Focus Area: Classroom Management

Abstract: In this session teachers will learn specific strategies that integrate knowledge and skills to develop classroom management systems while developing personal relationships with students. Teachers will be able to implement strategies immediately using engaging activities and promoting critical thinking while maintaining an effective learning environment.

Title: Multiple Avenues: One Destination

Abstract: Teachers will explore a variety of differentiated strategies that can be implemented in a rigorous classroom environment. The participants will discuss ways to use flexible grouping, choice boards, and stations to create a differentiated environment. The participants will create activities using advance organizers, graphic organizers, and questioning techniques. These tiered activities will increase student engagement and individual student success. This session will provide educators with strategies and concepts that will help them immediately create and implement differentiated activities in their classrooms.
