*This* indicates that something is near us; *that* indicates that it is at a distance.

- *This* book is in my hand.
- *That* book is over there on the table.

The plural of *this* is *these*; the plural of *that* is *those*.

- *These* books are in my hand.
- *Those* books are over there on the table.
