

Grad Paper – Basic Information

- Due date:** Monday, August 19, 2013 (email date stamp, or postmark)
- Content:** The paper’s topic must relate **directly** to the overall topic of the seminar, and employ at least **two** sources not from the seminar readings. You are free to use as many sources as you like, including seminar readings, as long as you cite them.
- Length & format:** 15 to 25 pages **plus** full bibliography. Double-spaced, 12-point Times or Times New Roman, standard (1-inch) margins on all sides. All pages numbered, no cover sheet. The top of the first page should be formatted like this (or something close to it):

- Style:** Papers should be formatted according to any widely recognized academic style, like MLA, APA, or Chicago. Pick one and use it consistently throughout the paper.
