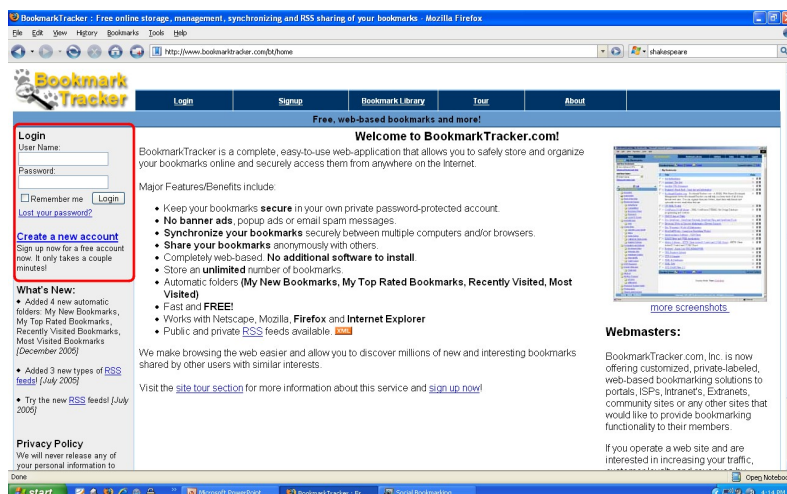


Social Bookmarking

This is the opening screen to Bookmark Tracker. We will also look at Site Jot, Linkagogo, and Backflip.

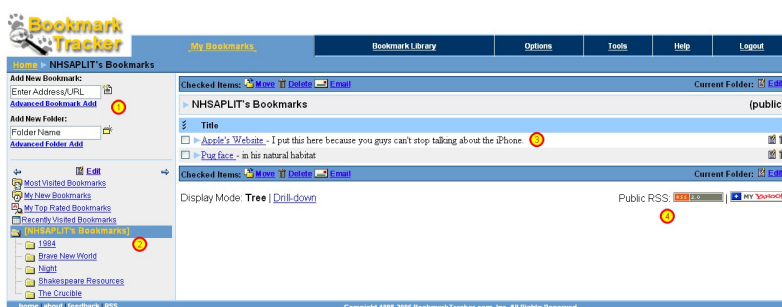
Login or create a new account (usual steps).

In addition to the toolbar across the top, you can do the following in this application:

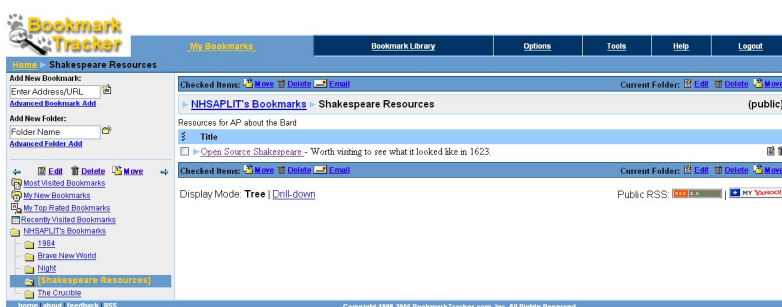
1. Add Bookmarks and Folders
2. Manage existing bookmarks and folders
3. See the current bookmarks contained within the folder you are looking at
4. Public RSS Feeds are available (circled)



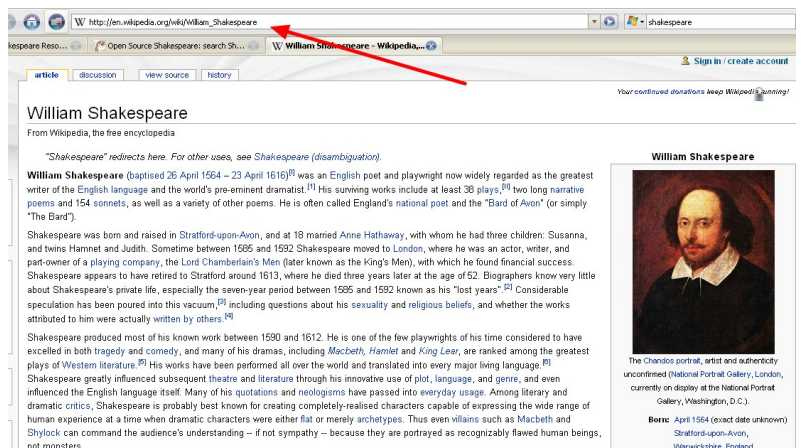
Bookmark Folders

Here we see the Shakespeare Folder with one entry.

We will now add the Wikipedia page on Shakespeare by going over to Wikipedia and copying the link from the address bar in our browser.

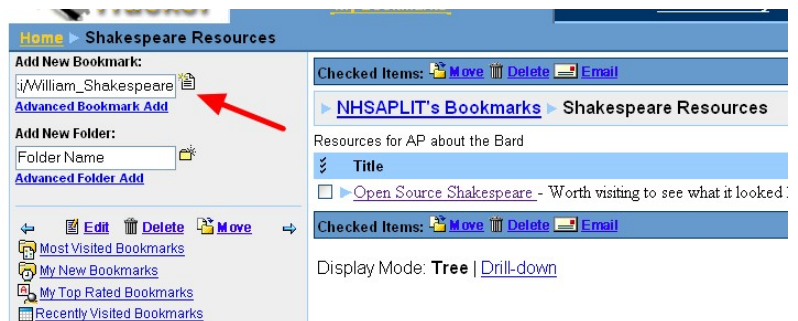


Copy the link

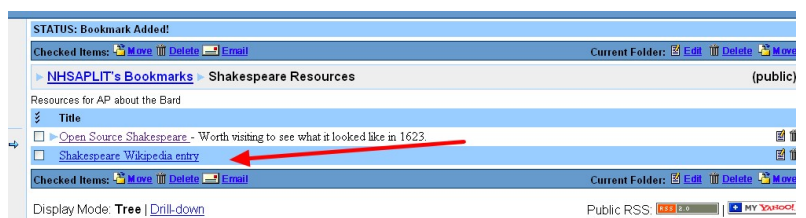


Add the link into the "Add New Bookmark" form

Save it in the Advanced view

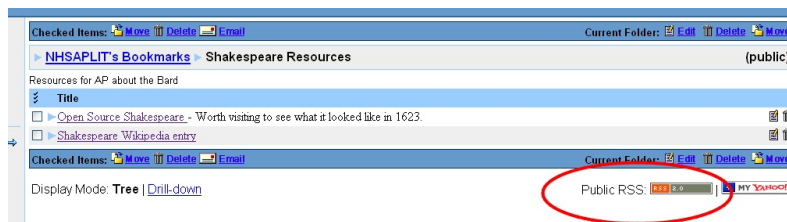
If you want to add a description or title, you can do this in the advanced form.

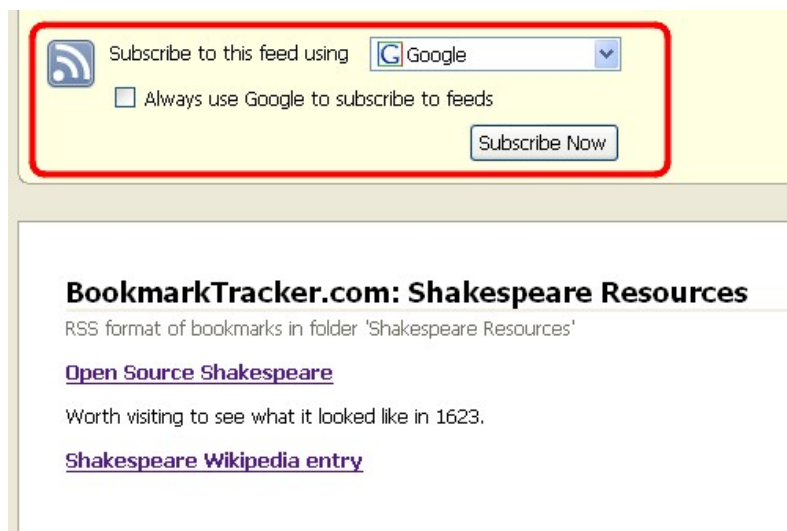
Add it to your RSS subscription list

Click on the RSS icon (circled)



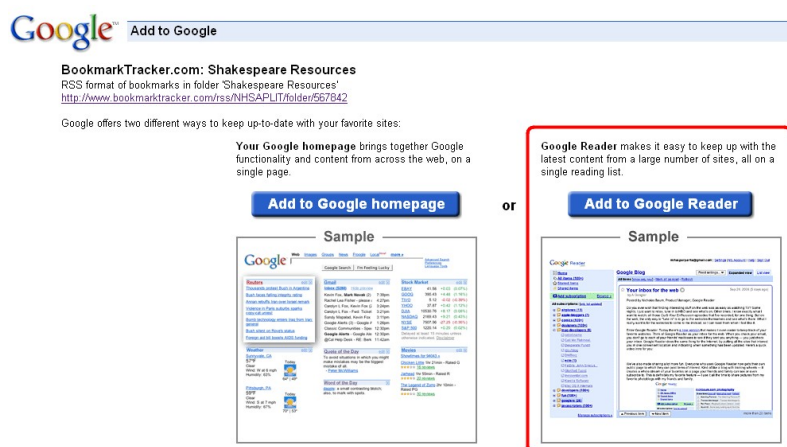
An old friend
