (NCMT).

USING PARAPROFESSIONALS IN THE CLASSROOM - Acquire useful tips for using instructional assistants, TSS workers, and other adults effectively in your classroom.

WEB 2.0 TOOLS - What are web 2.0 tools and how do we navigate through them? The learner will explore 6 different sites that are user friendly classroom tools. The follow-up discussion will include how to adapt these websites for individual classrooms.

WEBQUESTS - Webquests are an ideal project/class assignment for today's classroom. They provide an excellent opportunity for curriculum to come alive to students while incorporating real-world expectations. Come to this session and leave with examples and a personally created webquest!

WRITING OBJECTIVES FOR THE 21ST CENUTRY - There is so much talk about getting students to think at higher levels, but how do we accomplish this? Begin with the groundwork by learning how to write lesson objectives for today's students.
