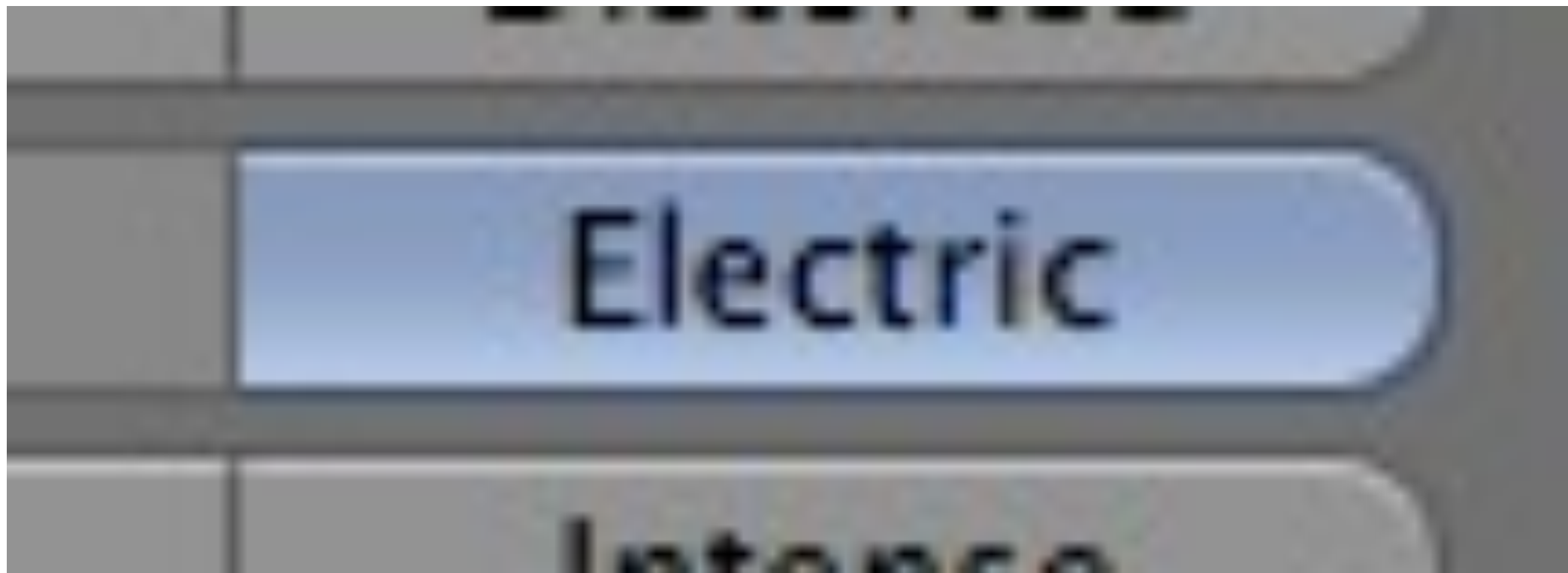
Click Create.



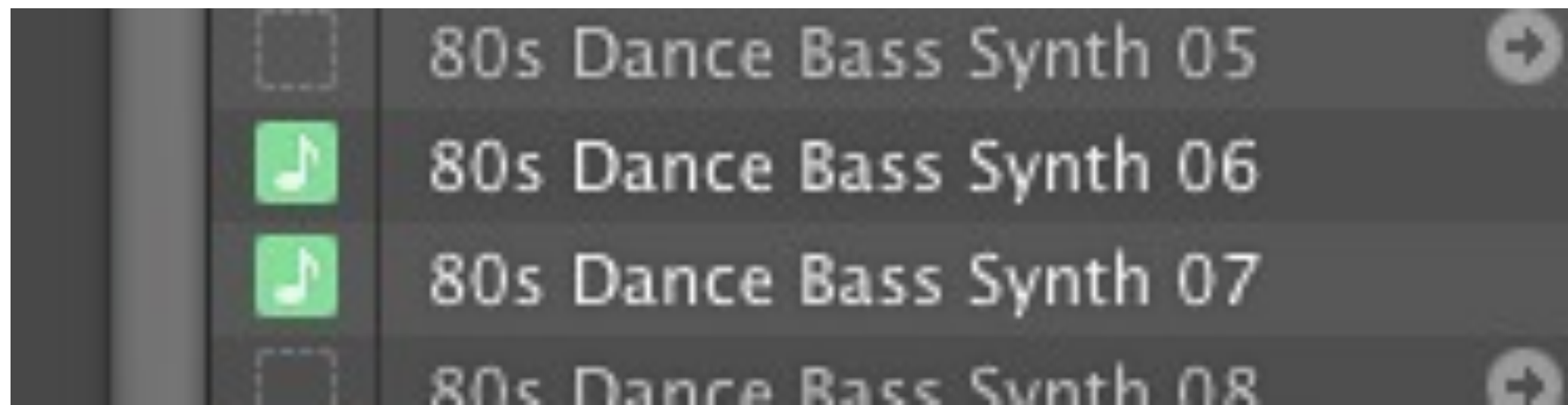
The main GarageBand window is displayed.



Click the metronome at the bottom of the viewing area so won't here a tock-tock sound while you play back the music.



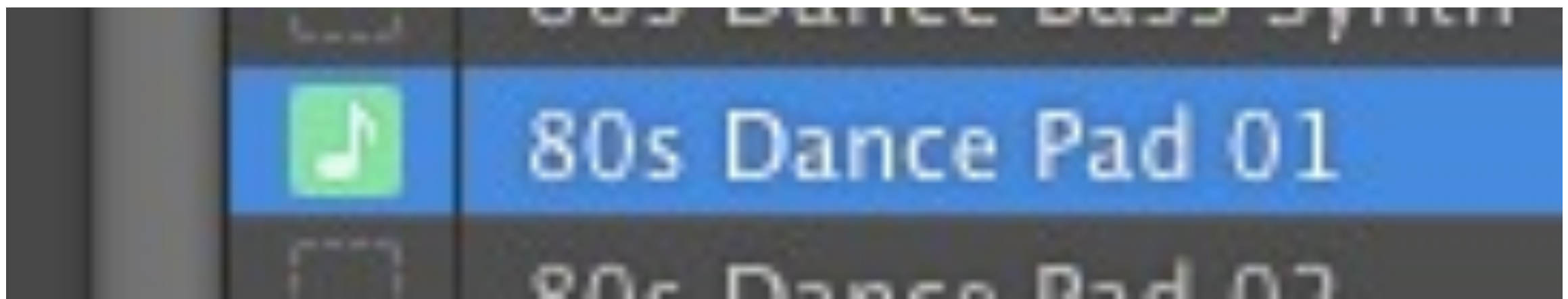
Click Electric, loops will be displayed.



Find 80s Dance Bass Synth 06 and 07 in the list.



Drag them to GarageBand to make a new track, 07 first then 06. Make sure you drag 06 to the same track as 07.



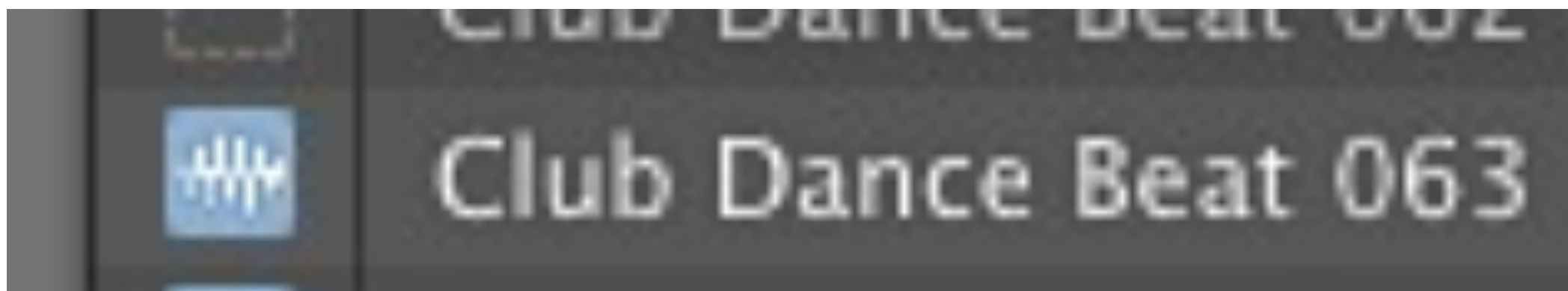
Find 80s Dance Pad 1.



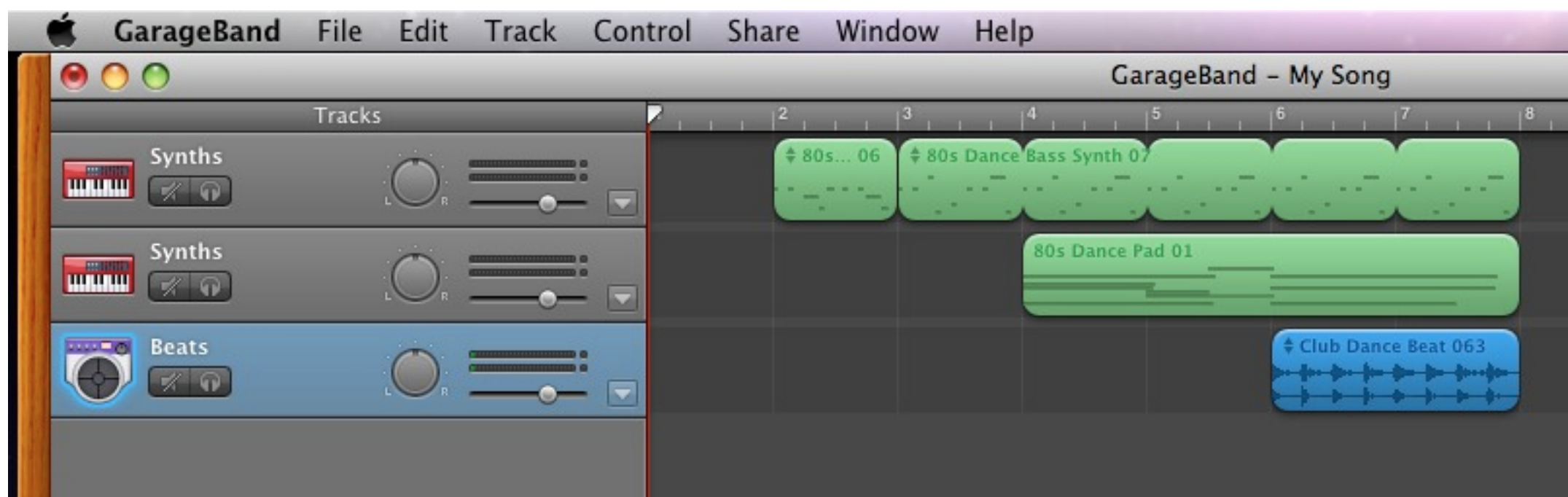
Drag that to a new track in GarageBand as shown.



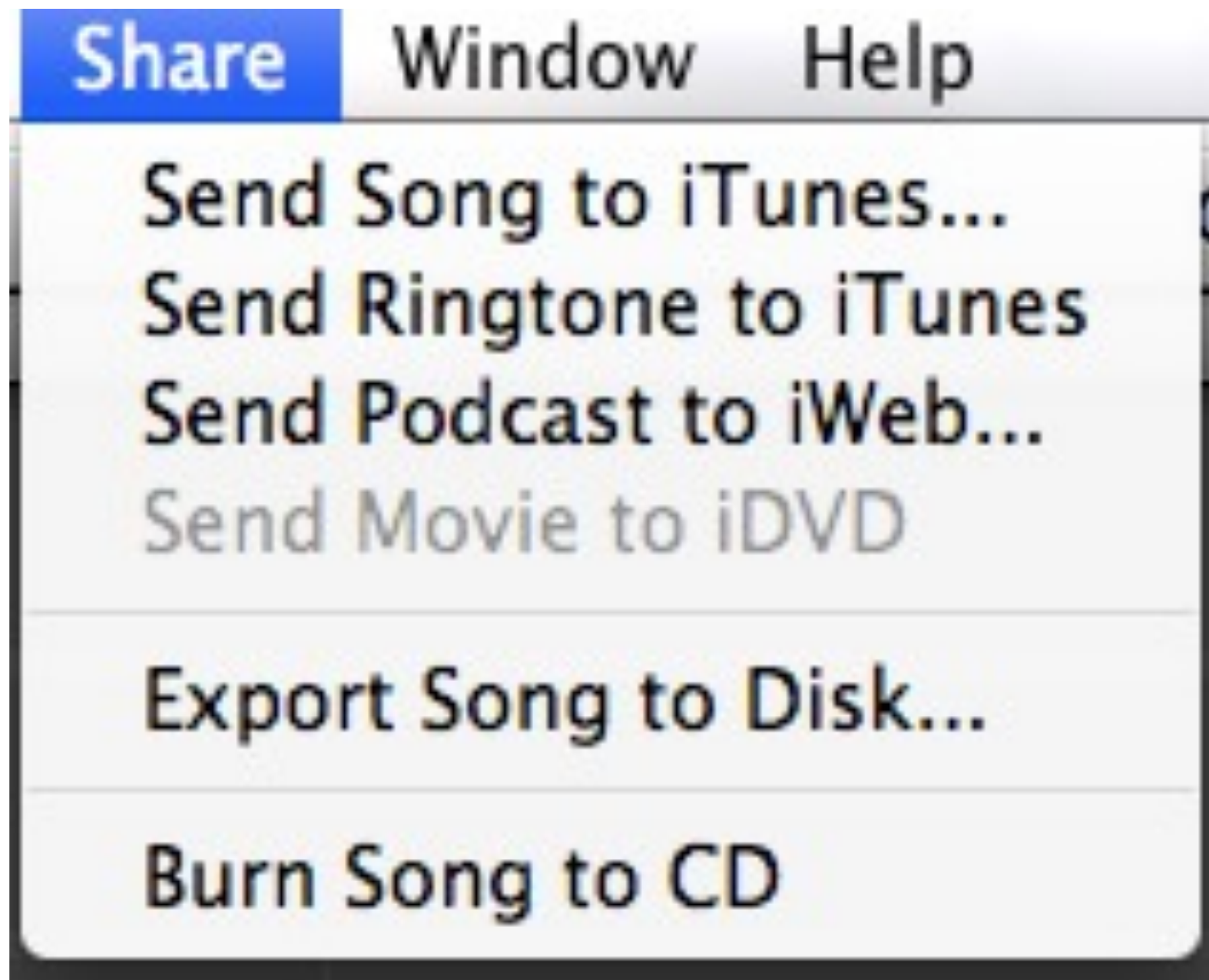
Click top right corner of Dance Bass Synth 06 and drag to the right until it is at the same point as Dance Pad 01.



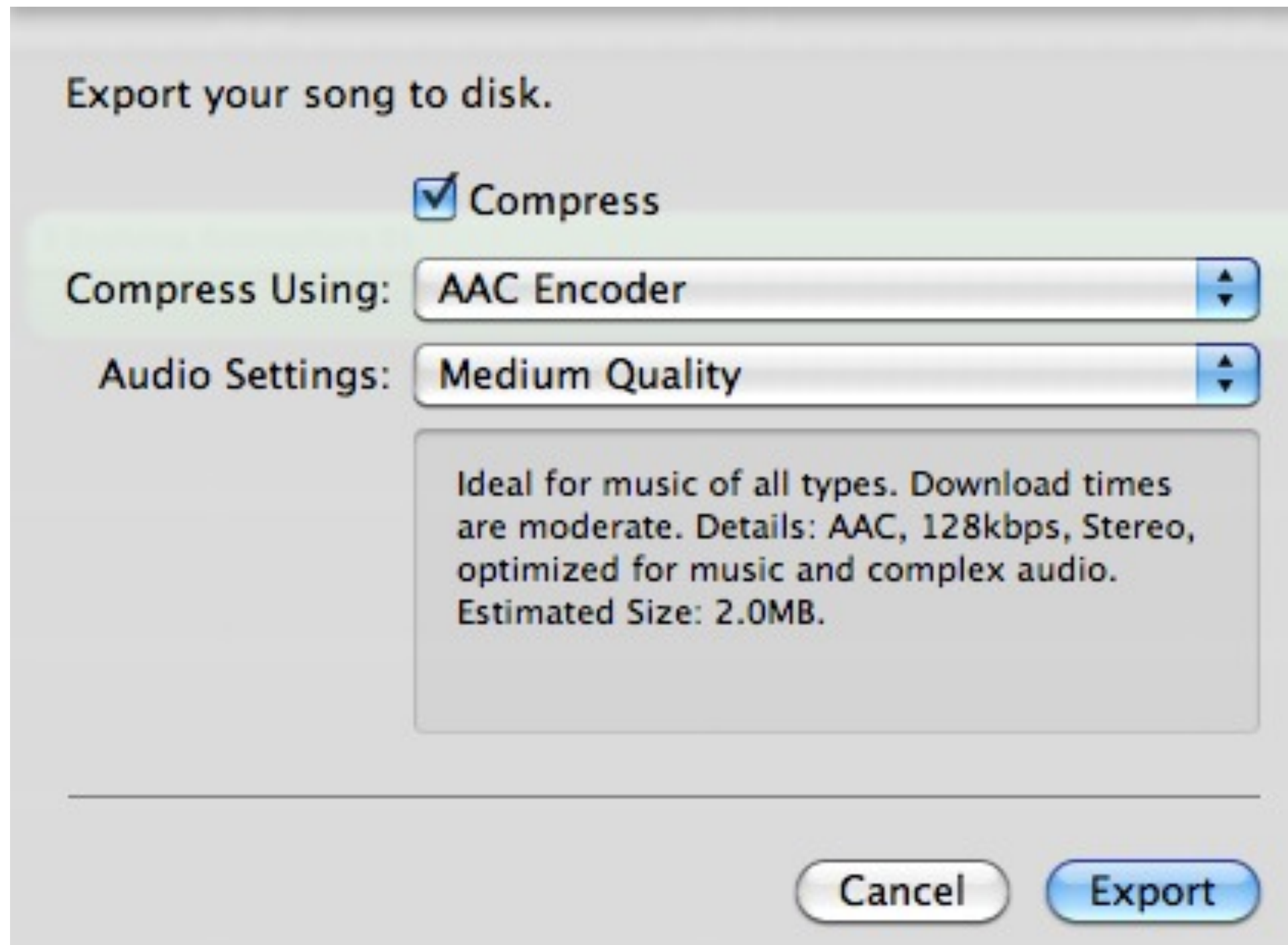
Find Club Dance Beat 063.



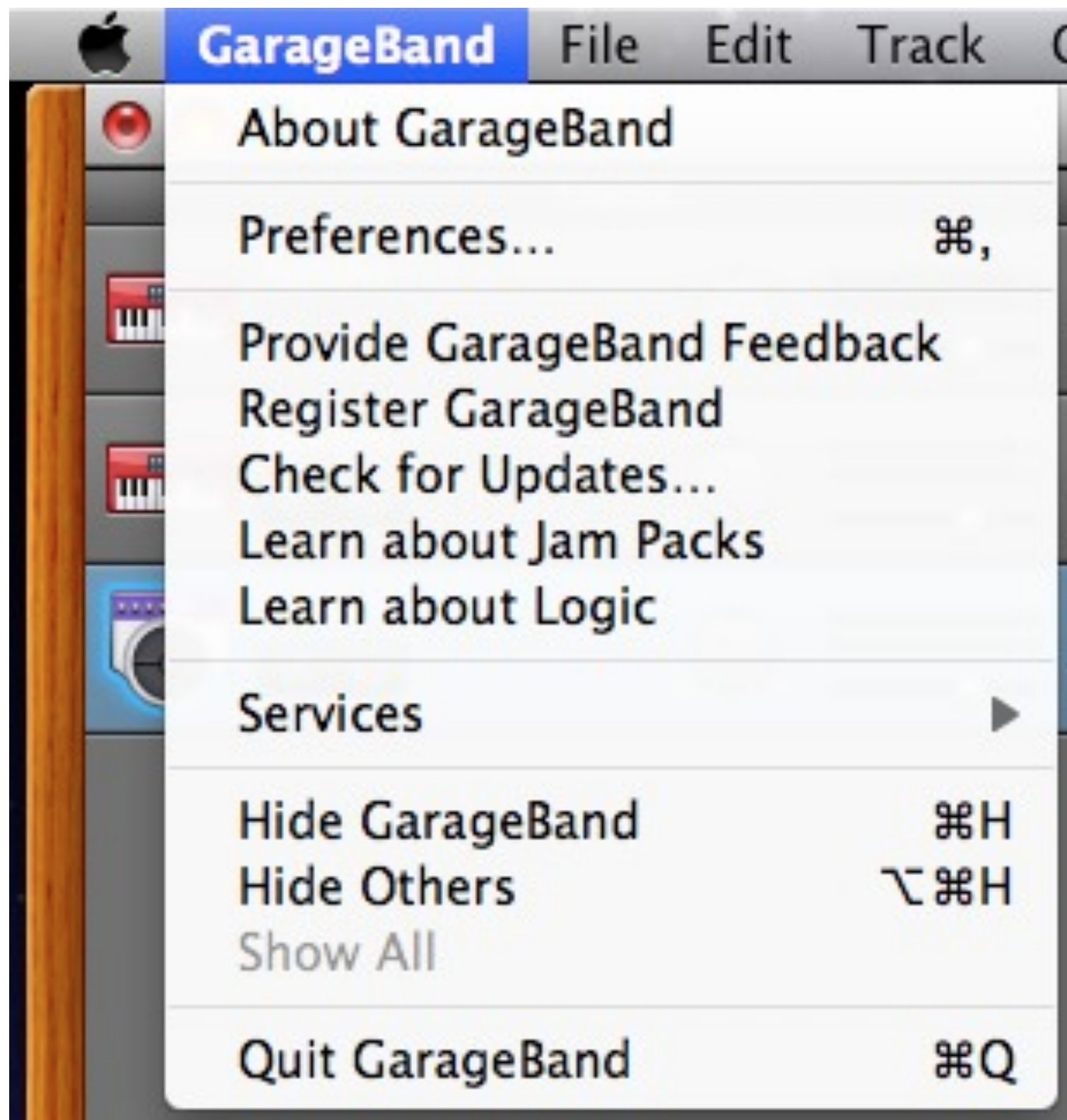
Drag it to a third track. You can rewind and play it.



Choose Export Song to Disk... from the Share menu.



Click Export and save it to the Desktop. You now have a song you can copy to your phone as a ringtone.



Choose Quit from the GarageBand menu.



Click Save.

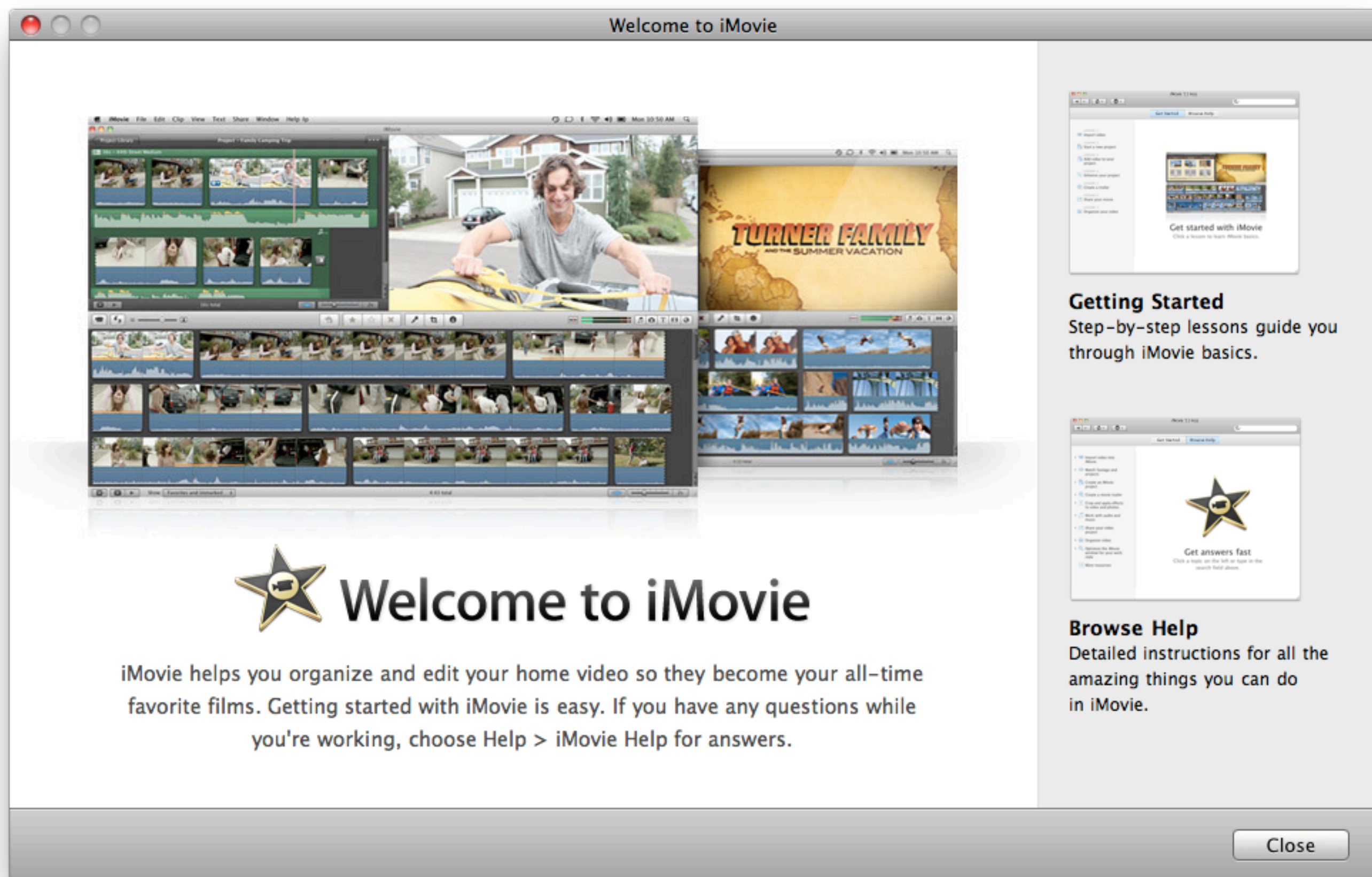

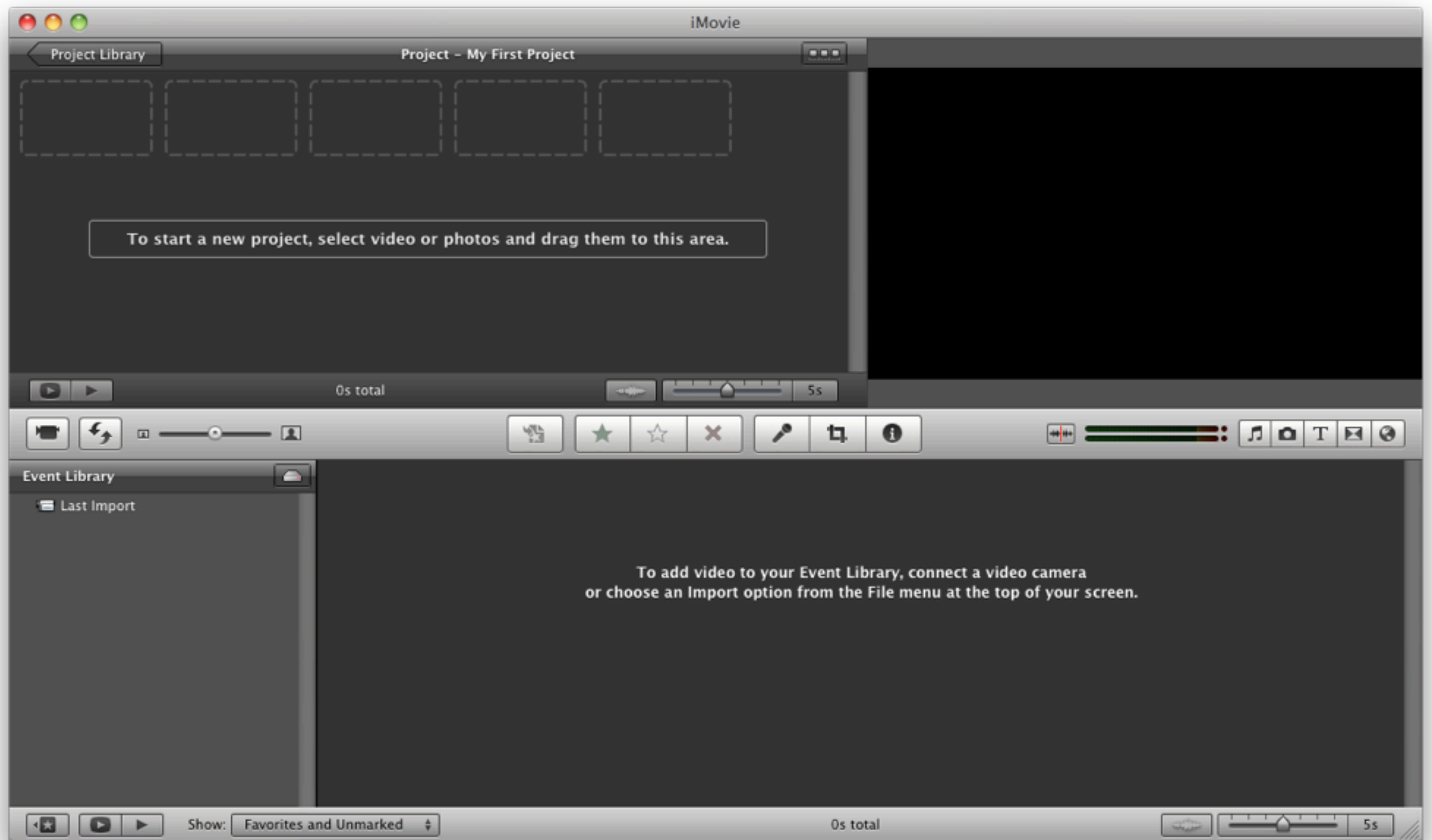
iMovie

Click on Camera icon.

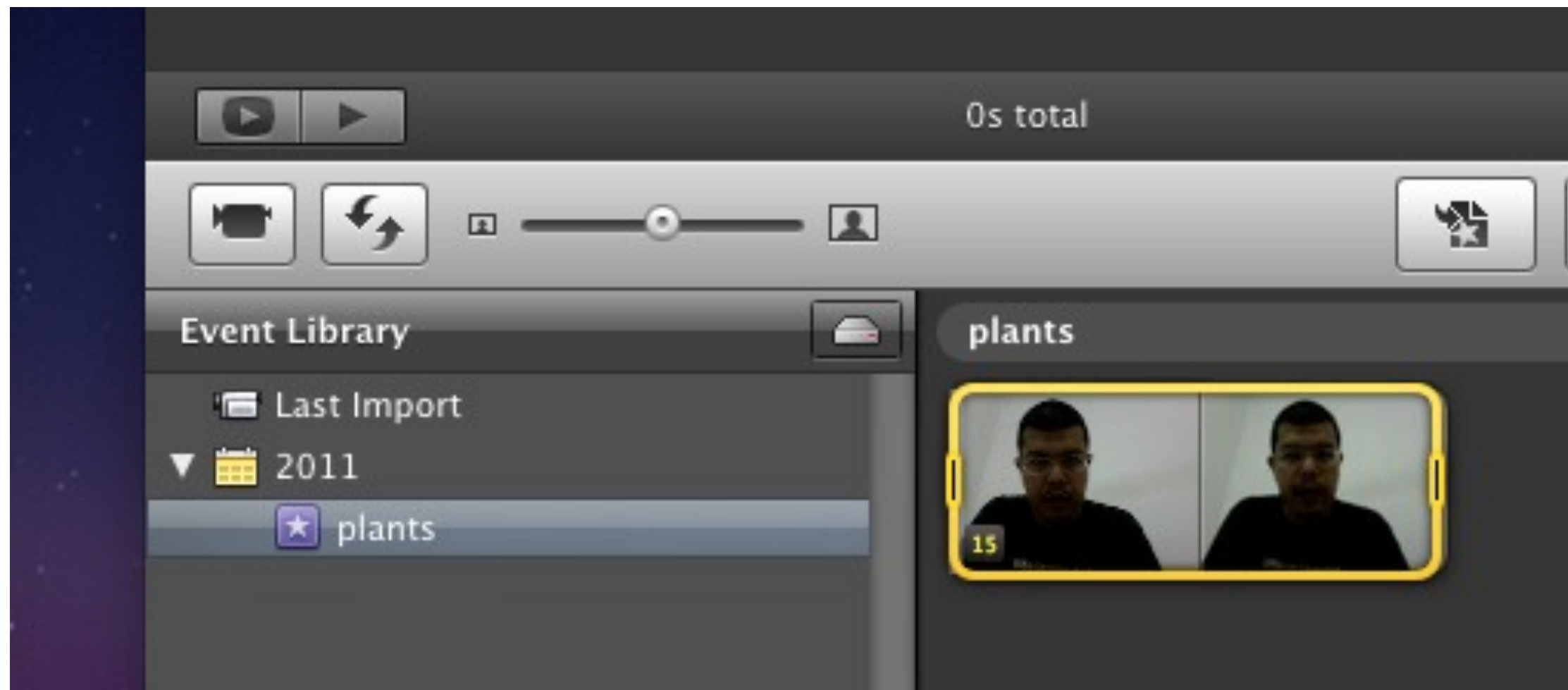
Selecting this option will analyze all clips for stabilization, but will result in longer import times.

Cancel Capture

Choose Create new Event and click Capture. You can change the event name if you wish.



Say "Hi, my name is (name) and i'd like to talk about plants". Click Done.



The video has been captured, press the space bar to play it.
Select the whole clip or just the part you want.
Drag the selected part to the project area.

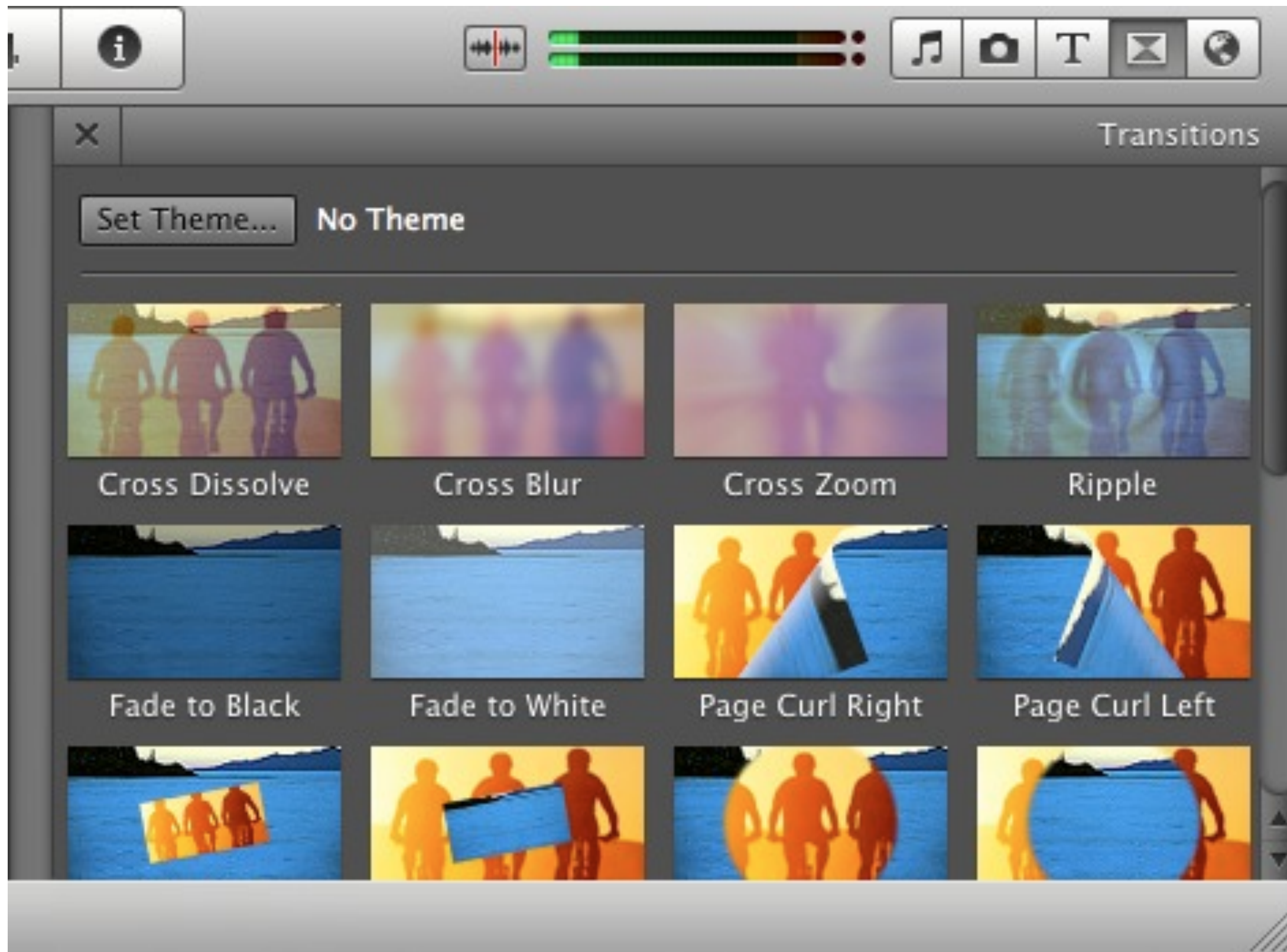

Click Photos tab.



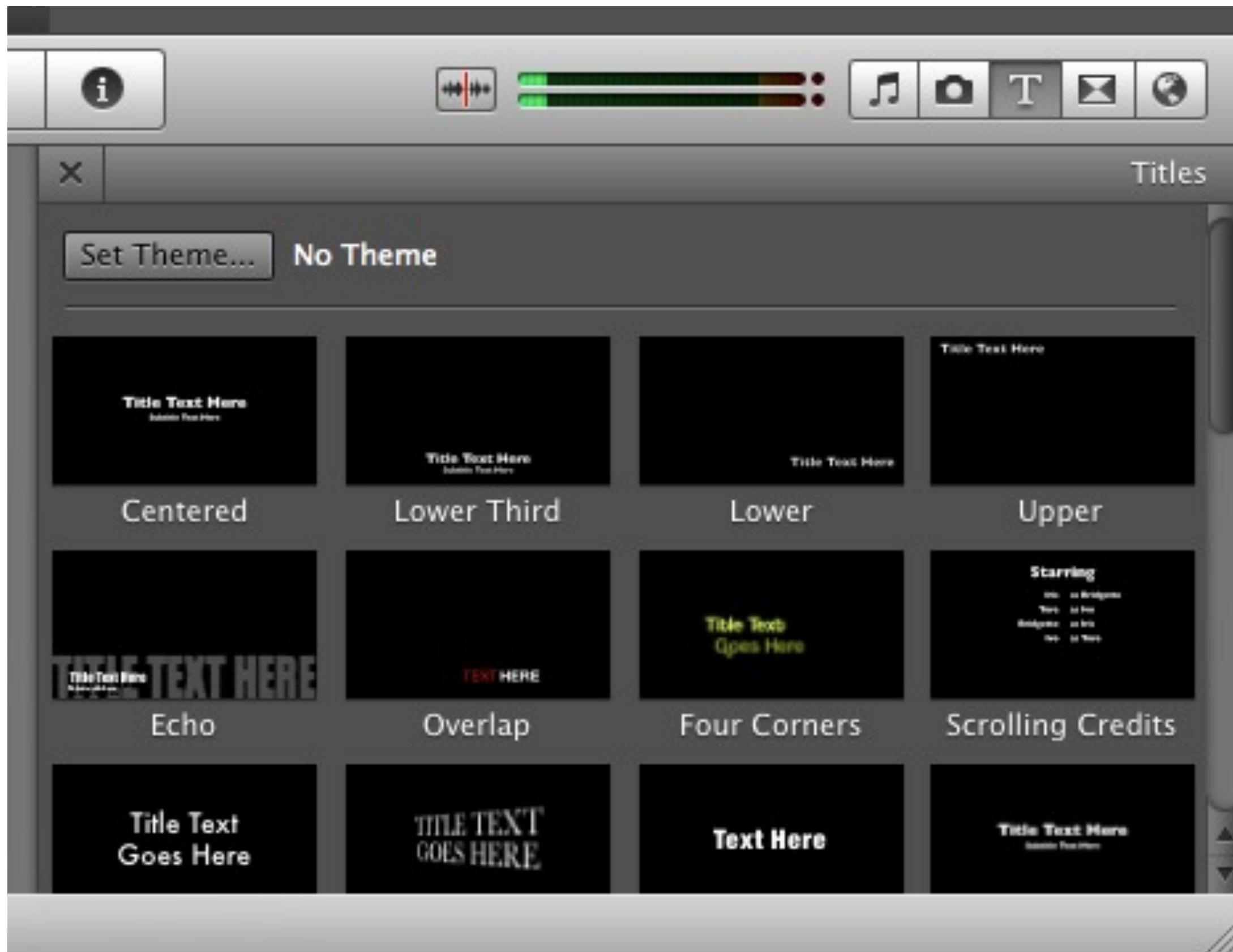
Drag at least 3 photos to project area.



Click Transitions.



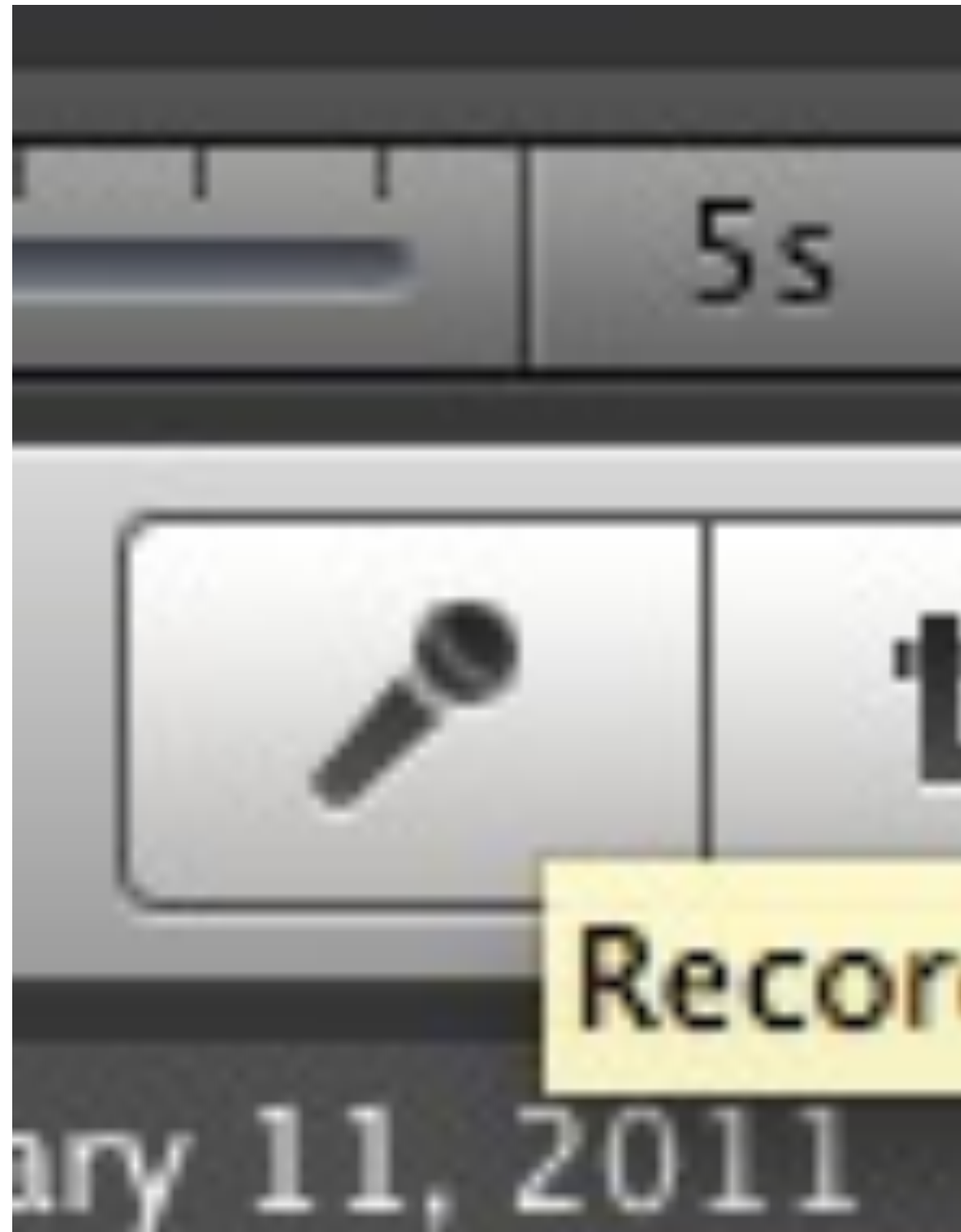
Drag transitions between each clip.



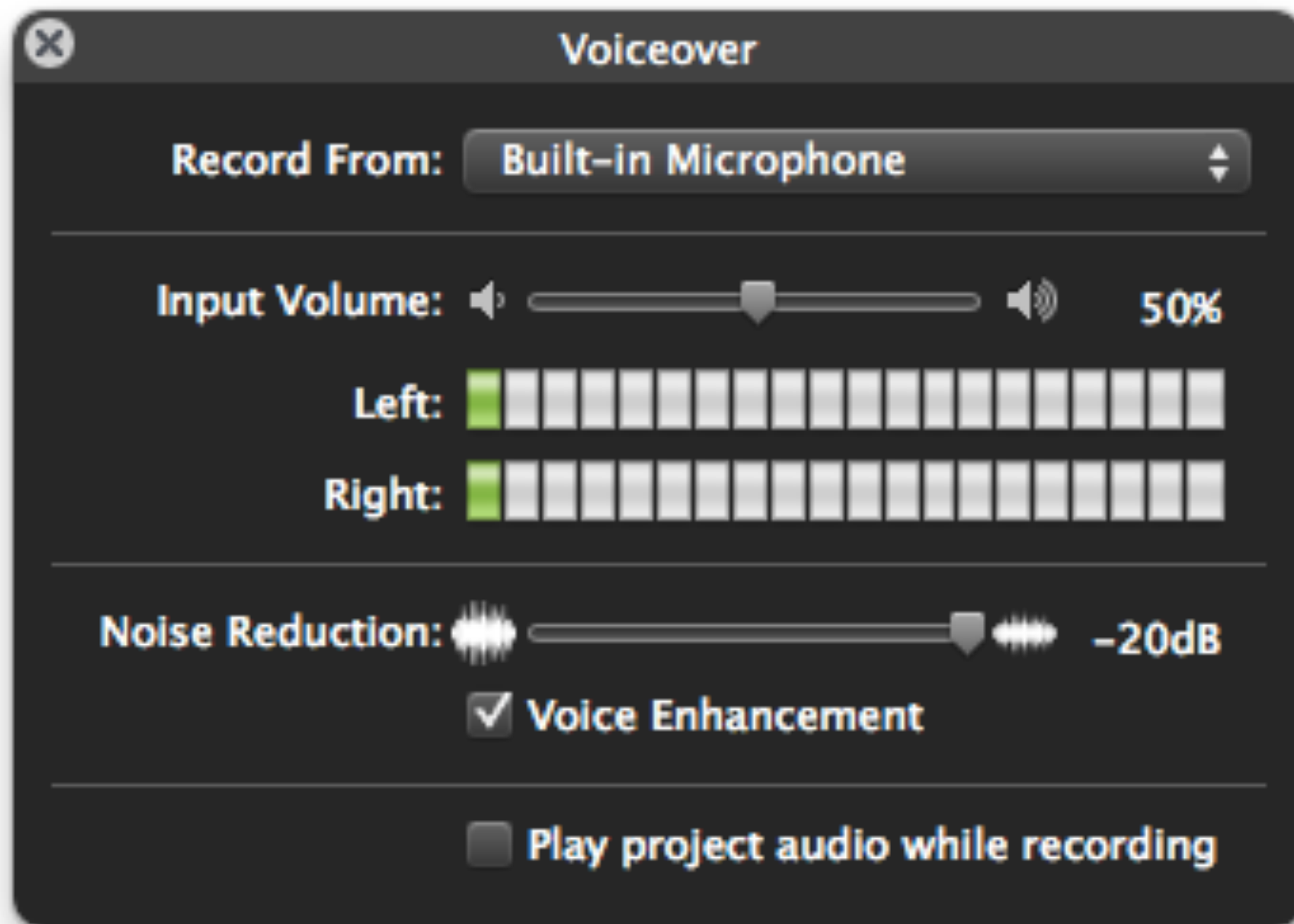
Click Titles.



Drag a title you like to the first clip and change the text as required.



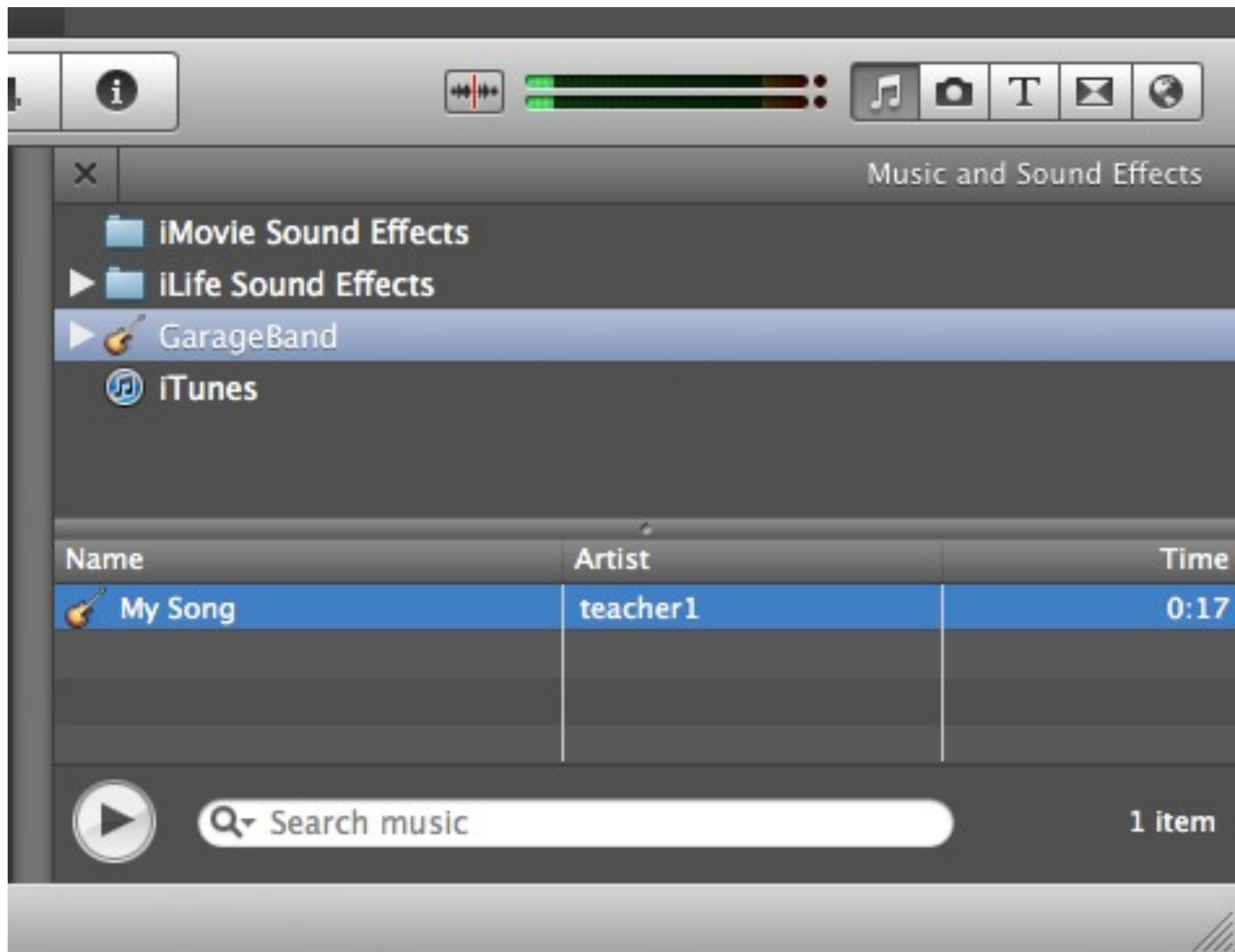
Click the microphone.



Check to see that it is recording properly, click on a clip to start recording.



Click again to stop, it appears as purple box.



Click Music, Click GarageBand.



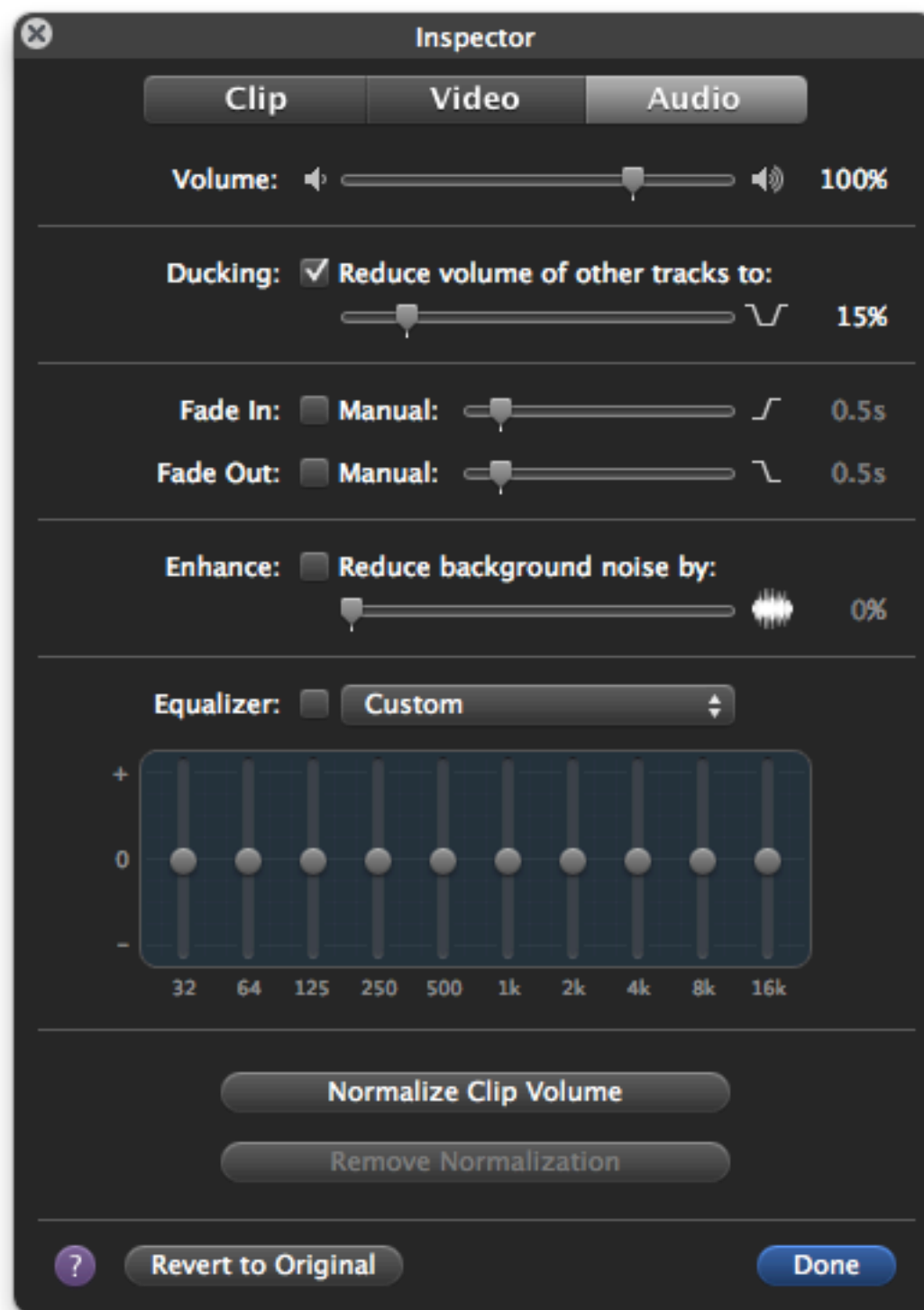
Drag the song you made earlier to the project. It appears as green block.



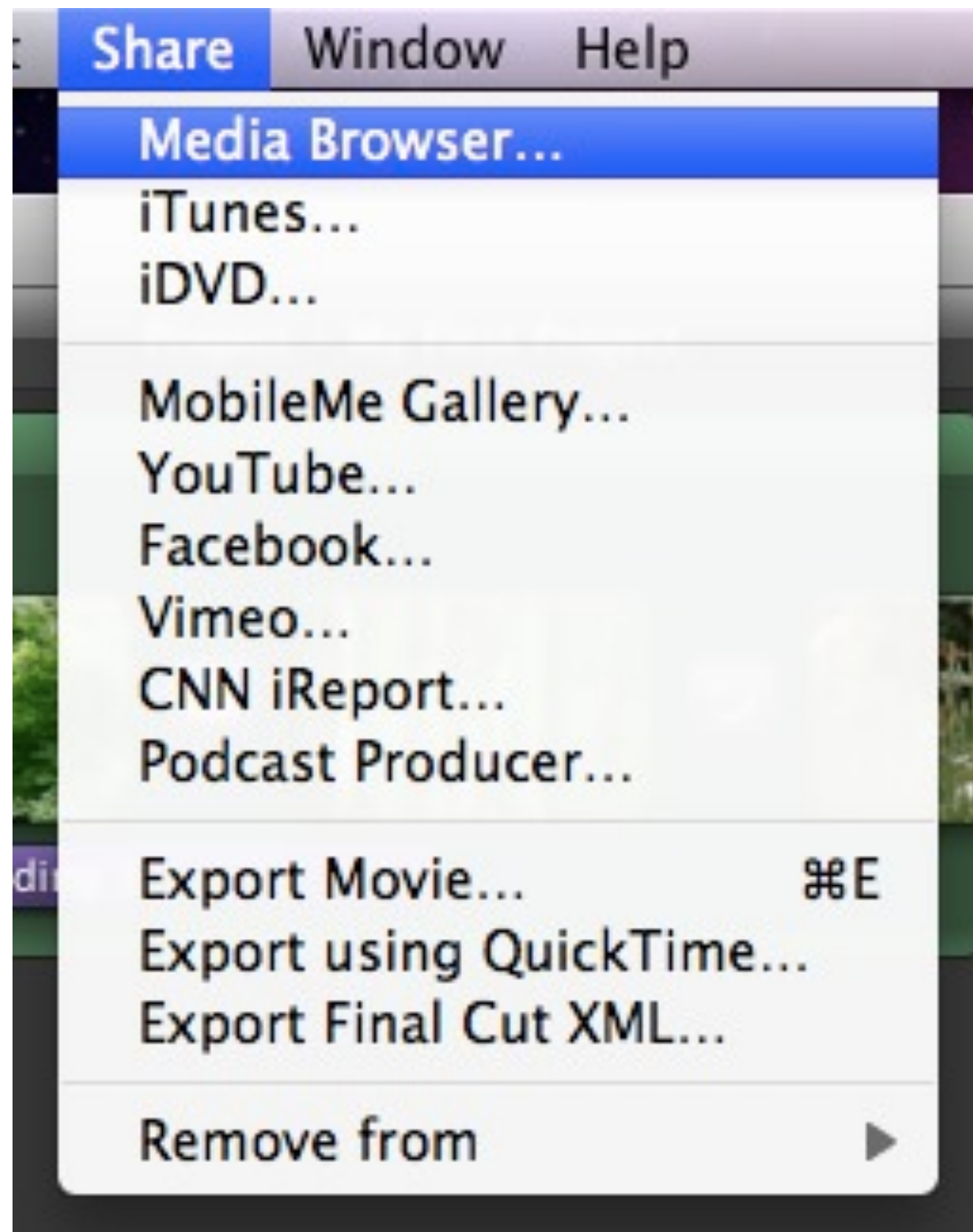
Your voice in the first clip will be much softer than the music. Click the clip to fix this.



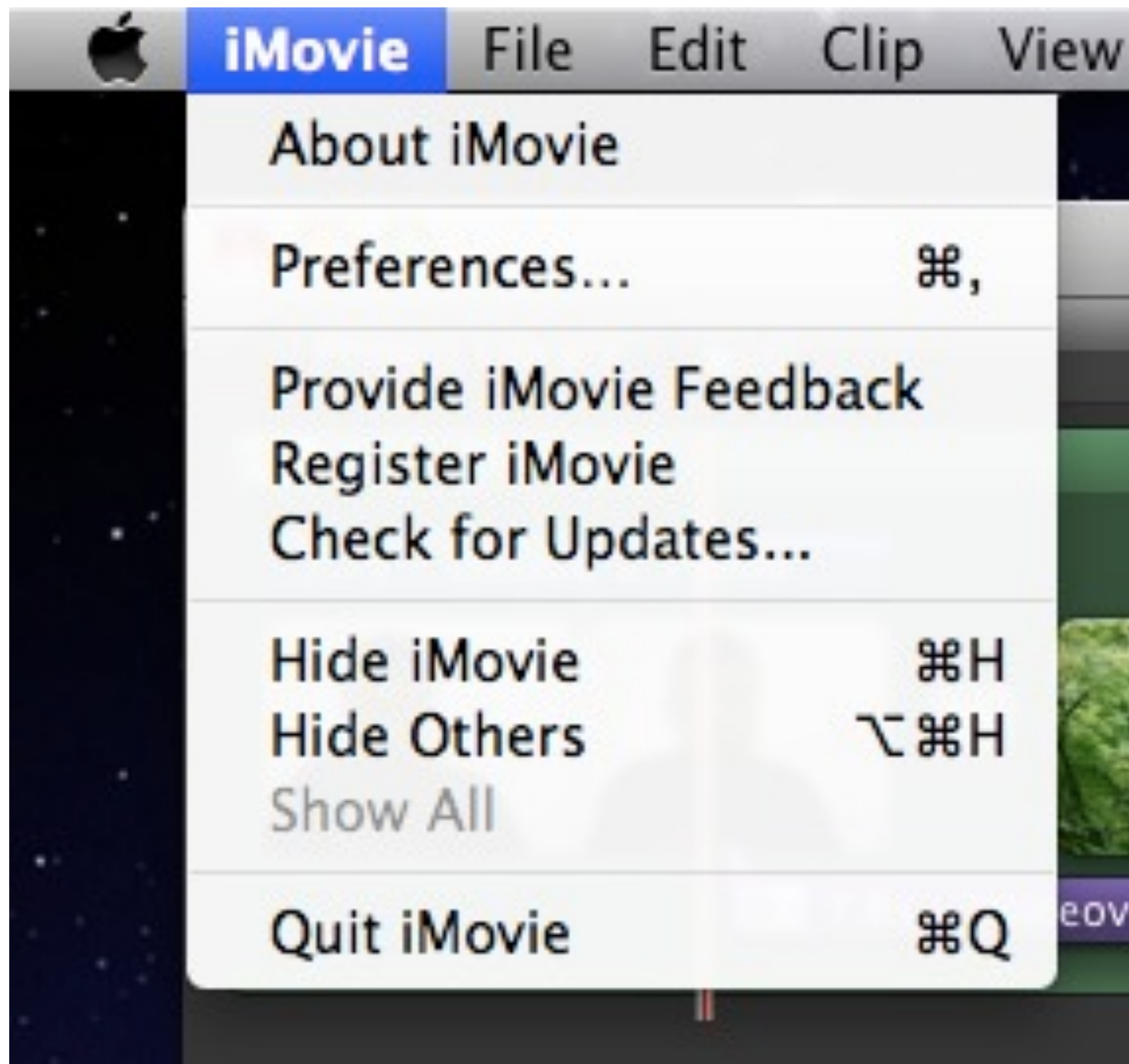
Click on the i button.



Choose the Audio tab and tick Ducking.



Choose Media Browser from the Share menu, you can export to various formats.



Quit iMovie when done.
