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## 5. Photo Booth



Click the Photo Booth icon in the Dock.



Click the red button to take a picture. Use the slider on the left to switch between photos and videos.



Click Effects.



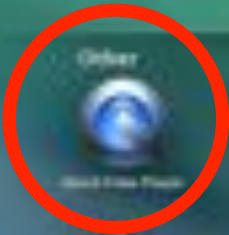
Play around with different effects and take a few more pictures.



Quit Photo Booth (you will need to move your cursor to the very top of the screen to see the Photo Booth menu, alternatively, use the Command-Q keyboard shortcut).

## 6. QuickTime Screen Recording

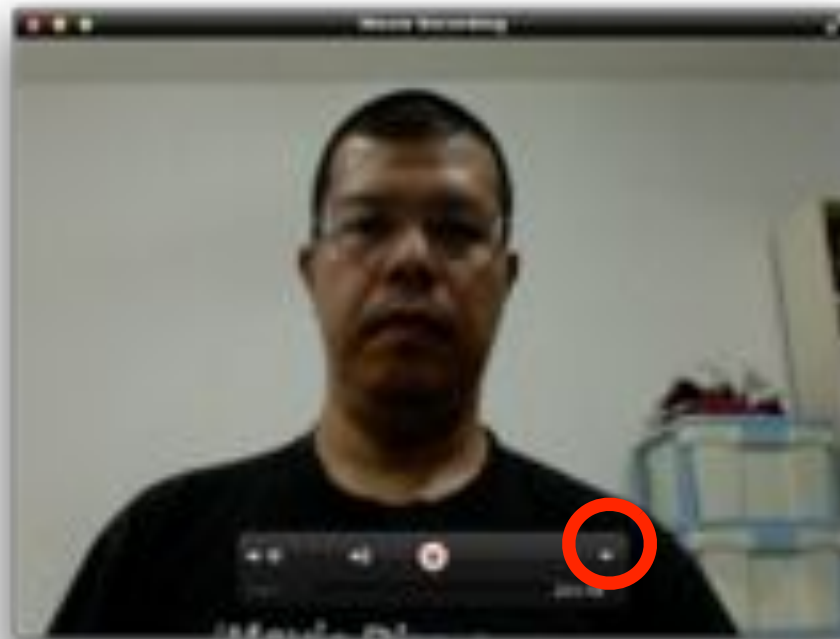




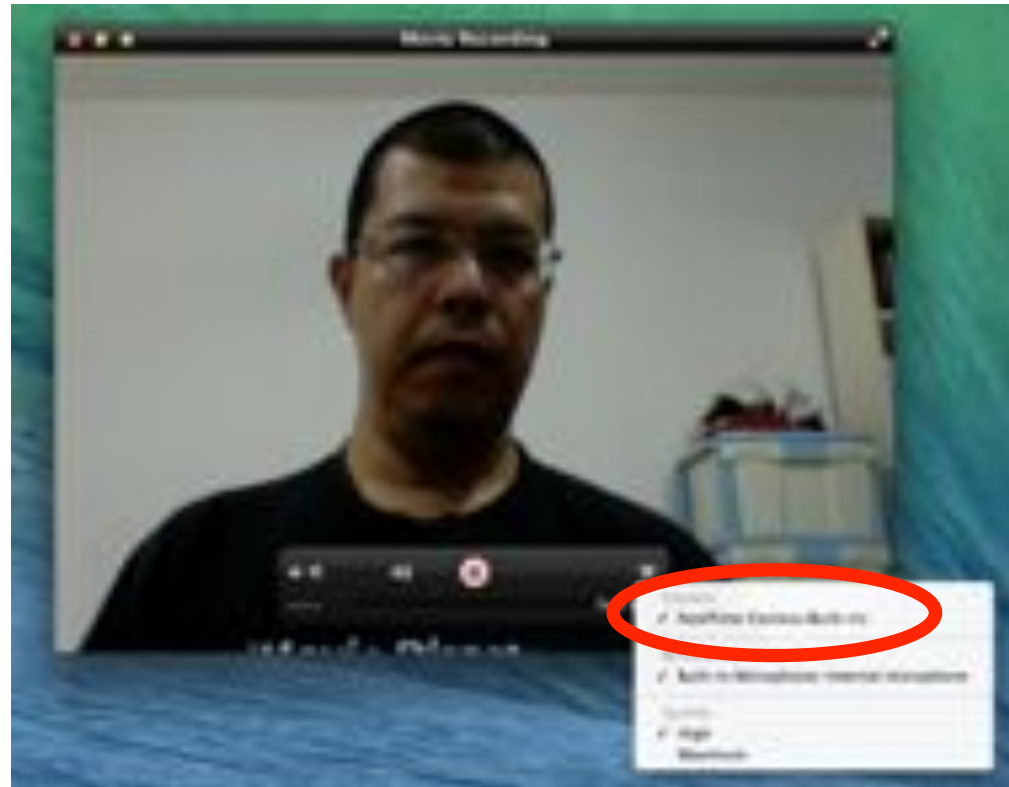
Click LaunchPad and launch QuickTime Player. It's in the Other folder.



Choose New Movie Recording from the File menu.



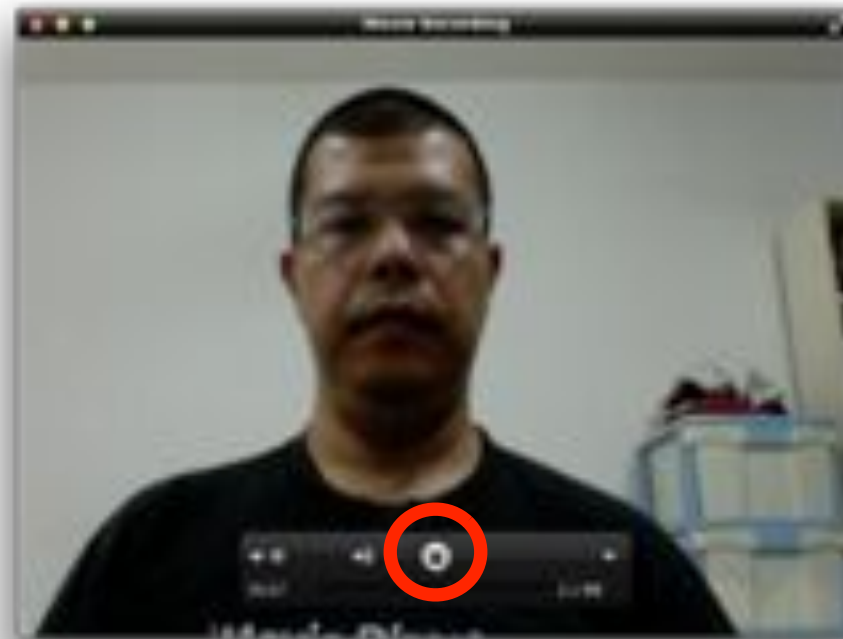
Click on the small disclosure triangle in the player.



Make sure the Built-in Microphone is selected. You can choose Medium quality to conserve disk space.



Click the Record button.



Record 10 seconds of video. Click the Stop button.

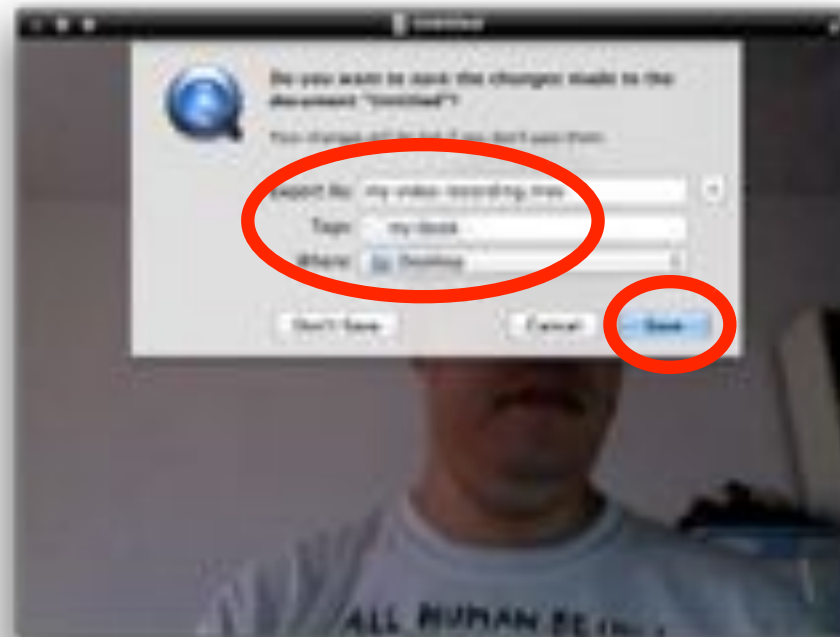


Click the Play button to play the movie you just recorded.



Click the red button on the upper left corner.





Save the movie with the following settings:

Export as: my video recording.mov

Tags: my iBook

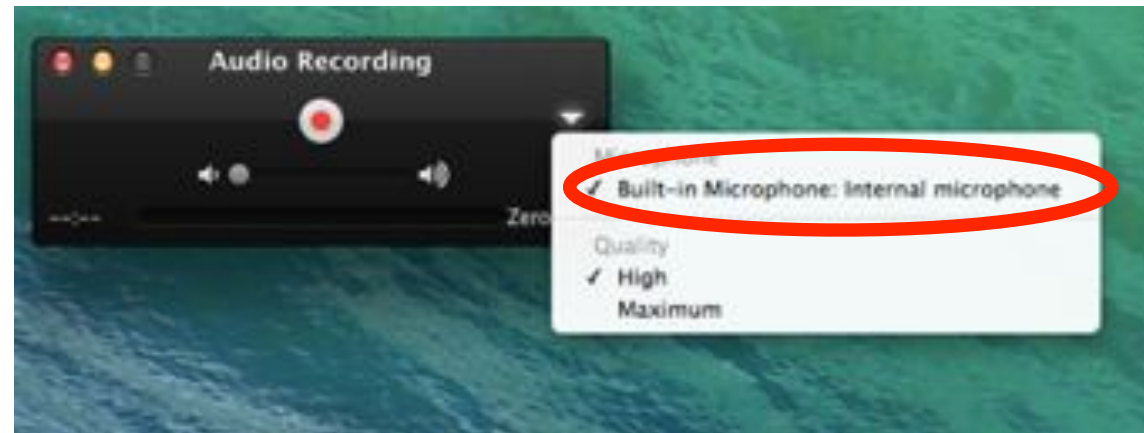
Where: wherever you like



Choose New Audio Recording from the File menu.



Click on the disclosure triangle.



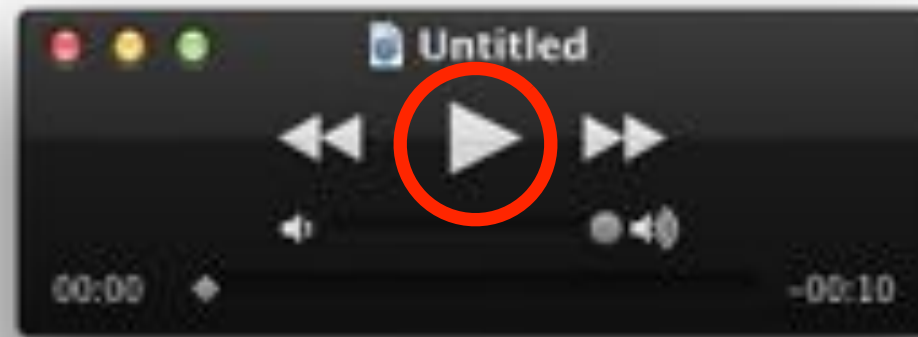
Make sure the Built-in Microphone is selected. You can choose High quality to conserve disk space.



Click the Record button to start recording. Record audio for 10 seconds.



Click the Stop button to stop.

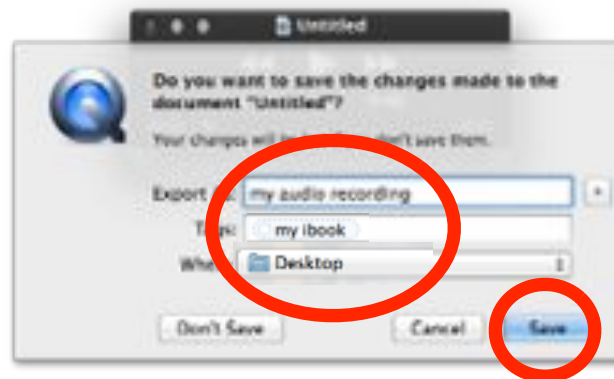


Play back the recording by clicking the Play button.



Click the Red button in the upper left hand corner.





Save this recording with the following settings.

Export as: my audio recording

Tags: my ibook

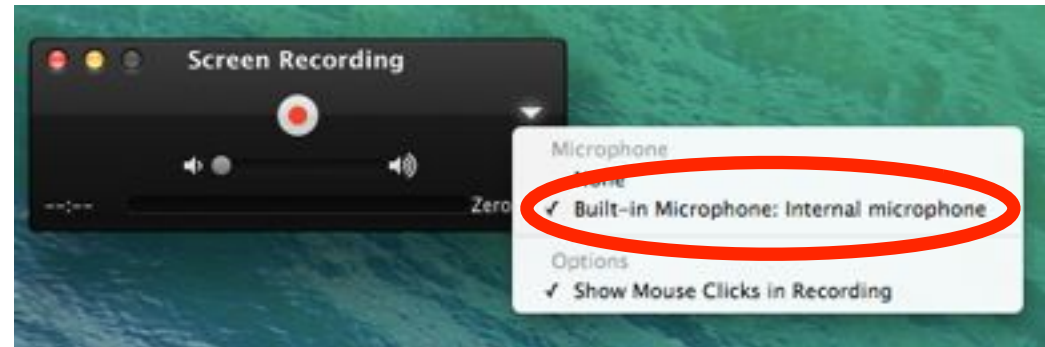
Where: wherever you like



Choose New Screen Recording from the File menu.



Click the disclosure triangle.



Make sure that Built-in Microphone is set and Show Mouse Clicks in Recording is set. You can set the Quality to Medium to conserve disk space.



Click to start recording the screen. Drag to just record part of the screen.



Click the Stop button in the menu bar when done.



Click Play to play the recorded video.



Click the red button on the upper left hand corner.





Save the recorded video with the following settings:

Export As: my screen capture

Tags: my ibook

Where: wherever you wish

## 7. iPhoto



Click the iPhoto icon in the Dock.



If you see this dialog, click Yes.



Click Continue.



Click Continue.

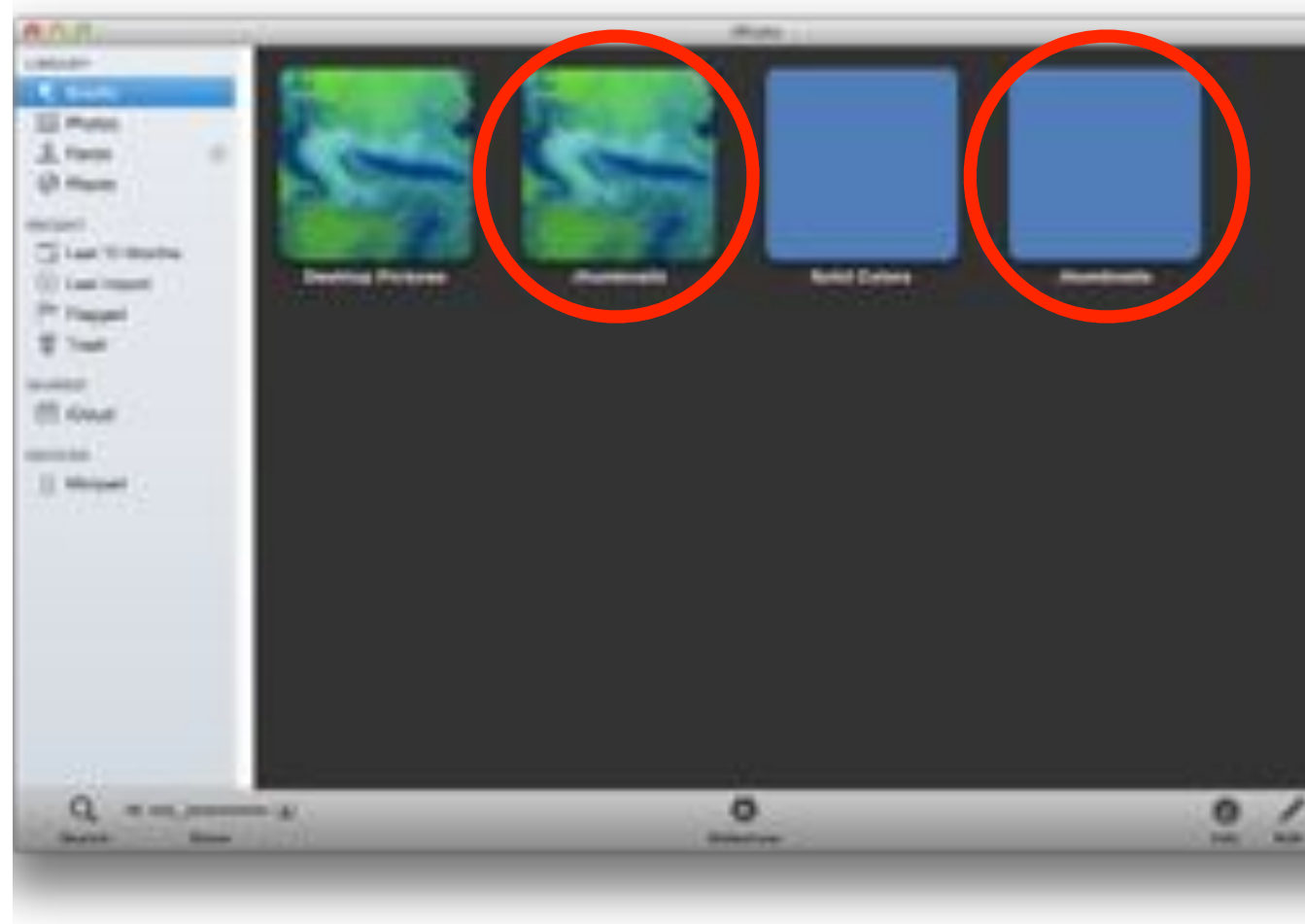


Click Events in iPhoto. Drag the Desktop Pictures into the iPhoto window to import them.



Click Events after all the pictures have been imported.

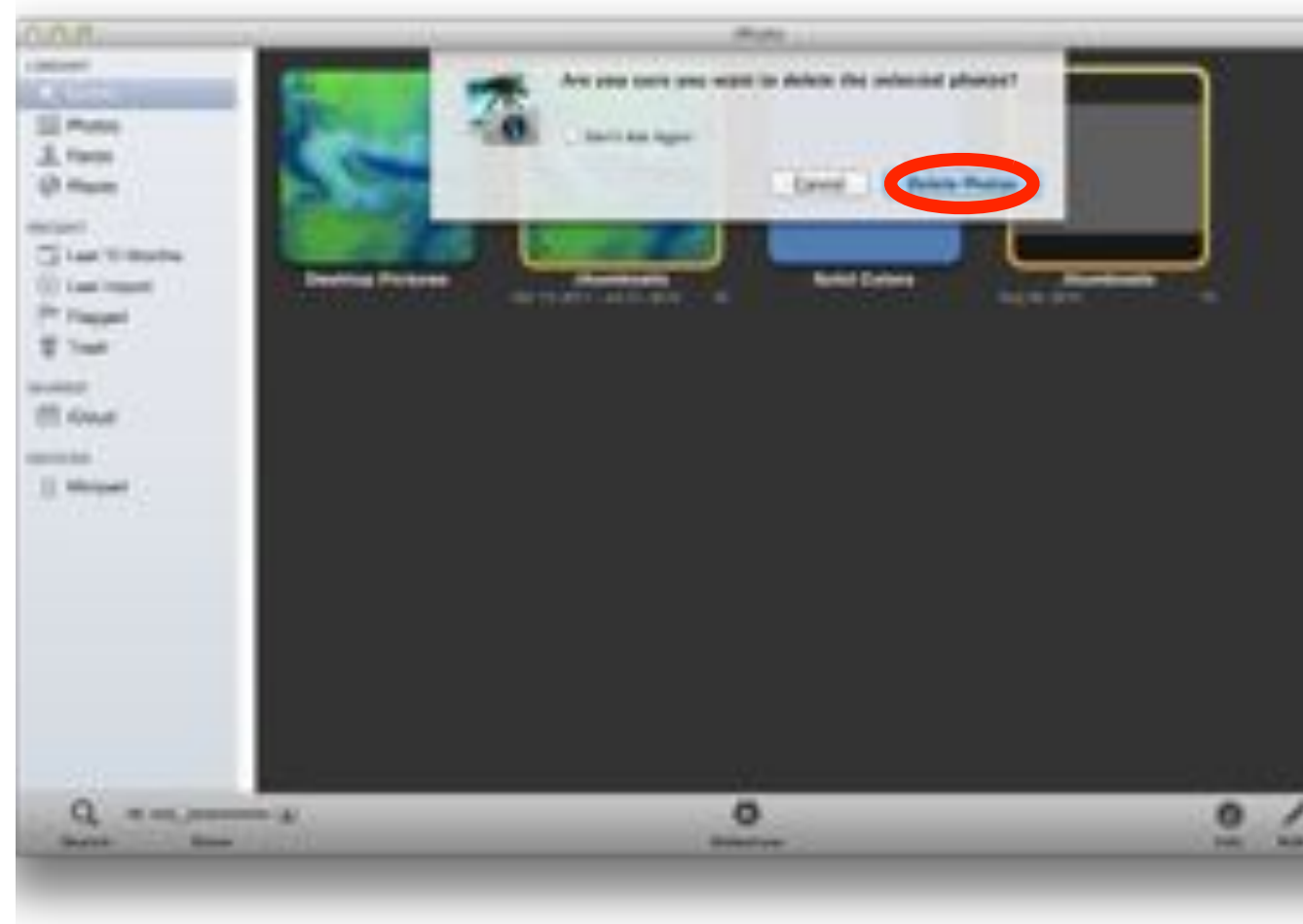




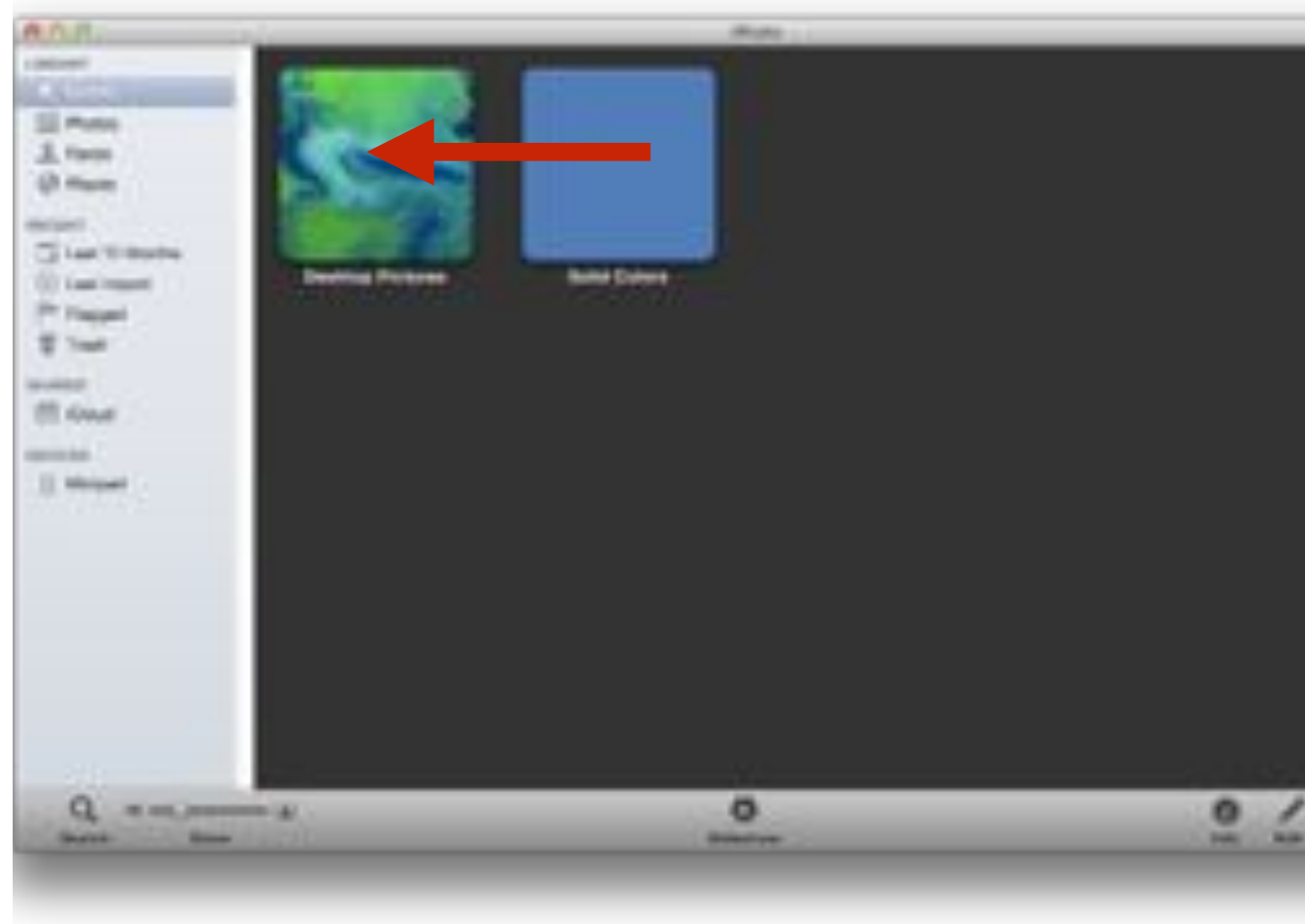
Select all the .thumbnails folders (Use Command-click to select).



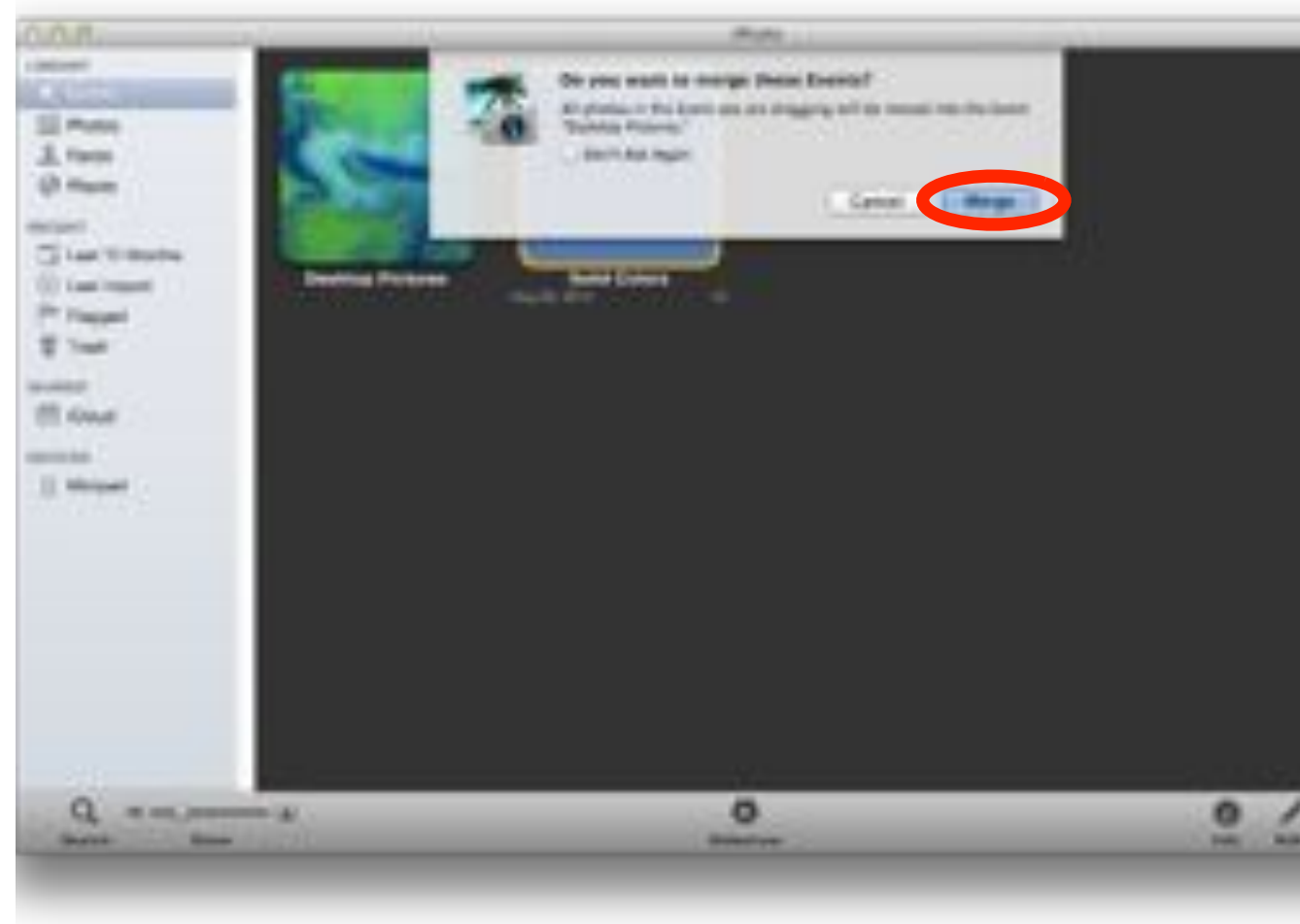
Press Command-Delete to remove all the selected folders.



Click Delete Photos.



Drag the Solid Colors folder on top of the Desktop Pictures folder.



Click Merge to merge them into a single event.



With the merged event selected (it will have a yellow border), click Slideshow.



Choose a slideshow theme and click Play.



The slideshow plays. Press Esc to exit.

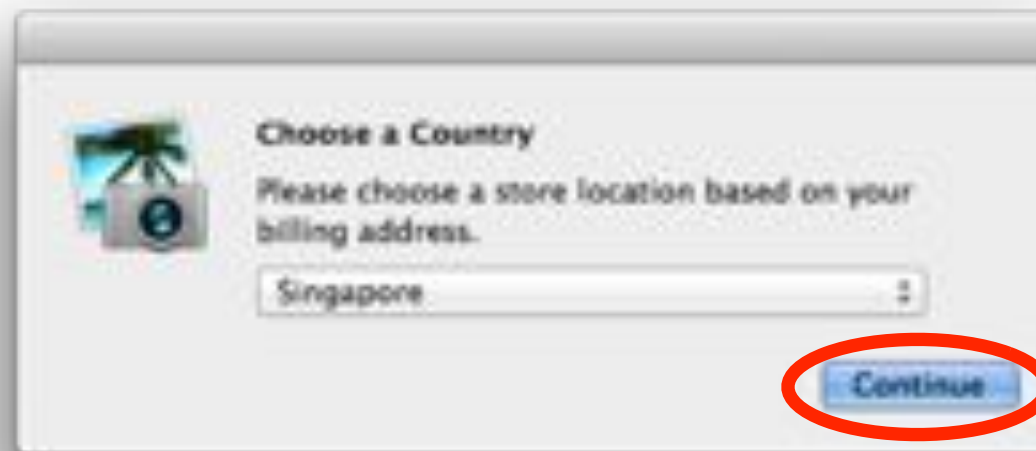




Make sure the merged event is still selected. Click Share.



Choose Calendar from the Create section.



If you see this popup, choose Singapore.



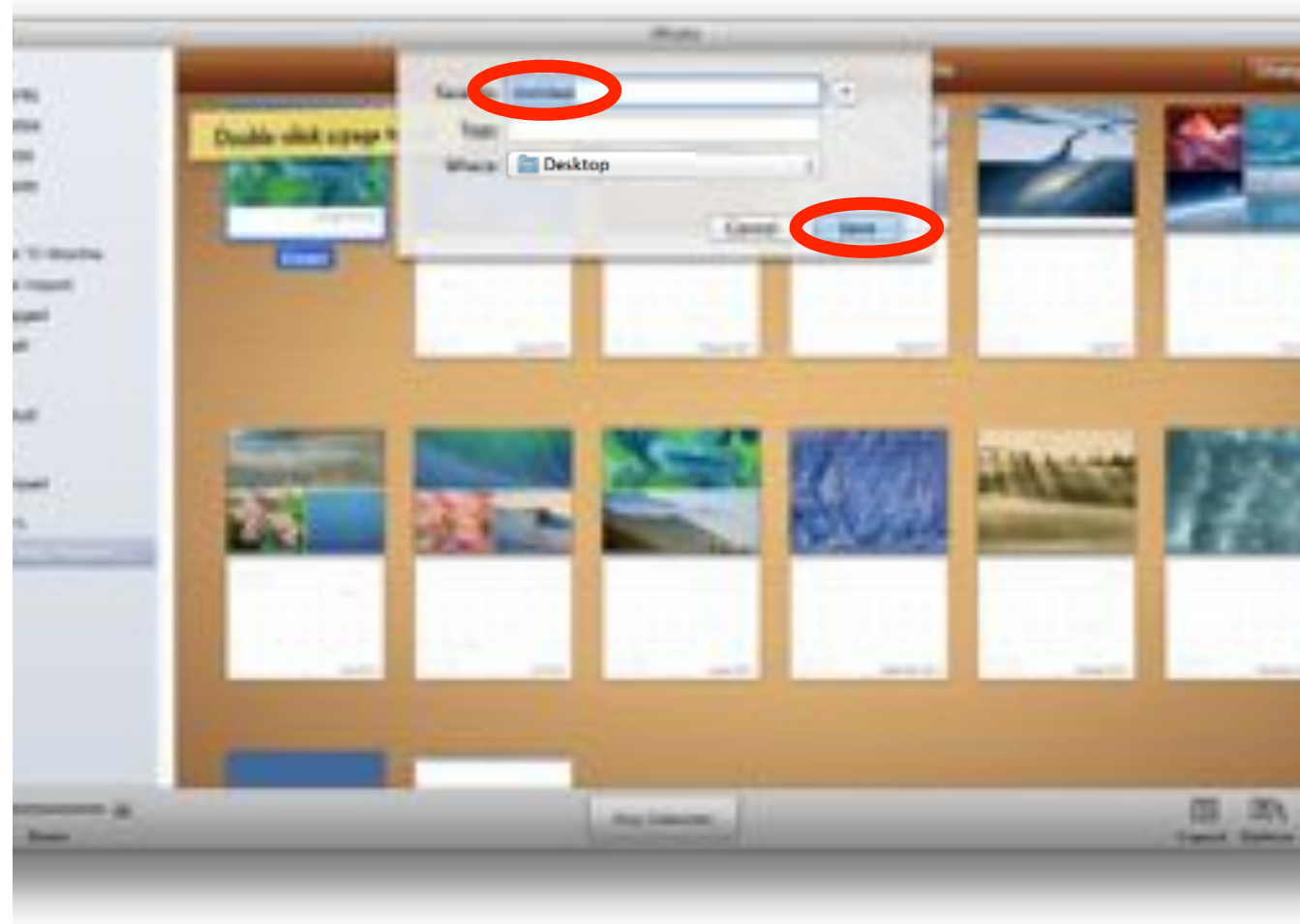
Choose a Calendar design that you like. Click Create.



Set Show national holidays: to Malaysia. Click OK.



Your calendar has been laid out. Option-click the Buy Calendar button to save your calendar as a PDF.

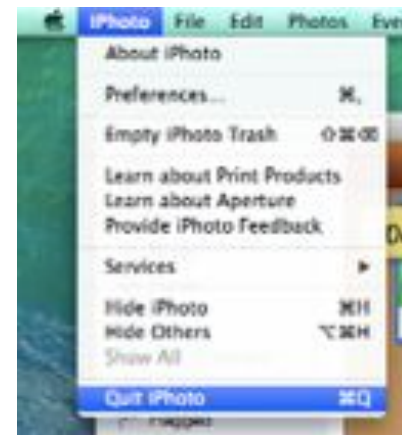


Type in a name for your calendar and save it to the Desktop.



Wait until the Save completes.





Quit iPhoto.



You will see your calendar on the Desktop. Click it once to select it.



Press the space bar to preview the calendar.

## 8. GarageBand



Click LaunchPad and launch GarageBand.



Click Continue.

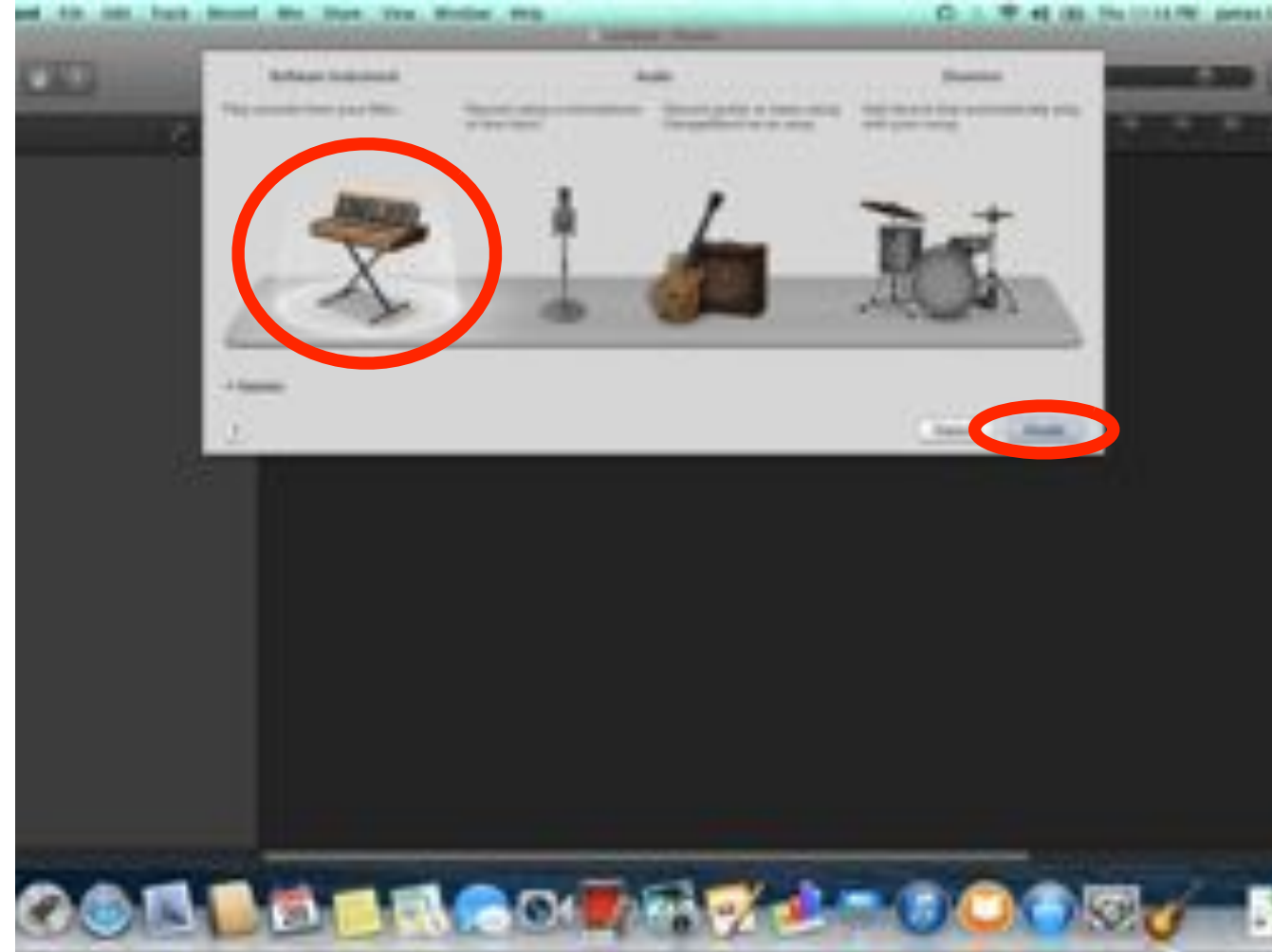


Click Continue.



Click Empty Project and click Choose.





Click Software Instrument and click Create.



Click the red button to dismiss the Musical typing window.



Click the Loops button.






The Loop browser is displayed.



Click the metronome at the top of the screen so you won't hear a ticking sound during playback.



Click Electric, loops in that category will be displayed.

Find 80s Dance Pad 1.



Drag that to a new track in GarageBand as shown, with its top left corner touching 80s Dance Bass Synth 06's bottom right corner.



Click the top right corner of Dance Bass Synth 06 and drag to the right until it ends at the same point as Dance Pad 01.

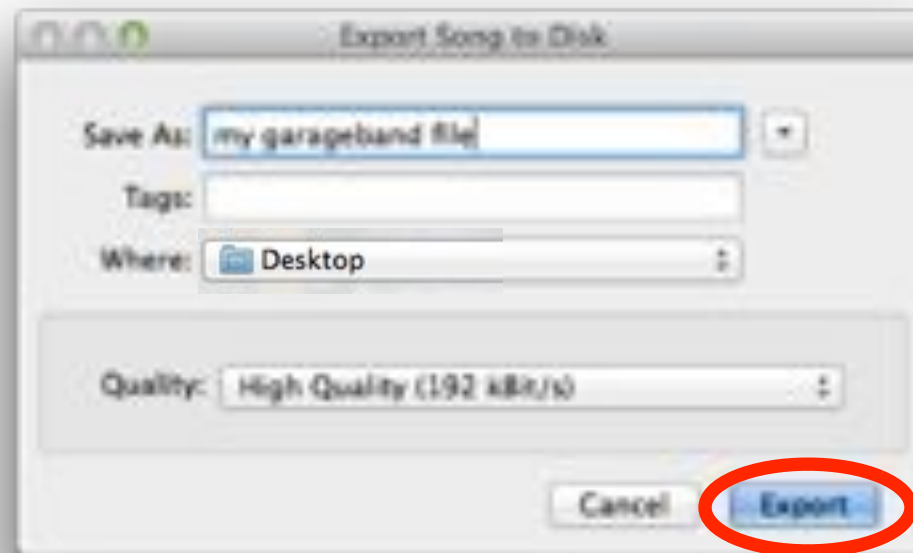
Find Club Dance Beat 063.



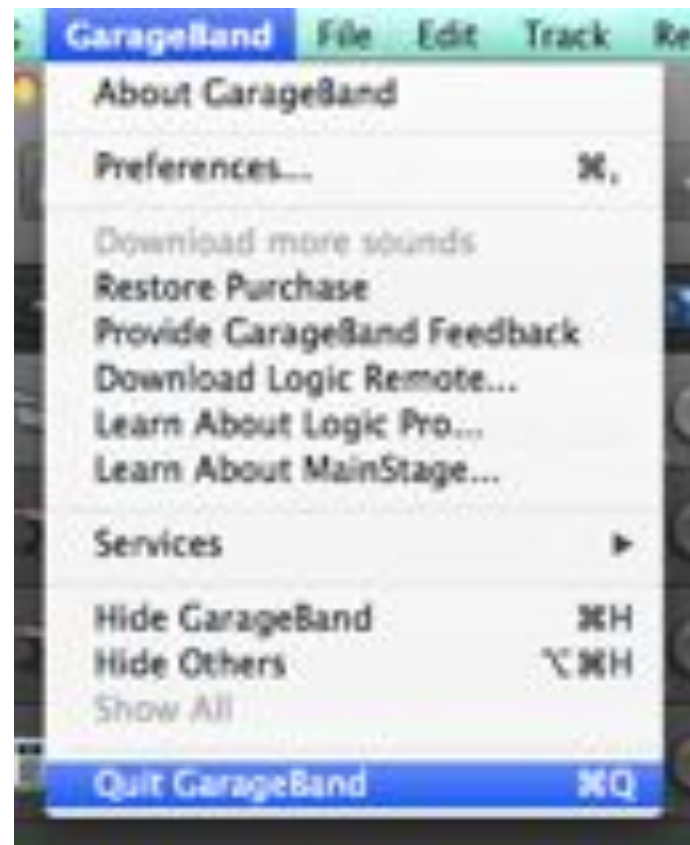
Drag it to a third track. You can rewind and play back your composition.

Export it to the Desktop.

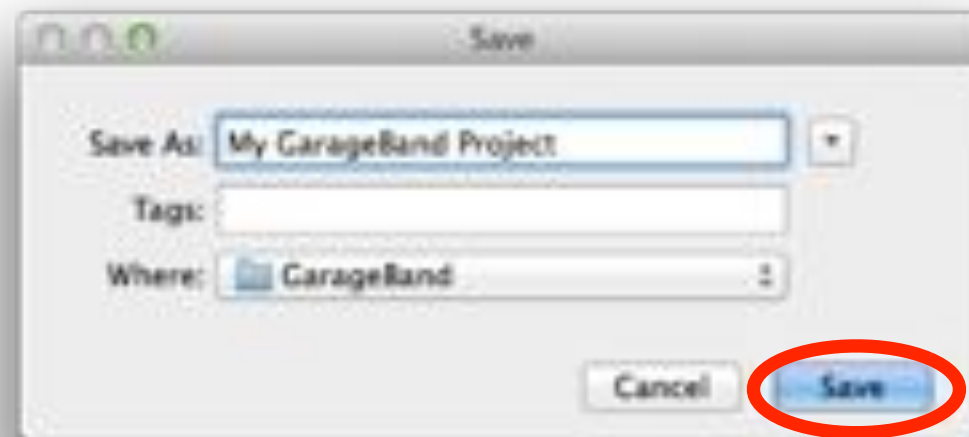


Choose Quit from the GarageBand menu.

Click the iMovie icon in the Dock.



Click Continue.



Click Continue.

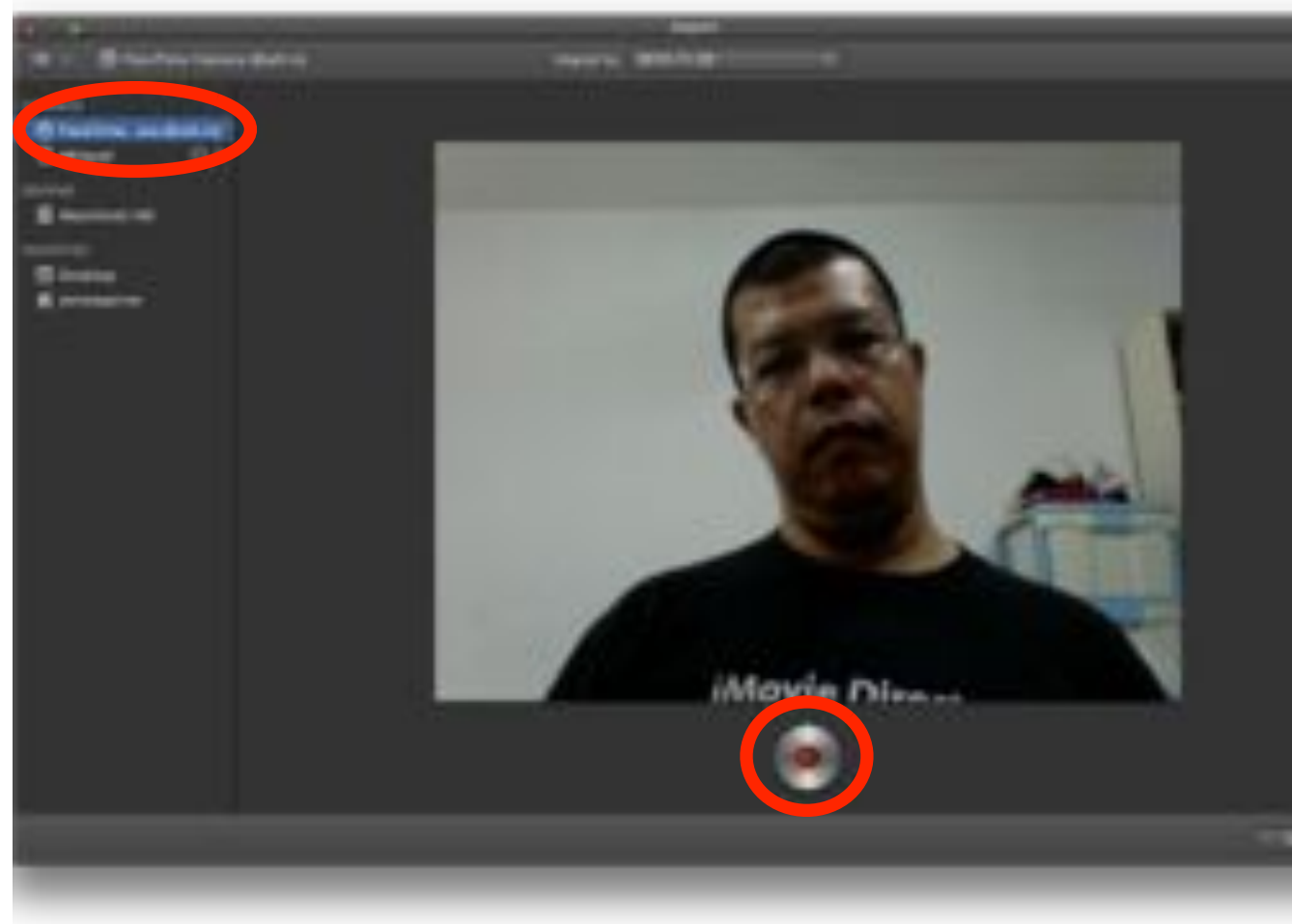


The main iMovie window is displayed.

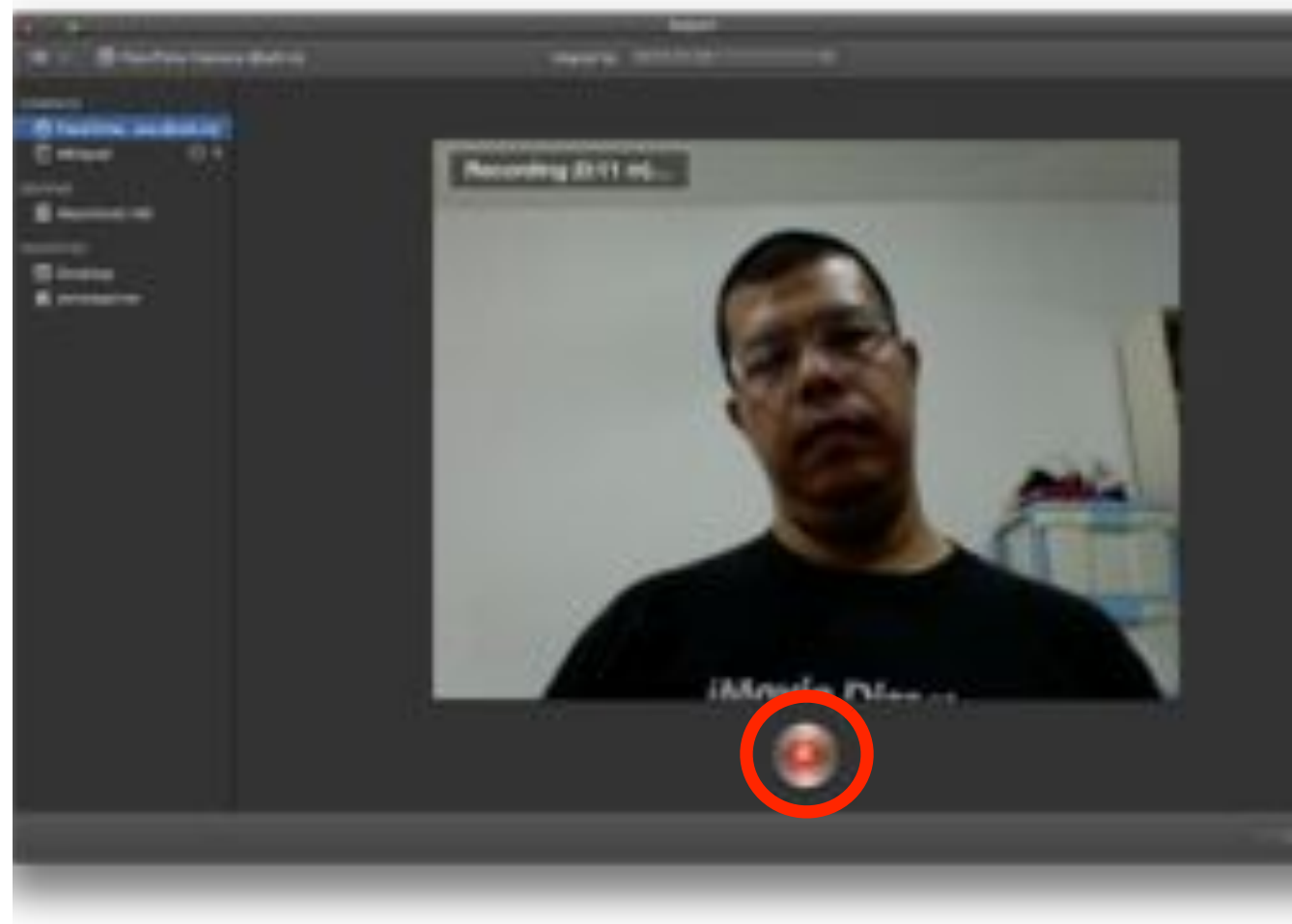


Click Import Media.

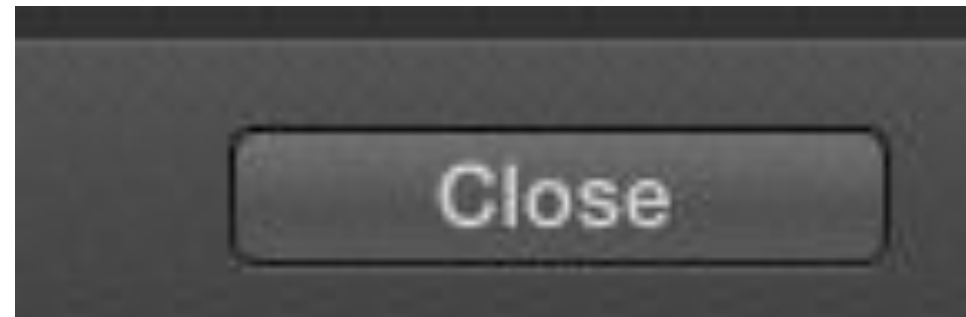




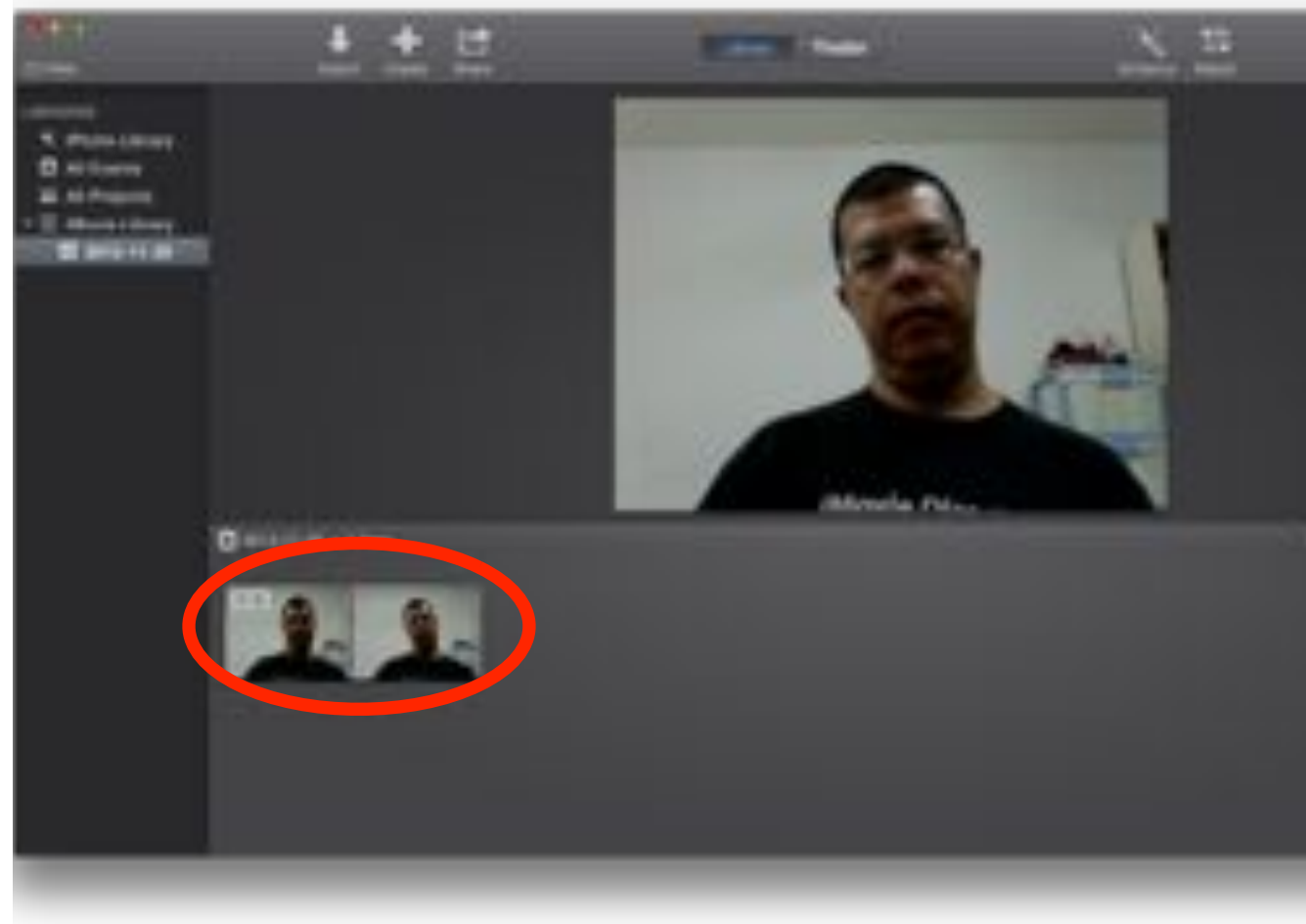
Click FaceTime camera in the sidebar. You will see your face. Click the Record button.



Say "Hi, my name is (name) and I'd like to talk to you about plants". Click the Record button again to stop.



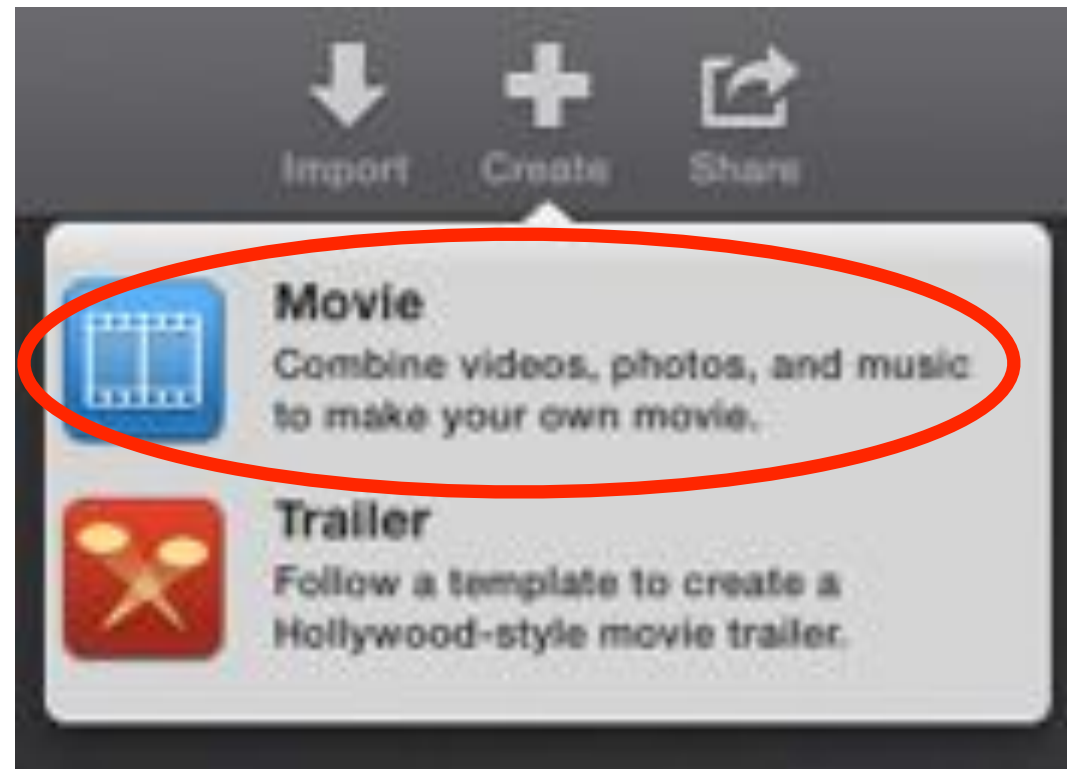
Click the Close button to dismiss the Import screen.



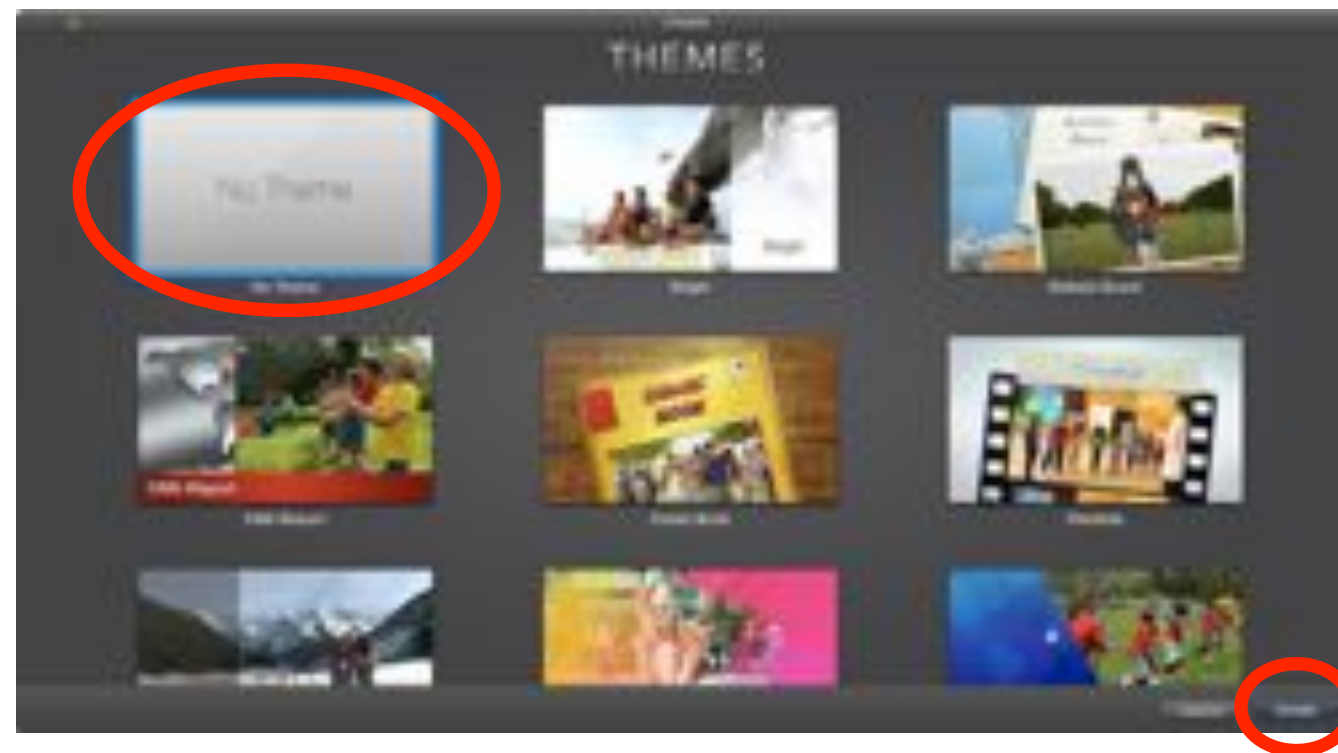
Move your mouse pointer over the imported video, and press Space to play it back.



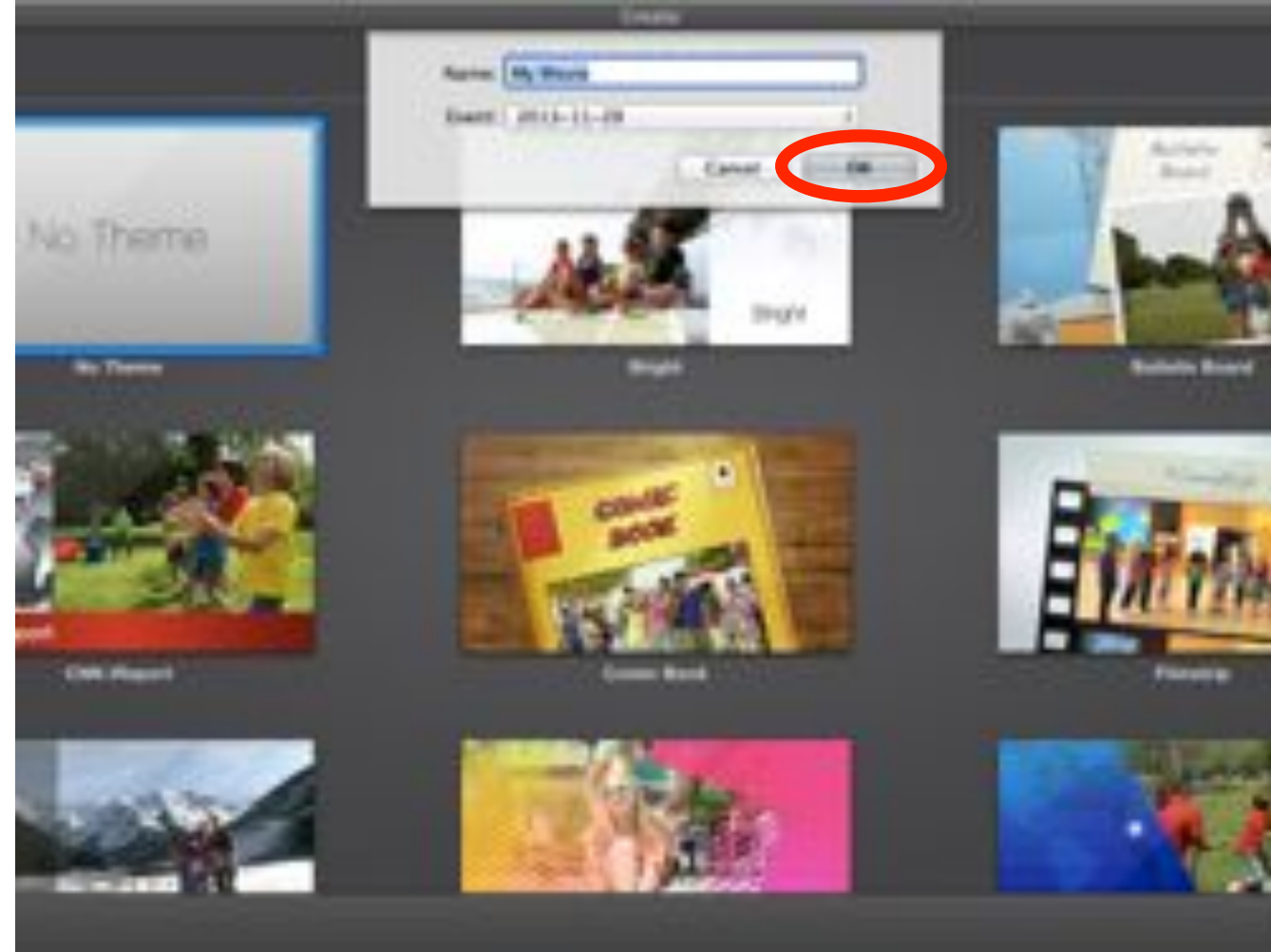
Click the Create button.



Choose Movie.



Choose No Theme and click Create.

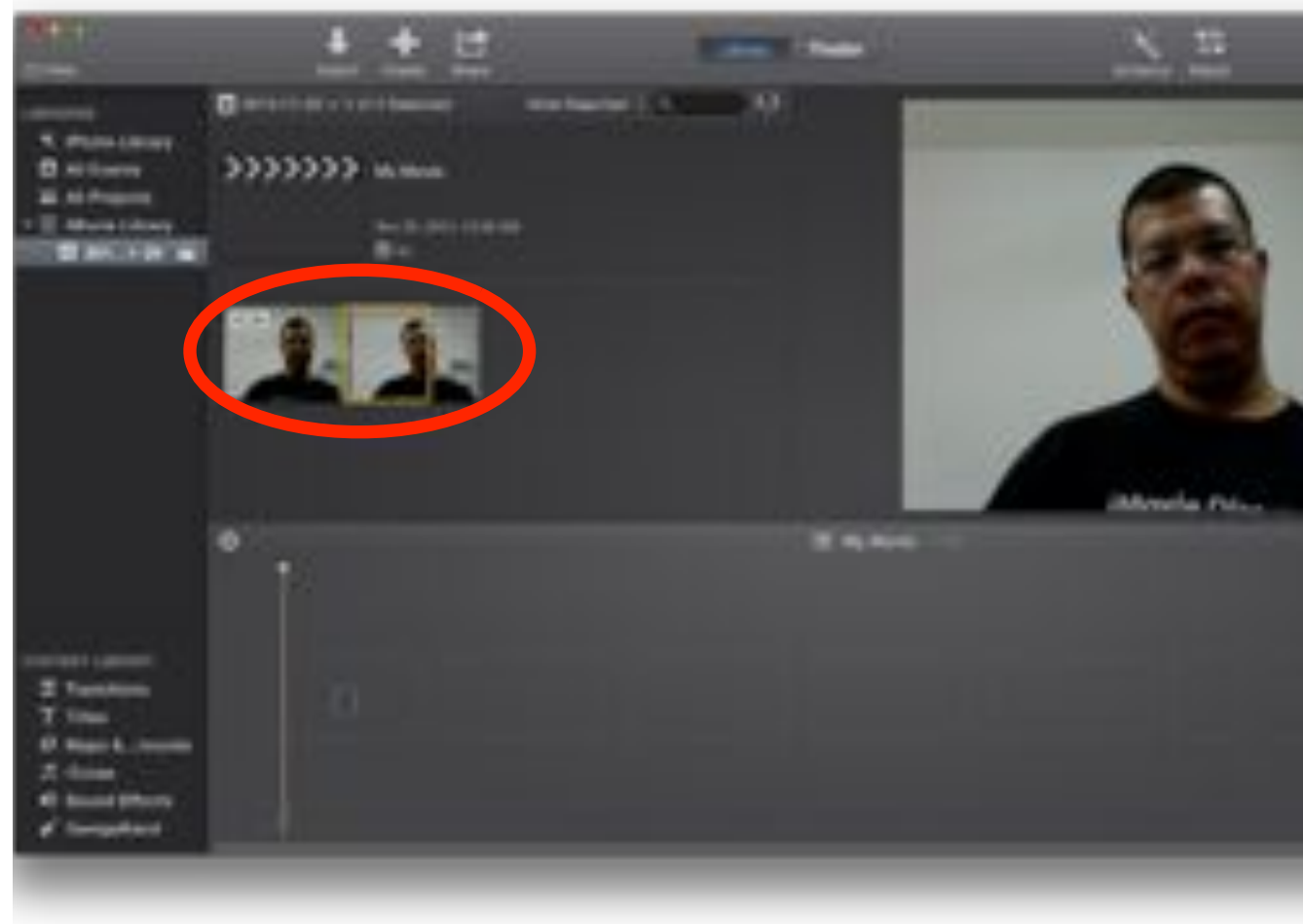


Name it My Movie and click OK.

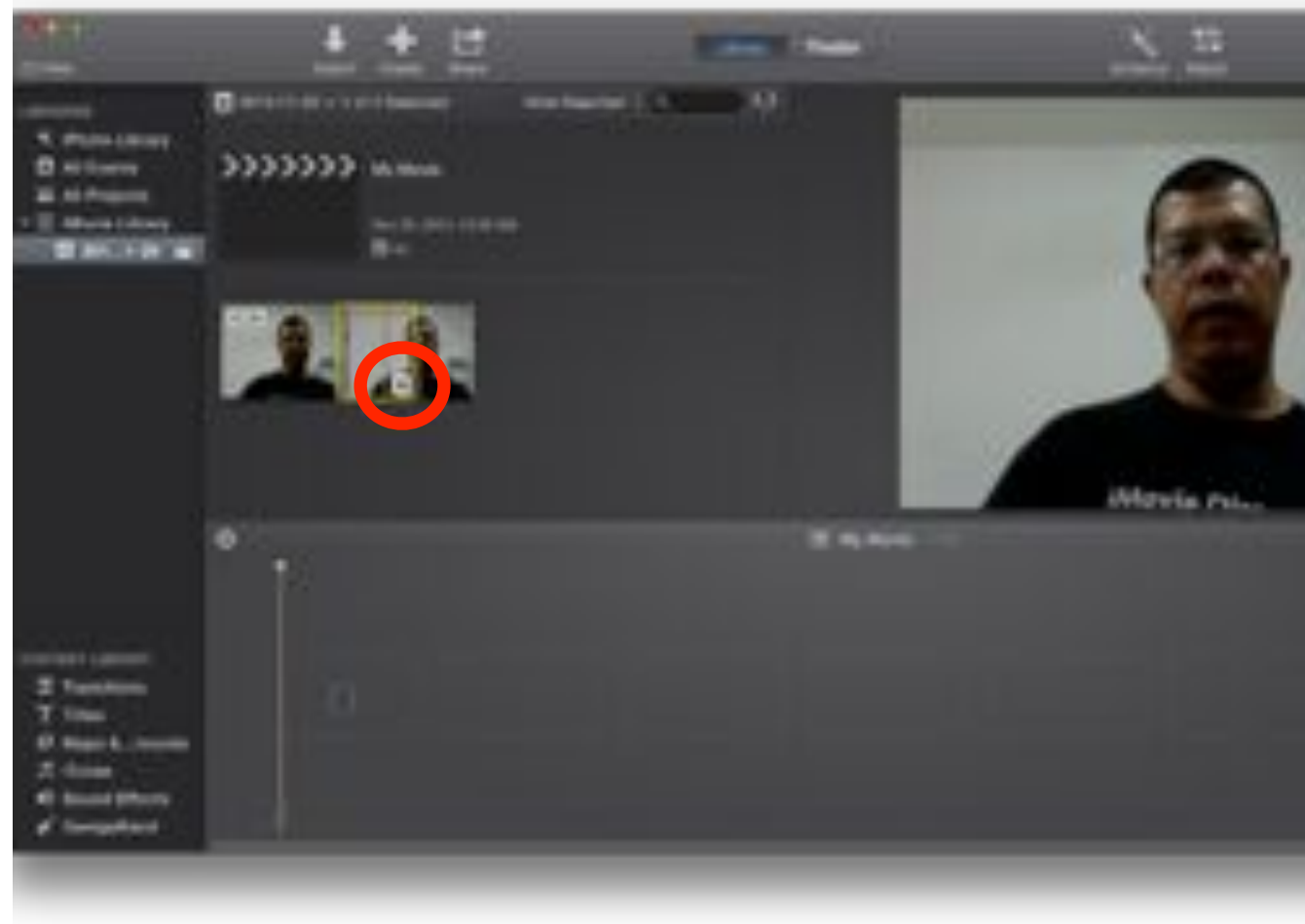




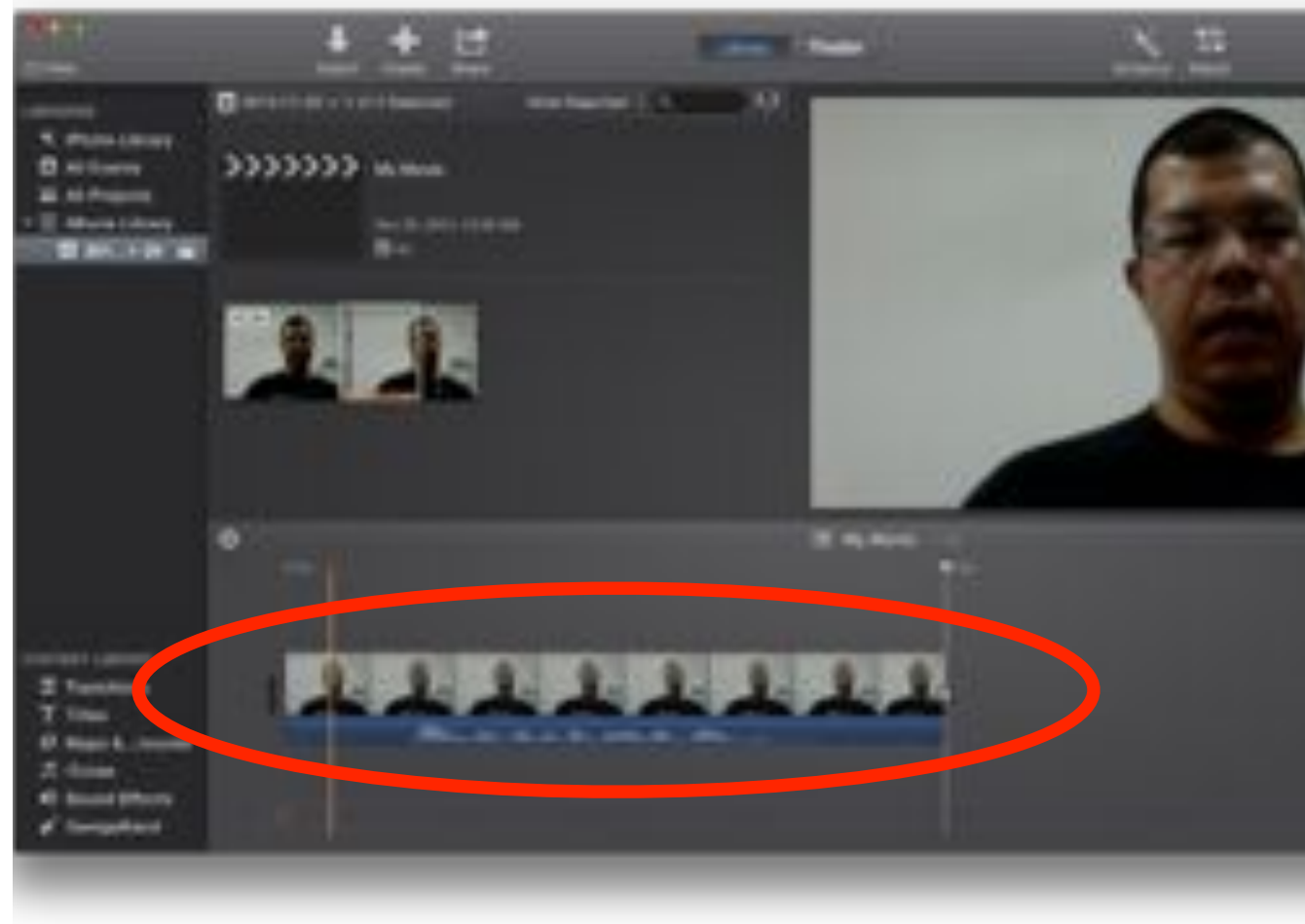
A blank movie project is created.



You can see the clip you recorded earlier. Select the whole clip or just the part you want by dragging the borders of the yellow outline with your mouse.



Click the + button to place it in the project area.



Video has been added to the project.



Click Photo Library on the top left of the screen. Double click the Desktop Pictures Event.



Add 3 pictures to the project by clicking the + button.



Adjust the zoom slider so your movie fits on the screen.



Click Transitions.





Add a transition to the spaces between each clip.



Click Titles.



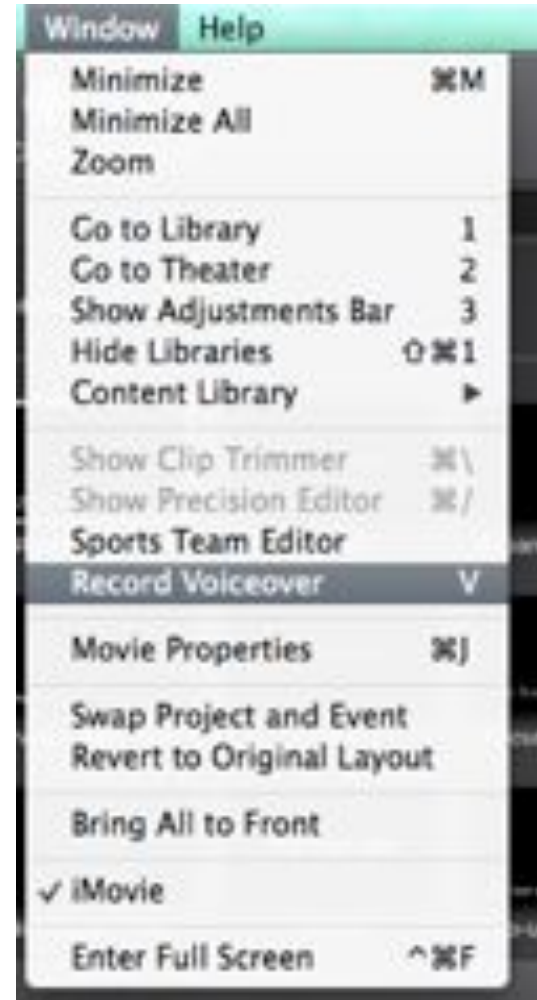
Drag the Standard Lower Third title to the first clip.



Click the title and edit the Title Text.



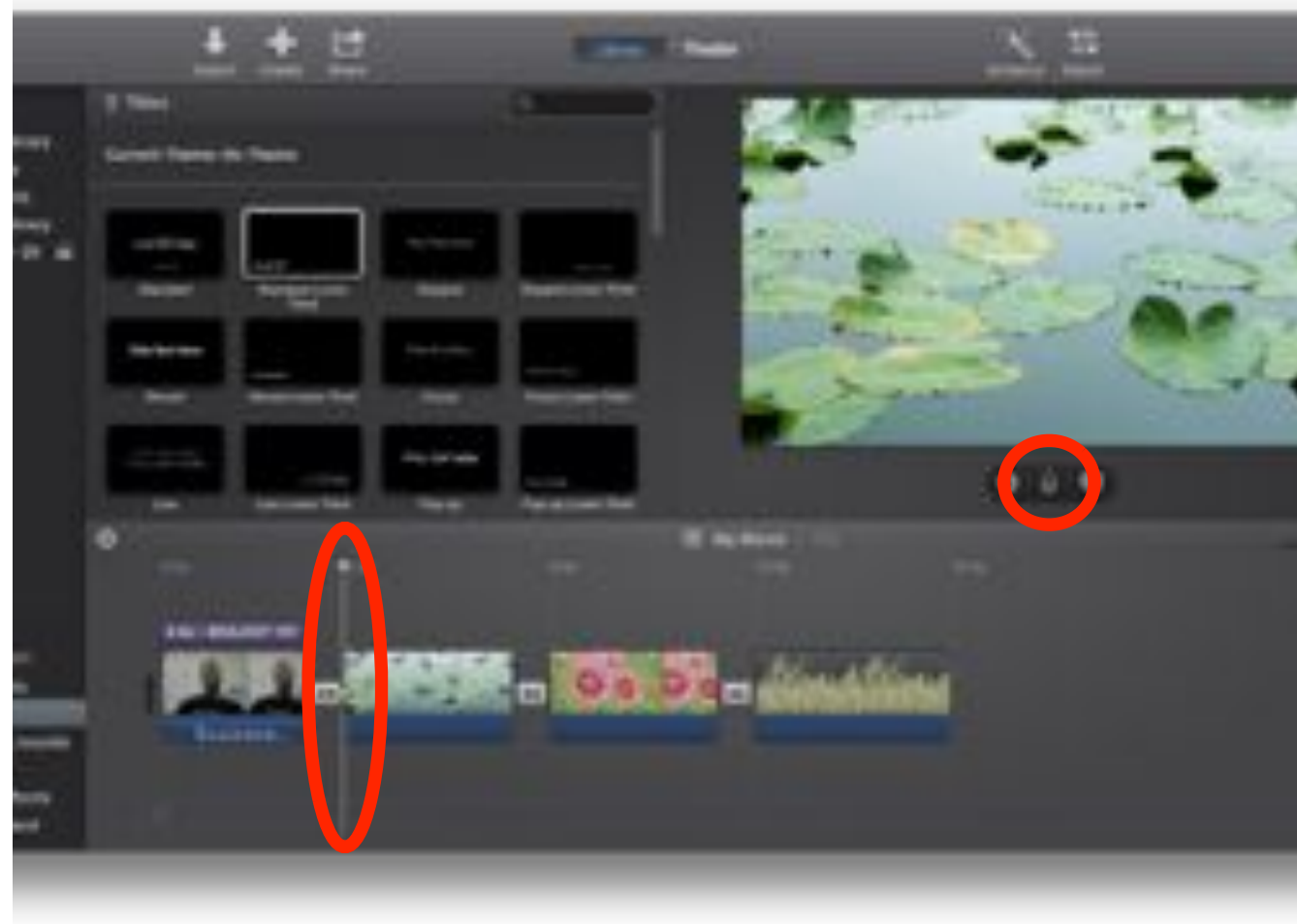
The title text has been edited.



Choose Record Voiceover from the Window menu.



The VoiceOver controls appear.



Position the playback head at the beginning of the first imported picture. Click the mike to start recording. Click the mike again to stop.

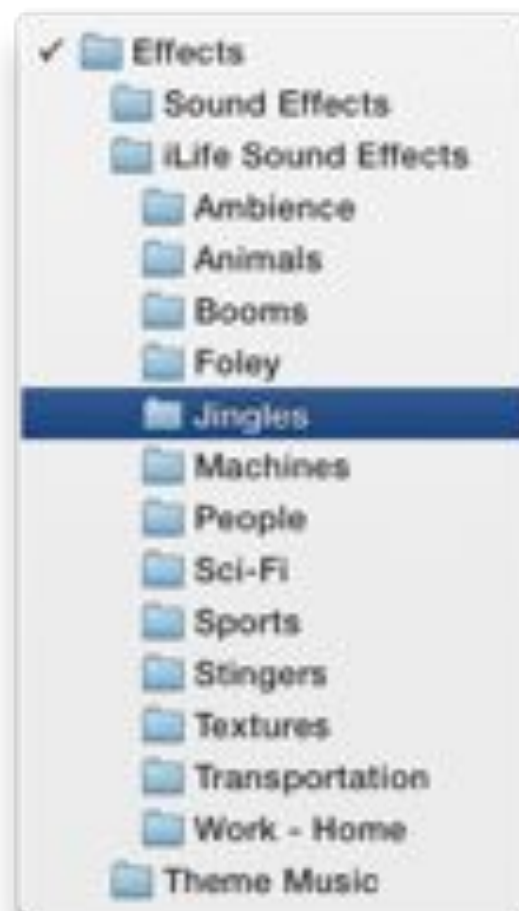




Voiceover has been added to the project.



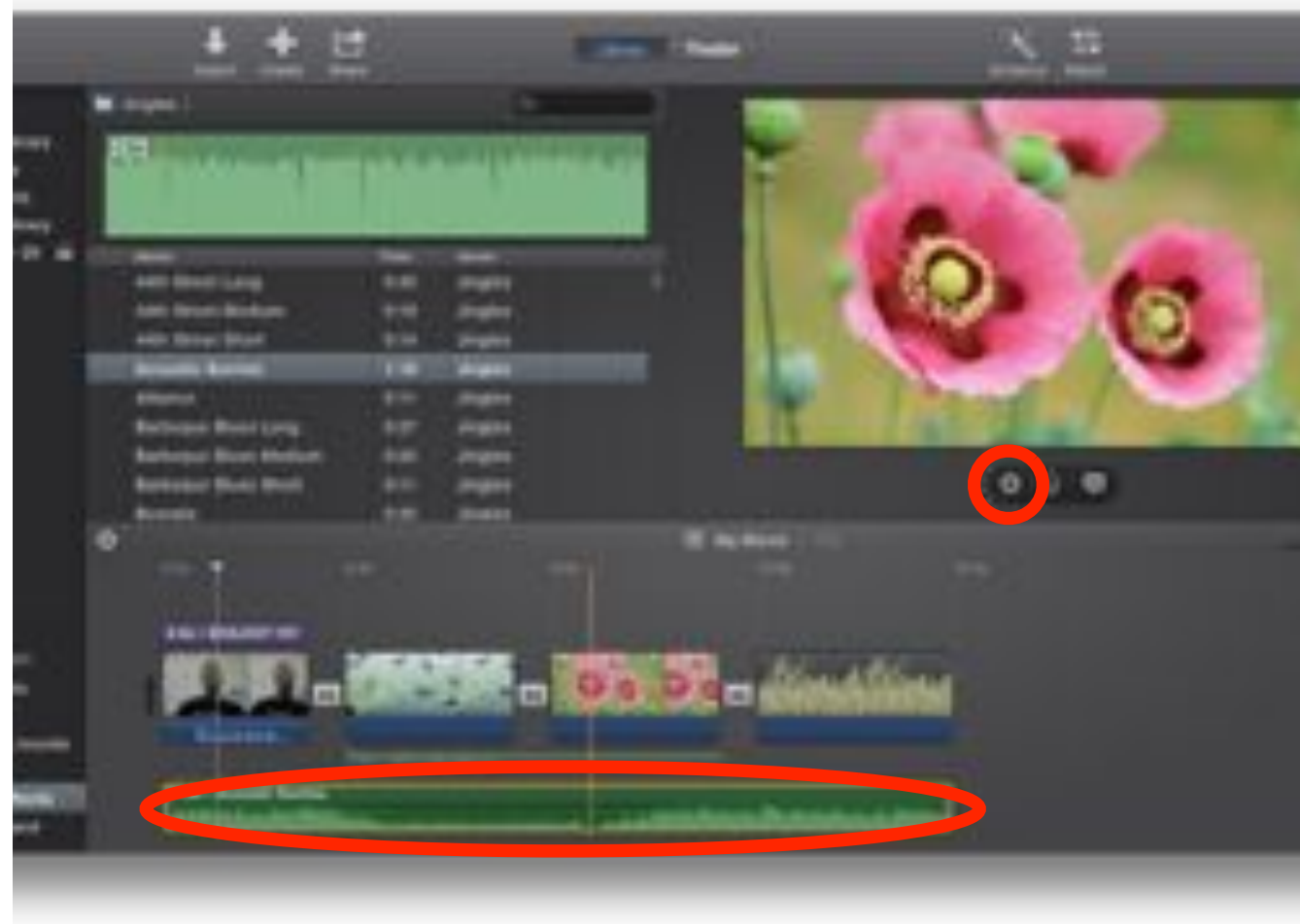
Click Sound effects.



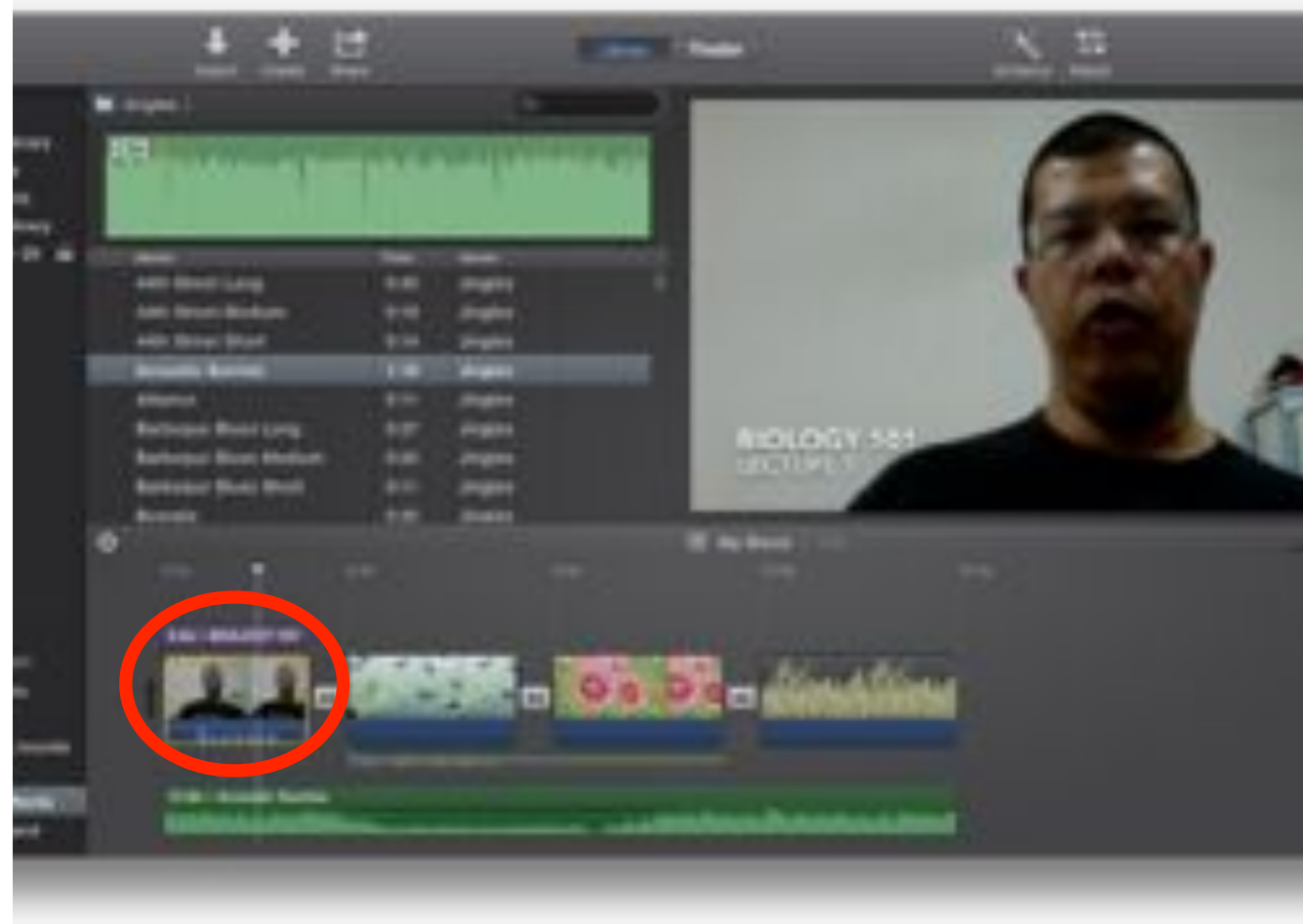
Choose Jingles from the Effects menu.



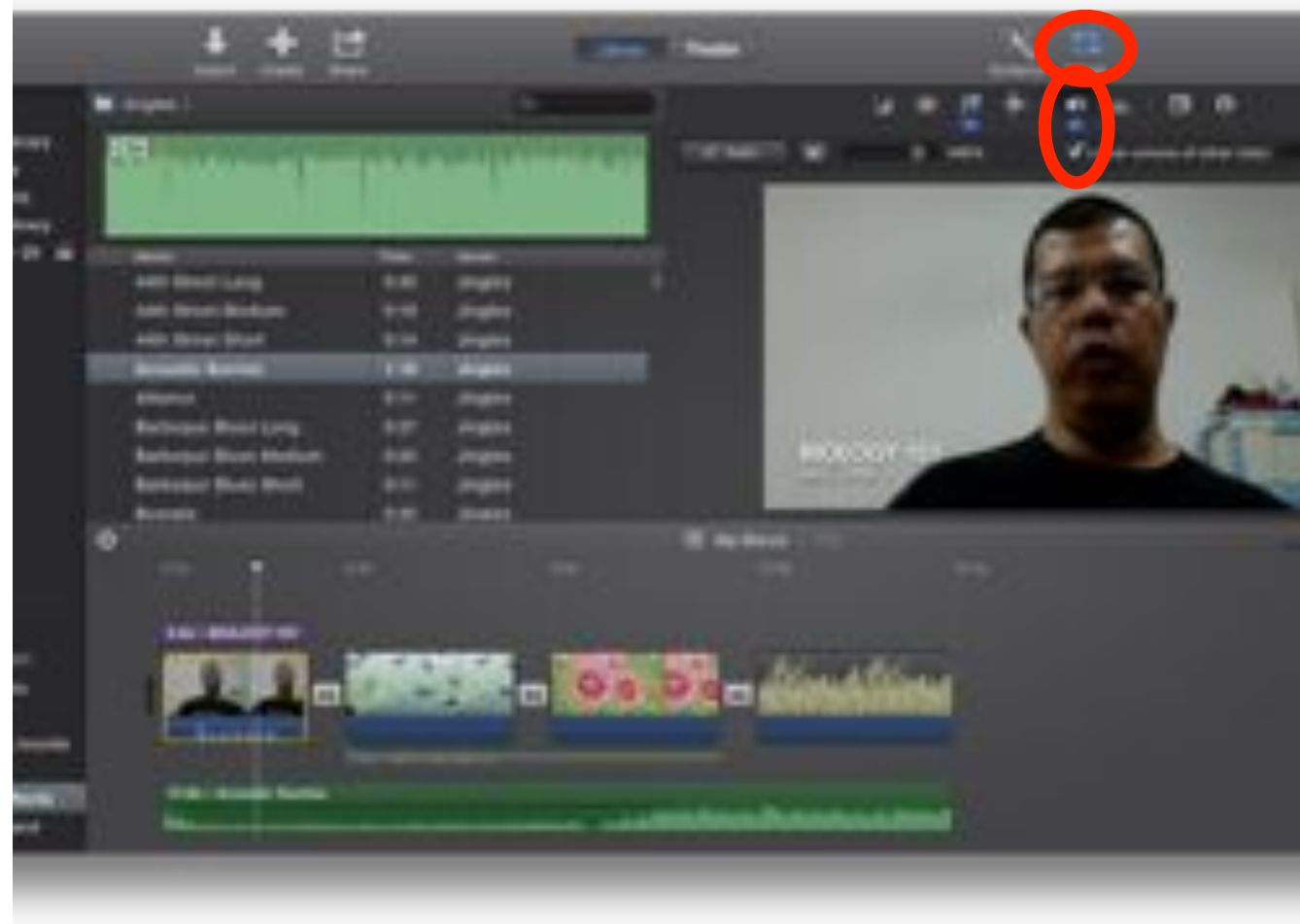
Click the play button next to a song to listen to it. Drag the one you like to the soundtrack area.



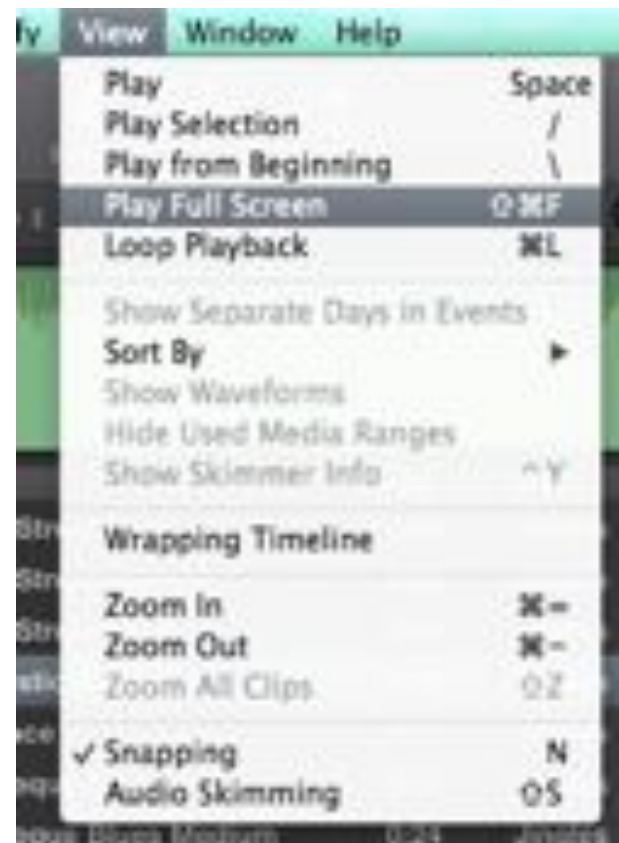
Soundtrack has been added. Dismiss the Voiceover controls by clicking on the x.



Your voice in the first clip will be much softer than the music. Click the clip to fix this.



Click the Adjust button and click the speaker. Tick Lower volume of other tracks.



Choose Play Full Screen from the View menu.

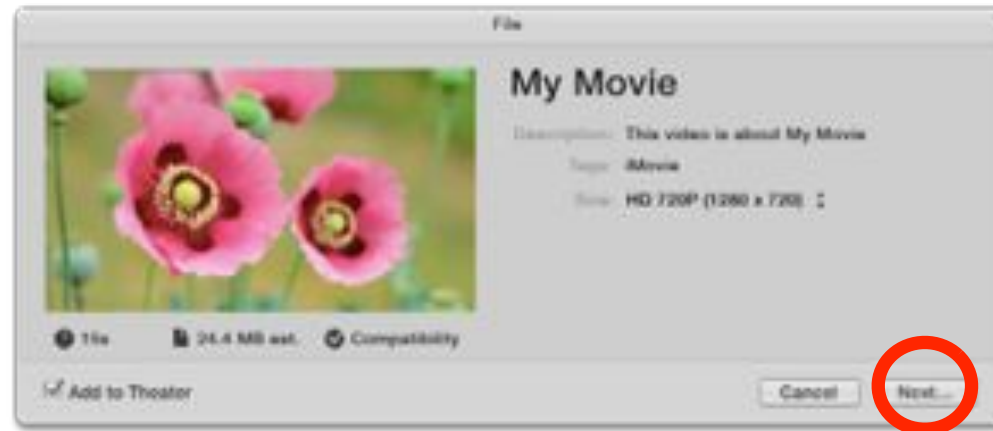




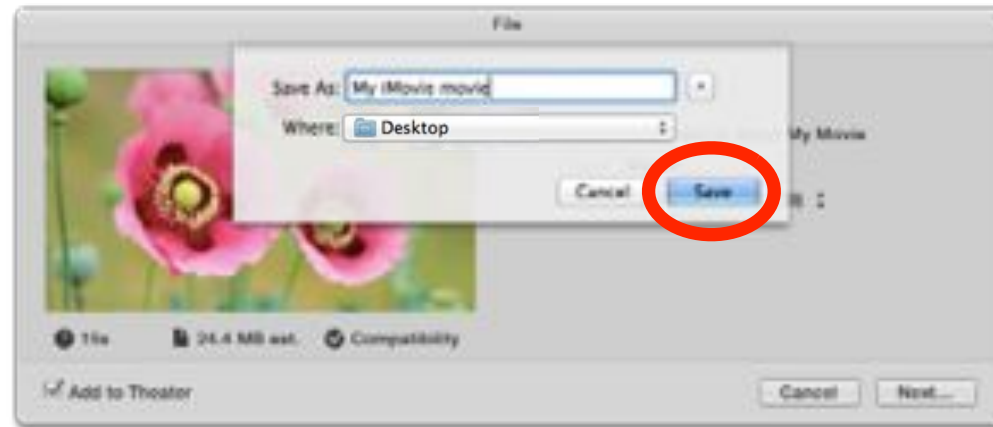
The movie plays.



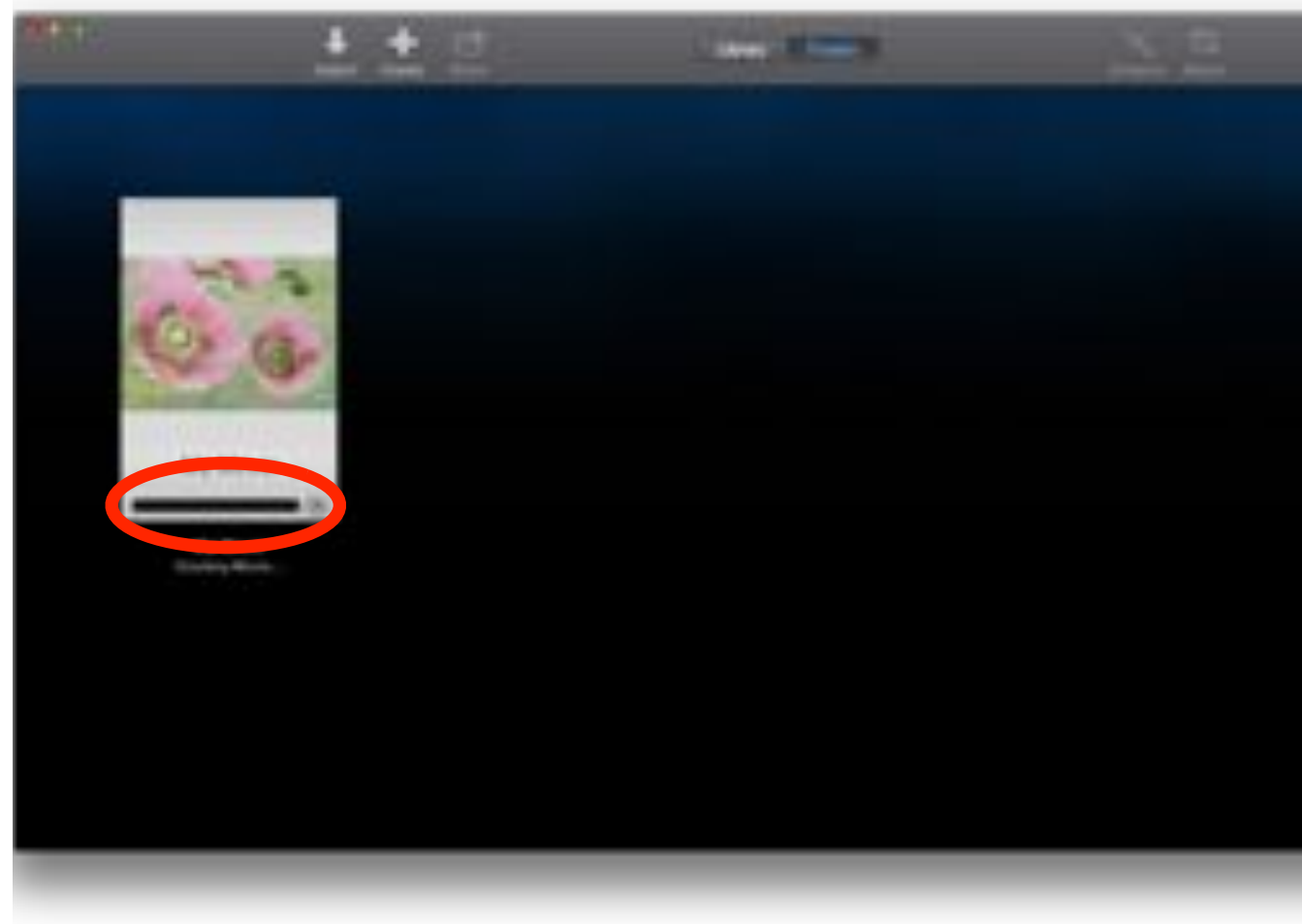
Click the Share button. Click File.



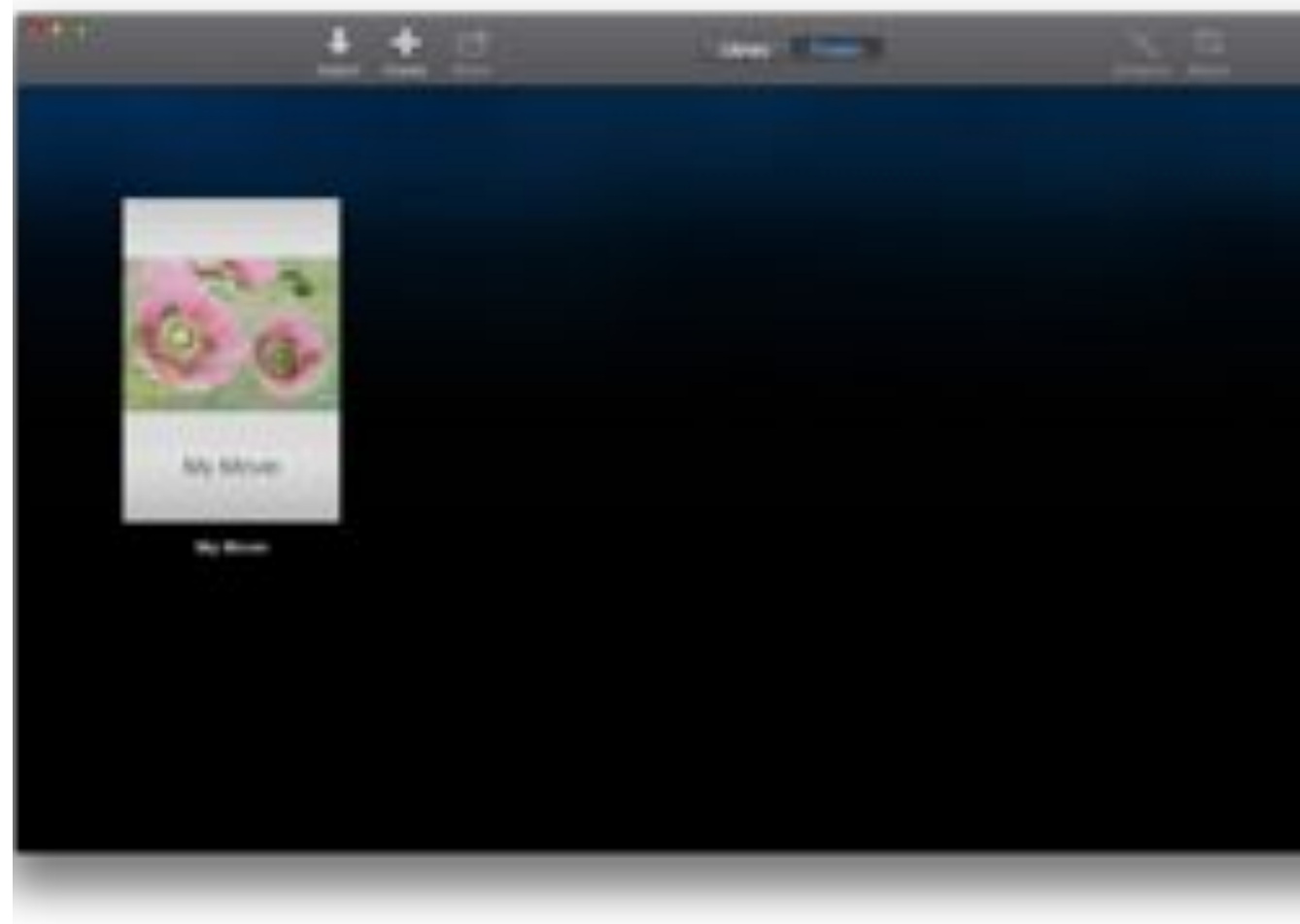
Click Next.



Save it to the Desktop folder.



Click the Theater tab. Wait for the movie to finish exporting.



When it has finished, you can play it back full screen by double clicking it.
