

## Using Discovery Education – Part I – Videos

You may remember using UnitedStreaming through the IU website. However, Discovery Education bought out UnitedStreaming and all its content—and now, through the IU, we have access to an incredible collection of videos, video segments, and more!

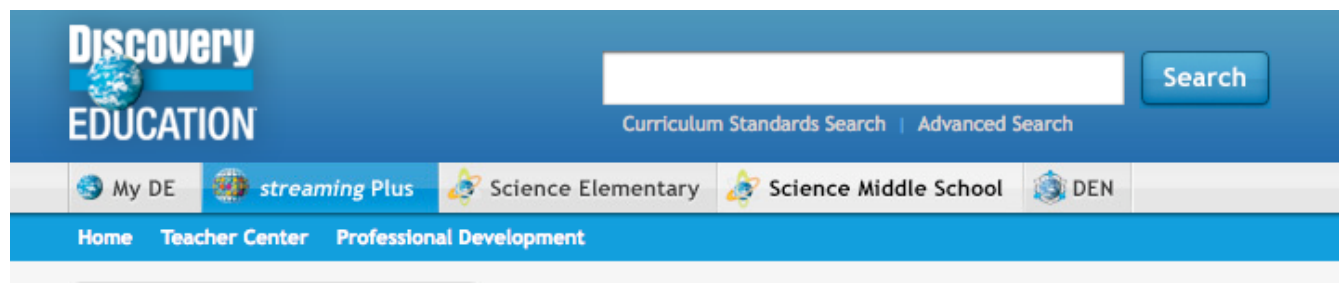
Log in: your first initial and last name with your IU Pin immediately after your name

Password: your IU Pin

Example: Username: jsmith0075321

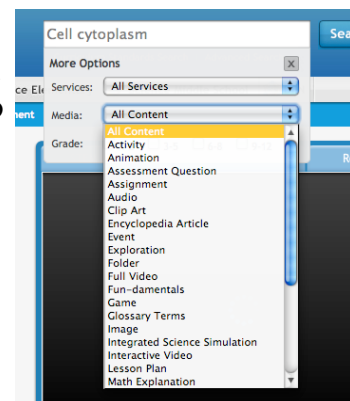
Password: 0075321

Across the top of the screen, you will see a tab for *streaming Plus*. Click there . . .

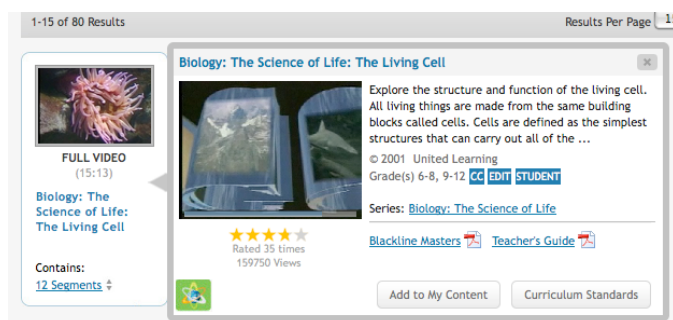


Streaming Plus is paid for by the IU and gives us even more videos, images, lesson plans, activities, etc.

In the search box, type in a topic or subject you want to search for. As you type, notice a drop-down window appears, allowing you to determine the type of service, media, and grade level appropriate for your audience. For videos, choose DE Streaming for Services, and Full Video or Video Segment for Media. Once these options are chosen, click Search.



Your search results will appear with the media showing in a thumbnail. Mouse over one and you will see a window open to give you more information about the selection.



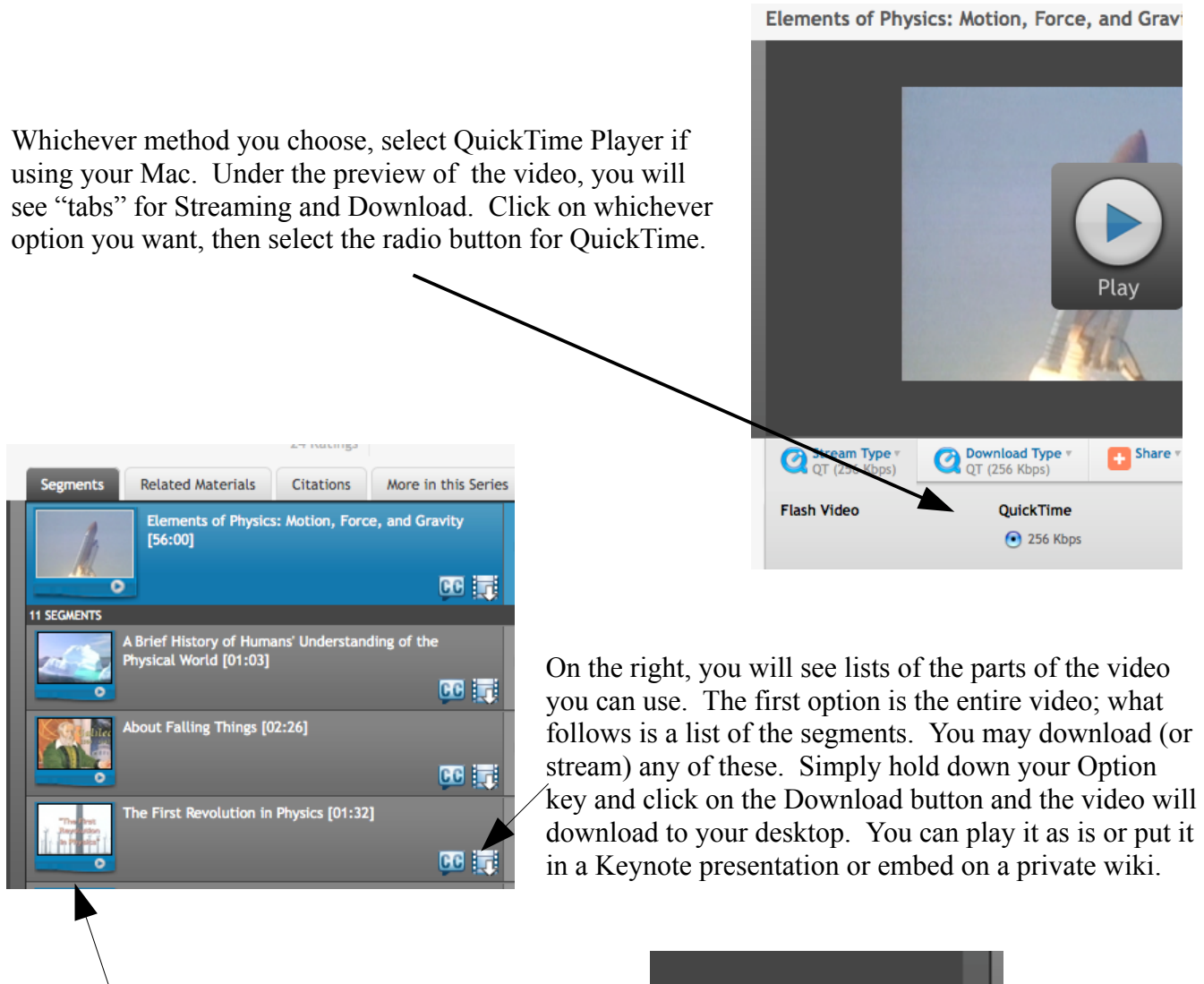
Click on the title (it's a link) and you will be taken to the stream/download page.

You now have two options for videos—to stream or to download.

Streaming – the video will play “live” from a Discovery server. Depending upon bandwidth and internet “traffic”, the video may play smoothly, or it may be interrupted as it plays.

Download – the video may be downloaded to your laptop where it will “reside” and be available to play whenever you choose. You will choose this option if you want to embed the video in a presentation or a wiki.

Whichever method you choose, select QuickTime Player if using your Mac. Under the preview of the video, you will see “tabs” for Streaming and Download. Click on whichever option you want, then select the radio button for QuickTime.



On the right, you will see lists of the parts of the video you can use. The first option is the entire video; what follows is a list of the segments. You may download (or stream) any of these. Simply hold down your Option key and click on the Download button and the video will download to your desktop. You can play it as is or put it in a Keynote presentation or embed on a private wiki.

If you want to stream the video, click on the video itself. You can choose to show the video in a stand-alone player by clicking the gray button in the lower right-hand corner of the play window.
