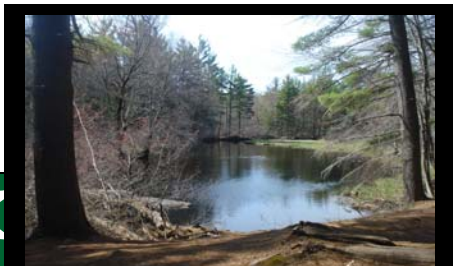


Introduction to Permaculture Workshop
