- 5) What would you do if you were cyber-bullied?

- 7) How much of a problem do you think cyberbullying is?
- 8) What can people do to stop cyberbullying?
- 9) Do Internet companies and mobile phone companies have a duty to stop cyberbullying?
- 10) Do you think there should be a punishment for cyberbullying?

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STUDENT B's QUESTIONS (Do not show these to student A)

- 1) What examples of cyberbullying can you think of?
- 2) Do you know anyone, or have you heard about anyone who has been cyber-bullied?
- 3) How do you think cyberbullying affects the life of those bullied?
- 4) Isn't it best simply to not visit the sites on which nasty comments or pictures are posted if you are being cyber-bullied?
- 5) Don't you think it would be easy for police to trace where nasty posts of text messages came from?
- 6) What responsibilities do social networking sites have in stopping cyberbullying?
- 7) Do you think cyber bullies and school or office bullies are different?
