<u>1) In positive sentences:</u> I need some butter. <u>2) In questions when offering or requesting something that is there:</u> Could I have some water, please?	<u>1) In questions:</u> Is there any cheese left? <u>2) In negative sentences:</u> There isn't any milk left.

b) 2nd match: MUCH vs. MANY

MUCH	MANY
<u>MUCH + singular</u> There is much traffic.	<u>MANY + plural</u> There are many cars.
