

There are so many internet dating sites around like RSVP, Match.com, Matchfinder ect we have started to get away from the real world. With the average household size declining from 2.6 people per house hold down to 2.2 people and the ever increasing number of singles in the next 15 years, my concept is to convert this area into a real life 'dating site'.

The site is in Surry Hills and the demographics show that more than half (52%) are between the ages of 20 – 39 and are unmarried. My concept is to target these young singles to make a place for them to meet and interact with other real singles.

The idea is that singles come to this area and live to find a partner and over the time of 2 to 5 years when they have found this partner and have gotten to know each other well. They move out and start a new life together, making room for new singles to come in and mingle.

The concept is to consist of 10 unit blocks each housing 44 units. Each of these units is 28sqm and is 2 stories they will have their own personal space of a bedroom, bathroom and living room and be in a network of the 44 units to share the amenities of cooking, eating and cleaning. This will help to involve the people and get them to interact with each other. After 6 months living in the one unit block the singles have the option of moving to another unit block to live with different people within the development. For singles to meet and communicate the area needs to be vibrant and fun, a place where people want to be. This will be achieved by having different sorts of amenities and activities like;

- Coffee Shops
- A restaurant
- A Pub / Club
- A Outdoor area and Pool
- Classes - Community Classes, Free Classes
- Social events – Parties, Social Networking
